NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2005

1. Accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2005) and the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and reporting by Charities" (SORP 2000) issued in April 2005. The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below

and have remained unchanged from the previous year.

1.1 Compliance with the Companies Act 1985

The Statement of Recommended Practice is at variance with the disclosure requirements of the Companies Act 1985. The directors consider that departing from the Companies Act 1985, and complying with the Statement of Recommended Practice, is more meaningful for the charity.

1.2 Donations and similar resources

Donations are included when received at the business address.

Grants received are treated as income when the charity is entitled to receipt and the amount can be measured with reasonable accuracy.

1.3 Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the trustees for particular purposes. The aim and use of each designated fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.
