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DIRECTORS' AND TRUSTEES' REPORT

FOR THE PERIOD FROM 1 JULY 1996 TO 31 MARCH 1997

The Directors present their report and the Financial Statements for the period from 1 July 1996 (the date of incorporation) to 31 March 1997.

Legal Status

Volunteers In Action Southwark (VIAS) is a registered charity and a company limited by guarantee and therefore governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association.

Objects

VIAS is the local volunteer development agency for the Southwark area. The charity's objects are to advance education, protect health, relieve poverty, sickness and distress and to promote any other charitable purpose for the benefit of persons in the London Borough of Southwark and its environs, by the promotion of voluntary work and a volunteer service.

To achieve this the charity

- Promotes volunteering
- Promotes good practice in working with volunteers
- Provides information and advice on a wide range of volunteering issues
- Liaises and works in partnership with voluntary and statutory agencies and businesses
- Supports local organisations to improve or implement volunteering programmes

Development, activities, and achievements this period

The period covered by these accounts saw the organisation incorporated and registered as a charity, the full complement of staff in post, an office and resource base established, and a series of new initiatives commenced.

Karen Sumner took up the post of Project Manager in July 1996, Christina Tueje started work as Information and Administration Officer in August 1996 and Beth Follini was appointed as Community Safety Volunteering Co-ordinator from November 1996, to replace Maya Middlemiss, the first post holder, who left to take up another position.

VIAS moved to 48 Willowbrook Road in September 1996, taking over enough space to hold meetings, hold interviews with volunteers, and accommodate a library of resource materials, in addition to the necessary office space.

During the period, VIAS built on the work already being undertaken in the Five Estates, which had been the brief of the original Face to Face project, and at the same time energetically set about developing the borough-wide programme appropriate for a local volunteering development agency.

The following were the main developments during the period:

- The establishment of a Volunteer Co-ordinators' Forum which meets every two months;
- The initiation of a programme of training events, some aimed at volunteer-using organisations, and some at volunteers themselves;
- The provision of practical advice and help to individual organisations, to enable them to develop good practice on the recruitment and management of volunteers;
- The establishment of a computer database of organisations, statutory bodies and volunteers, though this was not complete by the end of the period;
- A significant expansion in the number of volunteers contacting VIAS and being referred to organisations with appropriate volunteering opportunities;
- The organisation of a special event for International Women's Day.

Effective systems were established for the administration of VIAS, its financial management and the monitoring and evaluation of its activities.

Future Developments

1996/7 has brought a lot of changes for Volunteers In Action Southwark. Plans have already been made to begin a variety of new work areas and to develop some existing ones.

We will be developing our training programme for voluntary organisations and volunteers together with our information and resource centre. We will continue to develop our good practice materials and consultancy support for voluntary organisations.

Our new computerised database will continue to develop, making the referral of volunteers more efficient.

We shall be commencing a piece of work at the end of 1997 based on two estates in Camberwell. The piece of work is being funded by Southwark Safer Cities and will aim to promote volunteering to local residents.

Volunteers Week in June 1997 will play a part in promoting the benefits in volunteering and we are planning a 3-day bonanza of activities in celebration. We are also planning to facilitate an event in celebration of gay pride in July.

We will be aiming to develop our links with the private sector in the form of promoting employee volunteering and also with schools and colleges in Southwark to promote the benefits of volunteering to young people.

Sadly our Make a Difference funding will end in November 1997 and we shall be looking to a variety of new funders to help us carry on with our work.

Transactions and Financial Position

The Statement of Financial Activity on page 6 shows net income for the period of £10497. The net assets transferred from the VIAS unincorporated association at the beginning of the period amounted to £30762. Funds at 31 March 1997 therefore amounted to £41259.

Expenditure kept within budget for the period, so that it was possible to continue to hold reserve funds not spent in the early life of the project due to the delay in the recruitment of the project's staff. The directors therefore designated £40,000 of these funds towards the cost of next year's salaries.

Active steps are currently being taken to identify ongoing funding to replace the Make a Difference grant which is due to expire in November 1997.

Directors and Trustees

All directors of the company are also trustees of the charity and members of the Management Committee. Directors who served during the period were Charles Woodd; Bill Barker; Hilary Pincott; Eileen Conn; John Hanby Holmes; Audrey Hyde-Chambers; Kitty Leek; Dennry McDonald; Monica Mahabier; David Richards and Hyacinth Parsons.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The Trustees are required by law to prepare Financial Statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of its financial position at the end of that year In preparing those Financial Statements the Trustees are required to:

- 4. Prepare the Financial Statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the Financial Statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE PERIOD FROM 1 JULY 1996 TO 31 MARCH 1997

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 Basis of preparation of Financial Statements

The Financial Statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and include the results of the charity's operations which are described in the Directors' and Trustees' Report and all of which are continuing.

The Financial Statements have been prepared in compliance with the Statement of Recommended Practice on Charity Accounts.

The charity has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 from the requirement to produce a cashflow statement.

Volunteers in Action Southwark was incorporated as a company limited by guarantee on 1 July 1996. The company took over the assets and liabilities of Volunteers in Action Southwark unincorporated association at the date of incorporation (see note 2). This being the first period of activity of the company there are no comparative figures.

1.2 Grants

Revenue grants are credited to the Statement of Financial Activities on the earlier date of when they are received or when they are receivable, unless they relate to a specific future period, in which case they are included in creditors on the Balance Sheet as a grant received in advance to be recognised in the future accounting period.

1.3 Value Added Tax

Value added tax is not recoverable by the charity, and as such is included in the relevant costs in the Statement of Financial Activities.

1.4 Tangible Fixed Assets and Depreciation

Tangible Fixed Assets are stated at cost less deprecation.

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following basis:

1.5 Restricted Funds

Unrestricted funds are grants, donations and other income received or generated for the objects of the charity without further specified purpose and are available as general funds.

1.7 Designated Funds

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the trustees for specific purposes
