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# Trustees' Report for the year ended 31st March, 2000

Open Door Ministries is a Company Limited by Guarantee, no. 3177916, and is a registered charity, no. 1055109. Its address is 90 East Hill, known as 'Beacon House', and its registered office is at 16 Wakefield Close, Colchester CO1 2SD. It was registered as a company on 26th March 1996.

# Audit Exemption

The company has decided not to appoint auditors. Under the provisions of the Act, the directors have appointed Reporting Accountants whose report is shown on page 3 of the accounts.

The directors have taken advantage, in the preparation of their report, of the special provisions of Part VII of the Companies Act 1985 relating to small companies.

# Objects, Organisation and Activities

The objects of the company, expressed in the Memorandum of Association, are the relief of poverty and sickness amongst people who are homeless or have no permanent accommodation by the provision, according to Christian principles and faith, of healthcare, counseiling and other support services.

The work at Beacon House commenced in August, 1996 and this report thus covers its third year of operation. A team of paid and volunteer staff carry out the functions of the charity. All staff are professing Christians in accordance with Company policy. At the year end six staff were paid. The trustees are grateful to all staff, paid and unpaid, for their high level of commitment.

The services offered are nurse clinics, advice and referrals, showers, provision of clothing, laundry and haircutting. All services were well used but provision of clothing and laundry services were the most popular. Relations with local GP's continue to be good. In addition counselling services are offered and this work is operating close to capacity.

During the year one floor at Beacon House has been adapted and equipped as a Training Room for carrying out Personal Development Programmes (PDP) and Life Skills training and these programmes have commenced to help people acquire the inter-personal and technical skills needed to get and maintain their own independent home. This work has been run primarily by Alison Lee, one of our Project Workers, and she has been assisted by additional volunteer staff. To all of these the trustees are most grateful, particularly to Alison who has shown great commitment and skill in a challenging role. Early indications are that programmes have been very useful and much appreciated with a low level of drop out. They also indicate that the work is very labour intensive with assistance given only to a small number of clients.

Open Door Ministries is pleased to acknowledge the considerable capital income received since its inception from statutory bodies, charitable trusts, companies, churches and individuals. Its revenue costs are primarily met by Joint Finance on an arrangement which tapers after three years and ends after seven years. This is already having an effect and will be a major challenge as time goes on. These substantial funds never did cover all costs and Open Door Ministries has had good support to make up the balance from many sources. However, the level of core support still does not cover costs and this is the major problem the Beacon House has to face in the immediate future. The Company believes that its present arrangements to control expenditure are most efficient and further savings cannot be expected in this area. A substantial increase in base income is therefore needed if major cuts in service are to be avoided in the next year or two.

The trustees are grateful to God for the support and goodwill we have in the Christian community and beyond.
