## TRUSTEES' REPORT

The trustees present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2002. The accounts comply with current statutory requirements and with the requirements of the charity's governing document.

### CONSTITUTION

The Trust is a registered charity and was formed as a company limited by guarantee on 19 July 1996. The company registration number is 3227212 and the charity registration number is 1057368. The Trust is governed by its memorandum and articles of association. The trustees are also directors of the company. All the trustees are members of the company and the liability of each member is limited to £1 (see note 1). The charity operates from its offices at Police Headquarters in Wakefield.

### RESULTS FOR THE YEAR

The statement of financial activities is set out on page 6. The charity recorded a net deficit of £30,619 (2001: £41,193). As at the balance sheet date the Trust had funds of £151,460 (2001: £182,079). Of this amount £72,300 relates to restricted funds which can only be used for the specific funds listed in note 7.

The trustees are satisfied that the charity's assets are available and adequate to fulfil its obligations.

### RESTRICTED FUNDS

The charity has a number of restricted funds which are represented by assets and liabilities as set out in note 8 to the accounts.

## **OBJECTIVES**

The principal objectives of the charity are:

- 1. To promote for public benefit in and around the area of West Yorkshire a safer enhanced quality of life through the prevention of crime and the protection of people and property from criminal acts;
- 2. For the benefit of the public in and around the area of West Yorkshire to advance education on road safety matters through publicity and training or the implementation of specific projects which have a bearing on road safety or associated matters;
- 3. To secure the advancement of education for public benefit in all matters relating to alcohol, drugs and other substance abuse.

### **INVESTMENT POWERS**

The memorandum and articles of association permit wide powers of investment.

## RESERVES POLICY

Unrestricted reserves are available for distribution via "grant rounds" which are made annually, at the discretion of the trustees, to successful grant applicants.

Over the last 3 years the trustees have gradually reduced the level of free reserves by awarding grants in excess of incoming resources. The trustees will not let unrestricted reserves fall below a level which equates to approximately 12 months unrestricted expenditure.

## RISK MANAGEMENT

In July 2001, the trustees performed a review of the charity's activities. The review addressed the major risks that the charity is exposed to, along with how funds are generated and invested and the level of grants being awarded.

Following the review, it has been agreed that the Trust will continue to operate in its existing format until further notice.

# STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES

The trustees are also responsible for the charity's system of internal financial control and for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

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# INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF WEST YORKSHIRE POLICE COMMUNITY TRUST

We have audited the financial statements of the West Yorkshire Police Community Trust for the year ended 31 March 2002, which comprise the statement of financial activities and income and expenditure account, the balance sheet and the related notes 1 to 11. These financial statements have been prepared under the accounting policies set out therein.

## Respective responsibilities of trustees and auditors

As described in the statement of trustees responsibilities the trustees, who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of company law, are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements in accordance with applicable United Kingdom law and accounting standards.

Our responsibility is to audit the financial statements in accordance with relevant United Kingdom legal and regulatory requirements and auditing standards.

We report to you our opinion as to whether the financial statements give a true and fair view and are properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985. We also report to you if, in our opinion, the trustees' report is not consistent with the financial statements, if the charity has not kept proper accounting records, if we have not received all the information and explanations we require for our audit or if information specified by law regarding trustees' remuneration and transactions with the trust is not disclosed.

We read the trustees' report for the above year and consider the implications for our report if we become aware of any apparent misstatements.

### Basis of opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with United Kingdom auditing standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the charity's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

## Opinion

In our opinion the financial statements give a true and fair view of the state of the charity's affairs at 31 March 2002 and of its incoming resources and total resources expended in the year then ended and have been properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985.

# NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS Year ended 31 March 2002

### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in October 2000. The particular accounting policies adopted by the trustees are described below.

## **Company Status**

The Trust is a company limited by guarantee. The guarantors are the trustees named on page 1. The liability in respect of the guarantee, as set out in the memorandum, is limited to £1 per member of the company. The Trust has availed itself of Paragraph 3(3) of Schedule 4 of the Companies Act 1985 and adapted the Companies Act format to reflect the special nature of the company's activities.

### Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention.

### Incoming resources

All income is recognised in the statement of financial activities when the conditions for receipt have been met and there is reasonable assurance of receipt. Where a claim for repayment of income tax has or will be made, such income is grossed up for the tax recoverable. The following accounting policies are applied to income:

### Donations

Donations and all other receipts from fundraising are reported gross and the related fundraising costs are reported in the cost of generating funds.

# Gifts in kind

Assets and other gifts in kind given for use by the charity are recognised as incoming resources at their estimated market value when receivable.

### Fund accounting

General funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of

Restricted funds are funds subject to restriction conditions imposed by founders or by the purpose of the appeal. The purpose and use of the restricted funds is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

All income and expenditure is shown in the Statement of Financial Activities.

### Resources expended

Charitable expenditure includes all expenditure directly related to the objects of the charity.

Grants payable and project costs are accounted for when the trustees have accepted a legal or moral obligation to make the grant.

Other expenditure for charitable purposes

Other expenditure for charitable purposes relates to salaries supported by gifts in kind.

Management and administration

Management and administration costs represent expenditure incurred in the management of the Trust's assets, organisational administration and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

## Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost including any incidental expense of acquisition. Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write-off the cost on a straight line basis over the expected useful lives as follows:
