1 Accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the financial statements except as noted below

Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention in accordance with applicable accounting standards

Cash flow

Under the provisions of Financial Reporting Standard 1 (revised) the company has not prepared a cash flow statement as it is a wholly owned subsidiary of Vinci SA in whose financial statements the company s cash flows are consolidated

Group relief

The company and its fellow group undertakings are able to relieve their tax losses by surrendering them to other group companies where capacity to utilise those losses exists. There is an agreement between members of this group that such losses will be paid for by the recipient company. Where there is reasonable certainty that taxable losses can be relieved, the group relief receivable or payable is included in the taxation charge or credit for the period.

Taxation

UK corporation tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted by the balance sheet date

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is provided, except as noted below, on timing differences that have arisen but not reversed by the balance sheet date, where the timing differences result in an obligation to pay more tax, or a right to pay less tax, in the future. Timing differences arise because of differences between the treatment of certain items for accounting and taxation purposes.

In accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 19, deferred tax is not provided on timing differences arising from gains on the sale of non-monetary assets, where on the basis of all available evidence it is more likely than not that the taxable gain will be rolled over into replacement assets

Deferred tax is measured at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods when the timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and law enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets and habilities are not discounted

Turnover

Furnover, all of which is derived from the United Kingdom, represents the invoiced value of services supplied stated net of value added tax

1 Accounting policies (continued)

Leased assets

Payments made under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account over the period of the lease

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Fixed assets are stated at cost, net of depreciation and any provision for impairment. Depreciation is provided to write off the cost of the assets in equal annual instalments over the estimated useful economic lives of the assets. Where there is evidence of impairment, fixed assets are written down to recoverable amount. Any such write down would be charged to operating profit. The estimated useful economic lives are as follows.
