### Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 December 2014

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2014. The trustees have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005.

The board continue to work earnestly in providing broad based support for the re-building of the narrow gauge railway from Caernarfon to Porthmadog, this being the principle objective of the society.

The society continues to support work and acquisition of assets to understand the historical context of the original railway operation and its relation and relevance to its environment and community.

The society provides a wide range of opportunities for volunteers, encouraging their involvement, providing training and development and a forum for a sharing of skills and experience. Activities are designed to engage with volunteers across the age spectrum. Various social events are held, fostering a sense of companionship and offering the opportunity to learn about other railways.

The activities of the society are funded from the financial contributions of the membership. The use of funds raised contributes to the ability of the railway's operating company to develop at a faster rate and provide wider services without incurring financial liabilities.

The society also arranges activities that provide opportunities for the local community and local business to participate and benefit.

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

#### Objectives and aims

The charitable company is established for the following purposes for the advancement of the education of the public:-

To encourage and to promote public interest in the Caernarfon to Porthmadog Railway (including the former Welsh Highland Railway) ("the Railway") generally and in its history, restoration, operation, railway locomotives and rolling stock, machinery and equipment of historical and general interest relating thereto.

And in furtherance of the above-mentioned objects, but not otherwise, :-

- (a) To support and promote the activities of the Railway by providing practical and financial support in all aspects of the construction, maintenance and operation of the Railway including the acquisition and holding of shares, debentures and other securities therein,
- (b) To purchase, hire, take on loan or otherwise acquire railway engines, rolling stock and railway equipment generally and to undertake or assist in the maintenance, repair, renovation, restoration and operation of any such vehicles and equipment, and to promote and encourage the retention, preservation and operation of any such vehicles and equipment as aforesaid and to provide facilities for the public to observe such vehicles and equipment and to assist in their preservation and operation where feasible,
- (c) To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire real or personal property for any estate or interest or any rights, privileges or easements in respect of any property or rights whatsoever,
- (d) To construct, maintain, work and manage railways, permanent way, overhead lines, cables, power supplies, railway infrastructure, signal equipment, signals, markings, associated road furniture and ancillary equipment, to establish and maintain workshops and plant and to erect, alter and maintain any buildings, bridges and other structures,
- (e) To work in conjunction with, or join or affiliate to other institutions, societies and bodies in any part of the world whose aims are not inconsistent with the objects of the Company,
- (f) To promote and further the study of and research into the Welsh Highland and associated railways, railway engines and rolling stock, undertakings and other forms of transport and the historical, scientific, social and other aspects thereof, and to catalogue, collect, collate, publish and sell material and information of service or interest to the public in general calculated to promote the objects of the Company.
- (g) To take any gift of property, whether or not subject to any special trust, for one or more of the objects of the Company,
- (h) To receive money on deposit or loan or by grant, donation, or subscription, or to take steps by personal or written appeals, public meetings or otherwise to procure contributions to the funds of the Company,
- (i) To print and publish any newspapers, periodicals, books or leaflets and to operate car parks, book stalls, sales kiosks and refreshment rooms for the use and convenience of persons visiting any such vehicles and equipment as aforesaid and to sell or merchant any goods,
- (j) To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, build, equip, maintain and manage hostels, hotels or railway sleeping carriages to provide accommodation for persons engaged in the preservation of such vehicles and equipment or in promoting any of the objects of the Company and to provide facilities incidental to such accommodation,
- (k) To hold or arrange or join in holding or arranging exhibitions, shows, displays, competitions or other functions or events for the purposes of the Company,
- (l) To effect and keep up any insurance against any risk, loss or liability to which the Company may be subject,
- (m) To invest the monies of the Company not immediately required for its purposes in or at interest upon such investments, securities or property as may be thought fit, subject nevertheless to such conditions (if any) and such consents (if any) as may for the time being be imposed or required by law and subject also as hereinafter provided,

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

#### Objectives and aims

- (n) To borrow and raise money and accept money on deposit and to secure or discharge any debt or obligation of or binding on the Company in any manner and in particular (without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing) by mortgages of or charges upon all or any part of the undertaking, property and assets (present and future) and uncalled capital of the Company by the creation and issue of securities.
- (o) To draw, make, accept, endorse, negotiate, discount and execute promissory notes, bills of exchange and other negotiable instruments,
- (p) Subject to such consents as may be required by law to sell, let, lend, mortgage, dispose of or turn to account all or any of the property or assets of the company with a view to the furtherance of its objects,
- (q) To establish and support or to aid (by way of gift, loan or otherwise) in the establishment and support of any associations or institutions and to subscribe or guarantee money for purposes calculated to further the objects of the Company,
- (r) To apply for and take all necessary steps to obtain statutory or other powers or privileges required or deemed to be expedient for the furtherance of the objects and work of the Company and to defray the costs and expenses involved,
- (s) To do all such other lawful things as will further the attainment of the above objects or any of them.

#### Significant activities

The Society is the official supporters' body for the project to rebuild, maintain, and operate the Welsh Highland Railway, a narrow gauge line across the mountains of North Wales that closed in the 1930s. The project is led by the Ffestiniog Railway. WHRS members are playing a leading part in the rebuilding and operation of the Railway.

The most significant proportion of the Society's work involves sponsoring projects around the railway. These range for the more obvious things such as the restoration of the locomotives as is the case with the restoration of NG15 No134 together with upkeep and maintenance on the K1, the world's first Garratt locomotive, through to the less glamorous tasks such as the construction of station signs and other furniture.

#### Volunteers

The society continued to make a significant volunteer contribution across all aspects of the railway, through regular weekday and weekend working groups or directly with the company's departments.

#### **ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE**

#### Charitable activities

The society donated £63,131 to the FR Co in 2014 (£226,569 in 2013) as part of its objective to to promote and support the WHR and these included donations towards the following projects:

#### <u>K1</u>

The group continues to provide practical and financial support for the operation of this historical prototype locomotive.

#### NG15

Work has proceeded on this locomotive through regular working parties. The society continues to supplement the group's fund raising activities and have allocated part of a legacy to increase the rate of progress.

#### Fundraising activities

The main fundraising activity for the society are the subscriptions received from its members together with donations and bequests being received for the specific projects being supported by the society.

These main activates are supplemented by limited trading through the sale of memorabilia etc and by advertising revenues.

#### FINANCIAL REVIEW

#### Reserves policy

The society's policy is to maintain an adequate reserve that will allow it to carry on its day-to-day charitable activates, while at the same time having enough held back to cope with unexpected events such as a large request for urgent support from the railway or a sudden but sustained fall in income that would last for a year or two.

#### Principal funding sources

The society's total fund balance at the end of 2014 was £497,808 (2013 - £376,748).

As in previous years, the majority of the society's income came from the continued support of its much-valued members. Indeed the membership increased slightly to 2,709 at the end of 2014 as compared with 2,521 at the end of 2013 and as expected therefore there was a small increase in the total amount of funds received from members in 2014 when compared to 2013.

During the year, a further £12,500 was also received from the Maber estate. The estate's solicitor initially valued the bequest at £254,000 in 2012, of which there is approximately £54,000 still due to the society.

In addition, six area groups functioned providing practical and financial contribution to the railway and offering a social forum for members.

#### **FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS**

The charitable company will be continuing its work in supporting the development of the railways and will be proud to be a sponsor for a variety of exciting new projects as well as continuing to support the railway's long term aims and projects.

In an attempt to ensure that our objectives are successful, the 2012 business plan and management structure document was drawn up and issued in issue 79 of the Snowdon Ranger for all our members to see and has since been updated for 2014 and its main aims were to:

- 1. increase our membership to 3,000 by the 31st December 2015,
- 2. improve regular non-operational volunteers for a variety of maintenance and improvement to the Railway facilities,
- 3. strive to arrange the availability of accommodation for objective 2 volunteers by the end of 2015,
- 4. complete the restoration of NG15 No. 134 by the end of 2015,
- 5. continue funding agreed Company projects,
- 6. encourage participation of young people in the Society's projects,
- 7. encourage the involvement of the local community and businesses in the Railway.

#### STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES RESPONSIBILITIES

#### Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 December 2014

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

#### Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. This is in keeping with the requirements of the SORP 2005 which requires incoming resources to be recognised when:

- a. it has entitlement,
- b. it is virtually certain the amounts will be received, and
- c. when the amount can be reliably measured.

In addition to the abovementioned criteria, recognition of legacies are also measured against FRS21, events after the balance sheet date.

#### Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### Charitable activities

One of the charitable company's main aims as set out in the objectives and aims section of the trustees report is to "support and promote the activities of the Railway by providing practical and financial support in all aspects of the construction, maintenance and operation of the Railway".

It does this through the allocation of its incoming resources to specific projects currently being undertaken by the Railway and when the funds are required on a specified project, the charitable company makes a donation from the relevant fund to the Railway's project.

#### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery etc

- 33% on cost

#### Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

The charity is not registered for VAT and therefore all figures are, where relevant, inclusive of value added tax.

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or more commonly when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes such as a specific project.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
