DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors present their report and financial statements of Greenvale AP Limited for the year ended 24 June 2006.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The principal activity of the company during the year was that of the sale of potatoes to retailers, processors and wholesalers and sale of seed potatoes.

REVIEW OF THE BUSINESS

The results for the year and the financial position at the year end were considered satisfactory by the directors who expect continued growth in the foreseeable future.

Reporting of principal risks and uncertainties and key performance indicators have been undertaken at a group level and are disclosed in the group annual report of Produce Investments Limited, on pages 4 and 5.

DIRECTORS' INTERESTS IN SHARES

RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

Research and development continues in three major areas - developing new and improved potato varieties with increased resistance to potato diseases in conjunction with Scottish Crop Research Institute, treatments and products to assist in the storage of potatoes, and the introduction of potato products in a variety of different formats including further processing that are additive and chemical free whilst maintaining higher proportions of their natural healthy ingredients.

POLITICAL AND CHARITABLE DONATIONS

Donations to UK charities amounted to £15,000 (2005 - £2,000). The company made no political contributions during the period.

EMPLOYEE INVOLVEMENT

The directors recognise the benefits which arise from keeping employees informed of the group's progress and plans, and through their participation in the group's performance. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

The company is exempt by virtue of s228 of the Companies Act 1985 from the requirement to prepare group accounts. These financial statements present information about the company as an individual undertaking and not about its group.

The company has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (Revised 1996) from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is a subsidiary undertaking where 90 percent or more of the voting rights are controlled within the group, and the company is included in consolidated financial statements.

In preparing these financial statements the company has adopted the following Financial Reporting Standard for the first time.

FRS 25 - Financial Instruments: Disclosure and Presentation

The implementation of the new reporting standard has resulted in the Redeemable Preference shares and the Redeemable 'B' Preference shares being reclassified within 'Creditors: amounts falling due within one year'. The change in presentation is required under FRS 25, as the company's two classes of preference shares meet the definition of a financial liability rather than an equity instrument.

As the preference shares are now classed as a financial liability, any dividends payable upon these are now disclosed within 'Interest payable'.

Comparative figures have been restated.

In addition, the company has fully adopted FRS 17 - Retirement Benefits for the first time. See note 9.

GOODWILL

Purchased goodwill (representing the excess of the fair value of the consideration given over the fair value of the separable net assets acquired) is capitalised. Positive goodwill is amortised to nil by equal annual instalments over the period which the directors consider the group will derive direct economic benefit from that goodwill. For the acquisitions made to date, this period is currently considered to be 15 years for incorporated businesses and one year for unincorporated businesses. Negative goodwill arising from acquisitions is capitalised on the balance sheet and written off over the expected remaining useful life of the non-monetary assets of the acquired entity.

RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

Expenditure on research and development is written off against profits in the period in which it is incurred.

TANGIBLE FIXED ASSETS

Fixed assets are stated at historical cost less depreciation.

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets other than freehold land at rates calculated to write each asset down to its estimated residual value evenly over its expected useful life, as follows:

Land and buildings freehold5 to 50 yearsPlant and machinery5 to 15 yearsFixtures, fittings & equipment2 to 10 years

INVESTMENTS

Fixed asset investments are stated at cost, less amounts written off.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

STOCK AND WORK IN PROGRESS

Stock and work in progress are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of finished goods and work in progress includes overheads appropriate to the stage of production. Net realisable value is based upon estimated selling price less further costs expected to be incurred to completion and disposal. Provision is made for obsolete and slow-moving items.

DEFERRED TAXATION

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date. Timing differences are differences between the company's taxable profits and its results as stated in the financial statements that arise from the inclusion of gains and losses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in the financial statements. Deferred tax is measured at the average tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax is measured on a non-discounted basis.

LEASED ASSETS

The annual rentals on 'operating leases' are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the lease term. Where the company enters into a lease which entails taking substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership of an asset, the lease is treated as a 'finance lease'. The asset is recorded in the balance sheet as a tangible fixed asset and is depreciated over its estimated useful life or the term of the lease, whichever is shorter. Future instalments under such leases, net of finance charges, are included within creditors. Rentals payable are apportioned between the finance element, which is charged to the profit and loss account, and the capital element which reduces the outstanding obligation for future instalments.

PENSIONS CONTRIBUTIONS

For defined benefit schemes the amount charged to the profit and loss account in respect of pension costs and other post retirement benefits is the estimated regular cost of providing the benefits accrued in the year, adjusted to reflect variations from that cost. The interest cost and expected return on assets are included within other finance costs.

Actuarial gains and losses arising from new valuations and from updating valuations to the balance sheet date are recognised in the Statement of Total Recognised Gains and Losses.

Defined benefit schemes are funded, with the assets held separately from the group in separate trustee administered funds. Full actuarial valuations, by a professionally qualified actuary, are obtained at least every three years, and updated to reflect current conditions at each balance sheet date. The pension scheme assets are measured at fair value. The pension scheme liabilities are measured using the projected unit method and discounted at the current rate of return on a high quality corporate bond of equivalent term and currency. A pension scheme asset is recognised on the balance sheet only to the extent that the surplus may be recovered by reduced future contributions or to the extent that the trustees have agreed a refund from the scheme at the balance sheet date. A pension scheme liability is recognised to the extent that the group has a legal or constructive obligation to settle the liability.

For defined contribution schemes the amount charged to the profit and loss account in respect of pension costs and other post retirement benefits is the contributions payable in the year. The company contributes to a stakeholder scheme and also persoanl pension plans of certain employees, who were former employees of E.S. Black Limited. Differences between contributions payable in the year and contributions actually paid are shown as either accruals or prepayments in the balance sheet.

FOREIGN CURRENCY TRANSLATION

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded using the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated using the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date and the gains or losses on translation are included in the profit and loss account.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

TURNOVER

Turnover represents the amounts, net of Value Added Tax, derived from the provision of goods and services to third party customers, less amounts payable to customers for retrospective rebates.

Turnover is recognised on despatch for sales of potatoes to retailers and processors and on confirmed delivery to the customer for seed potatoes.

RIGHTS OF EACH SHARE

The preference shares and 'B' preference shares are due for redemption on 30 June 2007.

Dividends on preference and 'B' preference shares are payable as the company shall determine.

The holders of the preference and the 'B' preference shares shall be entitled to receive notice of all general meetings but shall not by reason of such holding be entitled to attend or vote thereat.

The 'A' Ordinary shares of £1 each have been reclassified as a result of the new Articles of Association adopted in 2002, to Ordinary shares of £1 each. The rights attaching to the preference and 'B' preference shares were amended at that time. However, the accounts disclosures and the finance charge on the non-equity shares were not updated. The error has come to light in the current year and has now been disclosed in accordance with the new Articles of Association. The effect of this error was twofold:

- 1. The 'A' Ordinary shares continued to be disclosed.
- 2. The finance charge attached to the preference shares amounting to £79,000 was incorrectly disclosed.

There was no effect on the share capital or reserves of the company as a result of these errors.

24. PENSION COMMITMENTS

DEFINED BENEFIT

The company operates a funded defined benefit scheme, the Greenvale Produce Pension Plan. In addition, contributions are made to personal plans of certain employees, formerly employed by E.S. Black Limited. Contributions to these personal pension plans for the period amounted to £36,000 (2005: £36,000).

Contributions to the group's defined benefits scheme are charged to the profit and loss account so as to spread the cost of pensions over the employees' working lives with the company. The contributions are determined by a qualified actuary on the basis of triennial valuations using the projected unit method. The most recent actuarial valuation for the Greenvale Produce Pension Plan was at 5 April 2005.

The company contributed at a rate of 14% of Pensionable Earnings from 1 January 2005, increasing to 15% of Pensionable Earnings from 1 January 2006. Following a review of the Plan's benefit and contribution structure, most members increased their contributions from 6.7% to 7.5% of Pensionable Earnings from 1 January 2005.

There was a prepayment of £44,000 on the balance sheet at the period end (2005: prepayment £44,000) representing a net overpayment of contributions over the period to 24 June 2006.

The pension charge for the defined benefit Plan for the period of £514,000 (2005: £481,000) represents the regular cost of the benefits in the Plan for the period ended 24 June 2006, less interest on the prepayment at the start of the period, plus the period's part of spreading the accounting deficit. The decrease in the pension mainly reflects the increase in members' contributions over the period.

At the balance sheet date the company had outstanding pension contributions amounting to £75,000 (2005 £78,000).

25. AMOUNTS WRITTEN OFF INVESTMENTS AND PROVISION AGAINST INTERCOMPANY LOAN

The directors and shareholders of the company have always taken a long term view of its investment in Greenvale Foods Limited, demonstrated recently by significant capital investment expenditure and ongoing financial support. The ongoing financial support was necessary for its subsidiary to achieve its long-term strategy of increasing food production capacity and securing a financial contribution to the group's activities.

For the financial year ended 24 June 2006, the financial statements of the subsidiary Greenvale Foods Limited show a negative net assets position of £2,084,000, after a loss of £6,291,000 for the year. In addition, forecasts anticipate further losses for the year ending 24 June 2007. As a result of the subsidiary's financial position, the directors consider it necessary to fully provide against its loan of £6,458,000 to Greenvale Foods Limited and to impair its investment in Greenvale Foods limited by £4,126,000.

26. CONTROL

The largest group in which the results of the company are consolidated is that headed by Credential Holdings Limited and the smallest group in which the results of the company are consolidated is that headed by Produce Investments Ltd, both companies are registered in England and Wales. The consolidated accounts of the smallest group are available to the public and may be obtained from Produce Investments Ltd, Harvest House, Bridge Street, Chatteris, PE16 6RD.

27. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The company has taken advantage of the exemptions conferred by Financial Reporting Standard No 8 from the requirement to make disclosures concerning related parties.
