Director's Report for the year ended 31 March 2015

The director presents the Director's Report together with the audited financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 March 2015.

Business review

Results and performance

Turnover was £Nil (2014: £Nil). The company reported interest income of £43,927 (2014: £43,237) in the year in respect of a loan to the immediate parent company Primary Group (UK) Limited, see note 5.

The profit attributable to the shareholder for the company for the year ended 31 March 2015 was £34,702 (2014: £33,308) after a tax charge of £9,225 (2014: £9,929). The director does not recommend payment of a dividend (2014: £Nil).

Business environment

The company is no longer trading.

1. Accounting policies

These financial statements are prepared on the going concern basis, under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and applicable accounting standards in the United Kingdom. Cash flow statement
