DIRECTORS' AND TRUSTEES' REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 1998

The Directors present their report and the Financial Statements for the year ended 31 March 1998.

Legal Status

Volunteers In Action Southwark (VIAS) is a registered charity and a company limited by guarantee and therefore governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association.

Objects

VIAS is the local volunteer development agency for the Southwark area. The charity's objects are to advance education, protect health, relieve poverty, sickness and distress and to promote any other charitable purpose for the benefit of persons in the London Borough of Southwark and its environs, by the promotion of voluntary work and a volunteer service.

To achieve this the charity

- Promotes volunteering
- Promotes good practice in working with volunteers
- Provides information and advice on a wide range of volunteering issues
- Liaises and works in partnership with voluntary and statutory agencies and businesses
- Supports local organisations to improve or implement volunteering programmes

Development, activities, and achievements this year

The year saw the successful consolidation and development of all the activities initiated in the previous year, as well as a number of further initiatives. The staff remained unchanged until the end of January 1998 when Christina Tueje left to take up another position. She was replaced by Teresa Crook on a temporary contract, in view of the uncertainty of funding for the post.

DIRECTORS' AND TRUSTEES' REPORT

The main achievements of the year were:

- A further increase in the number of potential volunteers contacting VIAS to a total of 439 for the year.
- The organisation of nine training events, which were attended by 91 people. Subjects included: inducting and training your volunteers, monitoring and evaluating your volunteer programme, finding the volunteers you need, communication skills for volunteers, being an assertive volunteer. Some were targeted at volunteers and some at voluntary and community organisations.
- Practical advice and consultancy was provided to 27 organisations, on such topics as recruiting and selecting volunteers, screening volunteers, devising a training plan for volunteers and paying volunteers expenses.
- Continuous development of our computerised database of volunteers, voluntary and community organisations and volunteering opportunities. This was brought into full use, and is constantly updated and added to.
- We undertook a local research project for the Camberwell Safer Cities Project, which focused on volunteering on the D'Eynsford and Elmington Estates. The conclusions from the research received considerable publicity in national journals, as well as providing useful evidence for the development of VIAS' work.
- We published the first two issues of a regular Newsletter.
- We organised a programme of events for Volunteers Week in June 1997, and special events for International Womens Week, Black History Month and Gay Pride.
- We organised a process for monitoring the effectiveness of our volunteer referral service, through the regular dissemination of reply postcards to all volunteers referred on by VIAS, three months after their interview.
- The Volunteer Co-ordinators' Forum met four times during the year. Following falling attendance, its contents and format was reviewed in the light of a survey of interested organisations.

In order to ensure that the interests of voluntary and community organisations in the borough are best served, we have collaborated closely with the Steering Group of Southwark Action for Voluntary Organisations to co-ordinate our activities and services.

Future Developments

Considerable thought has been given during the last year to possible ways in which to expand our activities, so as better to fulfil our aims. These are summarised below and are the subject of bids for additional funding which have either been submitted or are in preparation:

- Extending the reach of our volunteer referral service through the appointment of three Mobile Volunteering Co-ordinators,
- Development and dissemination of good practice materials on volunteering,
- Expansion of our consultancy service to voluntary and community organisations with regard to volunteering policies and practices,
- Publication of a regular newsletter,
- Expansion of our training programme, and exploration of the possibilities of accreditation of some courses within it.

We will also be seeking larger and more accessible premises, particularly if our bids for additional funding are successful

Transactions and Financial Position

Although our Make a Difference grant expired in November 1997, we were able to use £21,000 from our designated reserve to meet the shortfall on salary costs for the rest of the year. As a result, at the end of the year, our reserves were significantly reduced. However, we were successful in obtaining a substantially increased grant towards our core costs for 1998/9 from Southwark Council, which compensated for the loss of Home Office funding. As a result, we have, with use of some the remaining reserves, been able to continue at our present level of activity well into the 1998/9 financial year. We are hopeful that, if our fundraising programme is successful and with continuing core support from Southwark Council, we will be able both to maintain our core activities and undertake our planned developments in the future.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The Trustees are required by law to prepare Financial Statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of its financial position at the end of that year In preparing those Financial Statements the Trustees are required to:

- 4. Prepare the Financial Statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the Financial Statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 1998

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 Basis of preparation of Financial Statements

The Financial Statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and include the results of the charity's operations which are described in the Directors' and Trustees' Report and all of which are continuing.

The Financial Statements have been prepared in compliance with the Statement of Recommended Practice on Charity Accounts.

The charity has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 from the requirement to produce a cashflow statement.

Volunteers in Action Southwark was incorporated as a company limited by guarantee on 1 July 1996. The comparative figures are for the 9 month period from 1 July 1996 to 31 March 1997.

1.2 Grants

Revenue grants are credited to the Statement of Financial Activities on the earlier date of when they are received or when they are receivable, unless they relate to a specific future period, in which case they are included in creditors on the Balance Sheet as a grant received in advance to be recognised in the future accounting period.

1.3 Value Added Tax

Value added tax is not recoverable by the charity, and as such is included in the relevant costs in the Statement of Financial Activities.

1.4 Tangible Fixed Assets and Depreciation

Tangible Fixed Assets are stated at cost less deprecation.

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following basis:

1.5 Fundraising and Publicity

Fundraising and publicity costs comprise expenditure incurred in producing materials to promote the charity and to raise its profile.

1.6 Management and Administration

Management and administration costs include all expenditure not directly related to the charitable or promotional or fundraising activities. This includes expenditure incurred to comply with constitutional and statutory requirements such as audit, certain legal fees and the costs of management committee meetings.

1.7 Restricted Funds

Restricted funds are to be used for the purposes specified by the donor. Expenditure which meets these criteria is identified to the fund.

1.8 Unrestricted Funds

Unrestricted funds are grants, donations and other income received or generated for the objects of the charity without further specified purpose and are available as general funds.

1.9 Designated Funds

Designated funds are unrestricted funds set aside by the trustees for specific purposes.

1.10 Pensions

The charity contributes to a defined contribution pension scheme in respect of one of its employees. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the charity in an independently administered fund. The pension cost charge represents the amounts payable by the charity to the fund in respect of the year.
