The Council of Management present their report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2000

Objects

The Objects of the Warwickshire Association of Youth Clubs are to support and assist young people up to the age of 25, and to enable them to make informed choices in the areas of education, health, training, independence and recreation.

This is provided primarily through the support offered to our affiliated clubs.

In all its work with young people the Association seeks to ensure equal opportunities, regardless of race, creed, sex or disability.

Organisation

The Charity is a Company Limited by Guarantee. The charity is run by the Executive Director, William Clemmey, who is answerable to the Council of Management. Sub Committees have been formed to deal with arts development; finance and personnel; fund raising; the narrowboat; and policy development. We are an Association of 115 youth groups working with over 9,000 young people and over 900 youth workers in Warwickshire, Coventry and Solihull.

Review of development, activities and achievements of the charity during the year.

We are grateful for the continued support from the National Lottery Charities Board towards our work. We had three funded projects last year. Our new narrowboat Dream Catcher was finally built and has been used to train helmsmen and with youth groups. The Volunteer Development Project has been successful in supporting and training over thirty volunteers. We now have over fifteen Youth Achievement Awards groups working with over 150 young people. We have started a Senior Members' Training project. Our Springboard Environmental Project goes from strength to strength. We have 20 groups participating with over 300 young people. An environmental youth conference was planned and run by two young people for over 50 participants.

The Rank Foundation funded Arts Development Project has continued with a successful year of activities. An International Youth Exchange was organised in Russia with our partner groups from Belarus, Denmark and Russia. The Right Now Project came to an end and we are now working with Save the Children on a Young People and Violence Project.

First Gear – our pre-learner driving course has been run eight times during the year with over 100 participants.

A recent OFSTED inspection of Warwickshire Youth Service praised the work that we are doing in First Gear and with the Youth Achievement Awards Scheme.

Our office and administration staff continue to provide excellent support and back-up to our clubs and the youth work team.

Further details of our work can be found in our annual report.

Finance

During the year £31,359 was received from Rank Foundation to develop the Arts Project. The National Lottery Charities Board gave £49,956 for our Volunteer Development Project and £61,461 for our Springboard Project. Further details are given in the following pages.

Ladies Committee

We are grateful to the continued support from our Ladies Committee. This year they raised £7,416 for the Association's benefit through running the annual ball and the golf, tennis and bridge tournaments. Our special thanks go to Mrs B E Winstanley for co-ordinating this energetic group.

Friends of the Association

In February we launched the Friends of WAYC group. The Friends will help with events and will also be involved in fund raising activities.

The Council of Management is required by charity legislation to prepare accounts for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Charity as at the end of the financial year and of the results of the charity for that period.

In preparing the accounts, appropriate accounting policies have been used and applied consistently, reasonable and prudent judgements and estimates have been made and the accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis.

The Council of Management is responsible for maintaining adequate accounting records, for safeguarding the assets of the Charity and for taking reasonable steps for preventing and detecting fraud and other irregularities.

NOTES TO ACCOUNTS At 31 March 2000

1 Accounting policies

- a) The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and follow the recommendations in Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting by Charities (SORP) issued October 1995.
- b) Voluntary income is received by way of donations and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities for the year to which they relate.
- c) Grants are recognised in full in the Statement of Financial Activities for the year to which they relate
- d) Restricted funds are to be used for specific purposes as laid down by the donor. Expenditure which meets these criteria is identified to the fund, together with a fair allocation of management and support costs.
- e) Unrestricted funds are donations and other income received or generated for the objects of the charity without further specified purpose and are available as general funds.
- f) Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the Council of Management for particular purposes
- g) Staff costs and overhead expenses are allocated to activities on the basis of staff time spent on those activities
- Administration costs of the charity relate to the costs of running the charity and include any costs which cannot be specifically identified to another expenditure classification
- i) Depreciation is provided on tangible assets in use, other than the canal boat, at rates calculated to write off the cost of the asset over its estimated useful life, which for motor vehicles is 5 years, office equipment 4 years and computers 2 years. The canal boat is included at valuation. No depreciation has been applied to the freehold premises, since the Council of Management consider the value to be well in excess of the book value. Assets purchased for all restricted funds are written off in full in the year of purchase.
- Costs in respect of operating leases are charged in arriving at the operating profit on a straight line basis over the lease term.

2 Taxation status

The Warwickshire Association of Youth Clubs is a registered charity and as such is entitled to the exemption provide by Section 505 of the ICTA 1988 and Section 256 of the TCGA 1992 from Corporation Tax. There are no trading profits on which Corporation tax is payable.

Young People and Violence relates to a grant from Save the Children and Youth Clubs UK. First Gear is used to fund a project for young motor car drivers.

Right Now was a youth rights project funded by Save the Children, Youth Clubs UK and the Arts Council

Deadline Challenge was an environmental project funded by Shell Better Britain.

Springboard project is a National Lottery funded Environmental Youth project

Escape Scream Police is a training course to help young people being buillied and to help them if attacked on the street

The Volunteer Project is a project for recruiting and training volunteers, funded by the National Lottery. It also runs the Youth Achievement Awards.
