WARWICKSHIRE ASSOCIATION OF YOUTH CLUBS ANNUAL REPORT OF THE COUNCIL OF MANAGEMENT for the year ended 31 March 1998

The Council of Management present their report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 1998.

The Objects of the Warwickshire Association of Youth Clubs are: to support and assist young people up to the age of 25, to enable them to make informed choices in the areas of education, health, training, independence and recreation. This is provided primarily through the support offered to our affiliated clubs. In all its work with young people the Association seeks to ensure equal opportunities, regardless of race, creed, sex or disability.

Organisation

On I April 1997 the Charity became a Company Limited By Guarantee no 3201917 with a new charitable number 1056035. All the assets of the previous charity were passed to the new one and the name has remained the same. The charity is run by the Executive Director, William Clemmey, who is answerable to the Council of Management. Sub Committees have been formed to deal with arts development; finance and personnel; fund raising; policy development; and sports development.

Review of development, activities and achievements of the charity during the year.

We are pleased to report that we have had another successful year. Our Rank Foundation funded "Youth or Adult?" Arts Project has continued to develop thanks to the work of Marie-Claire Child. She has been involved with the Right Now Project who have produced a video on Homelessness. Janice Pennel continues to expand our Sports and Events programme. We have 130 clubs affiliating to us and they are capably dealt with in the office by Sandra Martin. We were pleased to be granted a National Charity Lotteries grant for a Volunteer Development Project which will help us to train volunteers and to develop the Youth Achievement Awards Scheme. The fund raising continues to strive to bring in the necessary funds.

Our Annual Report highlights the work that we are currently doing with young people in Warwickshire, Coventry and Solihull. Copies of this report are available from the Association.

Finance

The accounts this year have been redrafted to comply with the new accounting regulations for charities. During the year £27,650 was received from Rank Foundation to develop the Arts Project. We also received £75,404 from the National Lottery for our new narowboat and butty and £12,630 for the first instalment for the Volunteer Development Project.

Flood

During the early morning of Good Friday on 10 April 1998 the River Leam flooded and flowed into our basement destroying all our equipment and resources stored there. We believe that we are adequately insured for this loss. It has severely affected our work and the service that we can offer.

Council of Management's responsibilities

The Council of Management is required by charity legislation to prepare accounts for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Charity as at the end of the financial year and of the results of the charity for that period.

In preparing the accounts, appropriate accounting policies have been used and applied consistently, reasonable and prudent judgements and estimates have been made and the accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis.

The Council of Management is responsible for maintaining adequate accounting records, for safeguarding the assets of the Charity and for taking reasonable steps for preventing and detecting fraud and other irregularities.

REPORT OF THE AUDITORS

It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the Executive Committee in the preparation of the accounts, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the Charity's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the accounts are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the accounts.

Opinion

In our opinion the accounts give a true and fair view of the state of the Charity's affairs at 31 March 1998 and of its statement of financial activities for the year then ended and have been properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985.

NOTES TO ACCOUNTS

At 31 March 1998

1 Accounting policies

- a) The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and follow the recommendations in Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting by Charities (SORP) issued October 1995,
- b) Voluntary income is received by way of donations and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities for the year to which they relate.
- c) Grants are recognised in full in the Statement of Financial Activities for the year to which they relate
- d) Restricted funds are to be used for specific purposes as laid down by the donor. Expenditure which meets these criteria is identified to the fund, together with a fair allocation of management and support costs.
- e) Unrestricted funds are donations and other income received or generated for the objects of the charity without further specified purpose and are available as general funds.
- f) Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the Council of Management for particular purposes
- g) Staff costs and overhead expenses are allocated to activities on the basis of staff time spent on those activities.
- h) Administration costs of the charity relate to the costs of running the charity and include any costs which cannot be specifically identified to another expenditure classification
- Depreciation is provided on tangible assets in use at rates calculated to write off the cost of the asset over its estimated useful life, which for motor vehicles is 5 years, office equipment 4 years and computers 2 years. No depreciation has been applied to the freehold premises, since the Council of Management consider the value to be well in excess of the book value. Assets purchased for restricted funds are written off in full in the year of purchase.
- Costs in respect of operating leases are charged in arriving at the operating profit on a straight line basis over the lease term.

2 Comparative figures

The comparative figures shown for the year ended 31 March 1997 are those incurred by the Warwickshire Association of Youth Clubs, (W A Y C), an unincorporated association, and are included for information only since they represent a fair comparison with this year's operations.

The Canal boat fund relates to a grant received from the National Lottery to equip a barge and butty to hire out to member clubs. During the year the contractor became insolvent and the future course of action is being discussed with the lottery board and our legal advisors.

Arts Development derives from grants received from the Rank Foundation for arts work in the area.

The Vehicles account was used to fund the purchase of new vehicles.

First Gear is used to fund a project for young motor car drivers.

Right Now is a youth rights project funded by Save the Children, Youth Clubs UK and the Arts Council.

Deadline Challenge is an environmental project funded by Shell Better Britain.

The Volunteer Project is a project for recruiting and training volunteers, funded by the National Lottery. It will also be running the Youth Achievement Awards.
