## STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

### **Governing document**

Kennet Valley Arts Trust (KVAT) is a company limited by guarantee governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. The company was incorporated on 22 April 1996 (No 3188787). It is registered as a charity with the Charity Commission. The Financial Statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice - Accounting and Reporting by Charities. The company is exempt under Section 30 of the Companies Act from the requirement to use the word "limited" in its title.

## Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The trustees are appointed in accordance with the Articles of Association. A third retire by rotation at each AGM but are eligible for re-appointment. The board endeavours to ensure that trustees are representative of the area in which the trust operates and that there is a good balance of skills and expertises required in pursuing the objects of the company.

## Induction and training of new trustees

New trustees are issued with documentation to brief them on their legal obligations under charity and company law. They are briefed on the contents of the Memorandum and Articles of Association and other documentation relating to the company and the charitable objects.

## STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

### Organisational structure

The Board of trustees is the body responsible for the management of KVAT. It meets every six to eight weeks and discusses general trustee business and plans.

#### Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

The trustees have a policy of conducting an annual risk assessment which will cover the following risks - governance, operational data, health and safety etc, financial (credit control, theft etc), external (public perception and statutory compliance). The intention is to keep this under constant review.

## **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

## Objectives and aims

The objects of the company are: -

To advance public education and promote interest in the Arts by establishing an arts activity centre for all types of performing arts, film, visual and creative arts for the benefit of the residents of and the visitors to the Kennet Valley area.

#### **Public Benefit**

The trustees have paid due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit in deciding what activities the charity should undertake. The trustees consider that they have acted in the public benefit.

#### ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

#### Charitable activities

#### **KVAT's Achievements and Future Plans**

A glance at KVAT's events programme will show how busy and successful we have been in maintaining and building on our initial success at bringing film and latterly Livescreen performances to Marlborough at The Town Hall. Due to the very hard work and considerable dedication of our Volunteers and the commitment made by those that run and are responsible for putting on the performances, we continue to generate enough income to support the Trust's activities. We also acknowledge the help of White Horse Bookshop and Sound Knowledge in marketing our programme, along with our partners at St Johns. It is worth mentioning that on average some 58% of the income from seat sales at these events goes straight back to the providers of the films and the Livescreen content and after the expenses of hire, promotion of the events etc we are left with a relatively small proportion of the takings-but it is enough to cover all our costs and leave us with a small margin for developing our proposition to the public and a small contingency.

During the year we took the decision to completely rebuild our website. This is due for completion by July and we shall relaunch it at the beginning of our next 'season' in September. This new website will provide a much easier and more pleasurable experience for those wanting to find out about KVAT, see what our programme is and book tickets. This improved website will also open up opportunities for KVAT to further its co-operation with other local charities and extend its offering to a wider audience.

We undertook a review of our objectives and activities which confirmed our commitment to creating an arts centre/cinema in Marlborough and we maintain a close relationship with the independent cinema company who may be our partner in this endeavour. To this end we have started dialogues with Wiltshire Council and other interested parties in the search for possible alternatives to the original Riverbank site. These alternative options may become available due to the ongoing rationalisation of Council owned property in the Marlborough area and the various developments both planned and being considered.

We have also overhauled our operational procedures including the consolidation of the management and commercial data we collect. During the year several Trustees have had to reduce their input due to workload and other pressures and although we still have an effective team, we would always encourage anyone interested in getting involved to contact us.

Overall the Trustees feel that there are considerable grounds for both optimism and realistic expectation that KVAT is able to continue to function effectively and go on to achieve its eventual objective.

## **KVAT's Performance**

KVAT divides its operations into two parts known as MDL (Marlborough Downs Livescreen) - which presents satellite broadcasts of live events and recorded encore programmes from major venues and MDM (Marlborough Downs Movies) - which presents the film shows.

MDL has successfully built on the relationships it had with a range of content providers established in the previous year. During this period it organised 31 events with 2 presentations to 'closed house' audiences of invited school children. The programme included opera, drama, ballet and exhibition presentations from amongst others, The Mct, The Royal Opera House, English National Opera, The National Theatre, The Royal Shakespeare Company and the British Museum. There were 4 full houses and a total audience of 2,100, including almost 300 subsidised attendees from local schools.

MDM organised 26 films at 2 venues (Marlborough Town Hall and St John's Theatre on the Hill) concentrating on mainstream films at the former venue and moving mainly to a termly programme of family films at the latter. A significant number of MDM milestones were reached: 50th Children film; 50th mainstream film; 5000th attendee. Although just outside this reporting period MDM (5 May 2015) MDM will have been in operation for 5 years

Thanks are due to David Dudley and Knight Frank who gave valuable sponsorship to the film and live screen programmes respectively.

The Trust also recognises and thanks the volunteers for the vital contribution they have made in supporting the programmes, sustaining a schedule of at least one event per week.

## FINANCIAL REVIEW

## Reserves policy

It is the aim of the trustees to build up unrestricted funds, which will be the free reserves of the charity, to a level of approximately three months expenditure. Reserves of £4,808 were held at 30 April 2015.

## 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

## Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

#### **Incoming resources**

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

## Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on income and gains to the extent that these are applied to its charitable activities.

### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
