TRUSTEES' REPORT for the year ended 31 March 2012

The Trustees present their annual report on the affairs of the charity, together with the financial statements and auditors' report for the year ended 31 March 2012. The financial statements comply with current statutory requirements and with the requirements of the charity's governing document.

Small Company Exemption

This Trustees' report has been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" (issued in March 2005) and in accordance with the special provisions relating to small companies under S419 (2) of the Companies Act 2006

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The Community Trust is a registered charity (charity number 1057368) and was formed as a company limited (registration number 3227212) by guarantee on 19 July 1996. The Community Trust is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. The Trustees are also directors of the company. All the Trustees are members of the company and the liability of each member is limited to £1 (see note 1).

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees (Directors)

The Trustees during the year and at the date of this report are shown on page 3. The Articles of Association allow continuing Trustees to appoint additional Trustees. One third of the Trustees retire each year at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) and being eligible offer themselves for re-election.

The following Trustees were re-elected at the Annual General Meeting held on 7 October 2011

Trustees Induction and Training

On appointment all Trustees receive a telephone call and letter from the Chairman, welcoming them to the Community Trust. These serve to lay out the commitment required by the new Trustees and the involvement expected from them in Community Trust matters. The Community Trust Administrator ensures the new Trustees receive a copy of the most recent annual report, a copy of the Community Trust Deed and a Trustees induction pack. Practical training occurs for all Trustees when attending meetings and in their role deciding on grant awards.

Organisational Structure

The Board of Trustees administers the charity Trustees meet bi-annually to review the finances of the Community Trust, approve grants awarded and make decisions regarding the activities of the Community Trust

Risk Management

In March 2012, the Trustees performed a formal review of the charity's activities. The review addressed the major risks that the charity is exposed to, along with how funds are generated and invested and the level of grants being awarded. It has been agreed that the Community Trust will continue to operate in its existing format until further notice.

The Trustees have continued to monitor the major risks that the charity is exposed to and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate their exposure to major risks

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The directors (who are also Trustees) are responsible for preparing the annual report and financial statements. The directors have prepared the financial statements for the charity in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" (SORP 2005) issued in March 2005, and United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice

TRUSTEES' REPORT for the year ended 31 March 2012

United Kingdom company law requires the directors of a charity to prepare financial statements for each financial period which give a true and fair view in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice of the incoming resources and application of resources of the charity during the year and of its state of affairs at the end of the year and comply with UK GAAP and the Companies Act 2006

In preparing those financial statements, the Trustees are required to

- select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently,
- observe the methods and principles within the Charities SORP 2005,
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent,
- state whether applicable accounting statements of recommended practice have been followed, subject to any departures being disclosed and explained in the financial statements,
- prepare financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy the financial position of the charity and which enables them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011. The Trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

In accordance with company law, as the company's directors, we certify that

- so far as we are aware, there is no relevant information of which the company's auditors are unaware, and
- as the directors of the company we have taken all steps that we ought to have taken in order to make ourselves aware of any relevant audit information and to establish that the company's auditors are aware of that information

Related Parties

The Community Trust works closely with West Yorkshire Police. The Community Trust objectives fit in closely with the aims and objectives of West Yorkshire Police, particularly in respect of improving public confidence. The Force provides funding for the Community Trust which is used in the Grant Rounds, through the Police Property Act Fund and the Proceeds of Crime Act funding.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives

The principal objectives of the charity are

- To promote for public benefit in and around the area of West Yorkshire a safer enhanced quality of life through the prevention of crime and the protection of people and property from criminal acts,
- 2 For the benefit of the public in and around the area of West Yorkshire to advance the education on road safety matters through publicity and training or the implementation of specific projects which have a bearing on road safety or associated matters,
- 3 To secure the advancement of education for public benefit in all matters relating to alcohol, drugs and other substance abuse

Activities

The charity aims to achieve its objectives in a number of ways

Grant Awards the Community Trust gives grants to groups of people who are helping to improve the quality of life in their community. This year the main grant round theme was "Activities which discourage Anti-Social Behaviour in 11-25 year olds throughout West Yorkshire'

The Community Trust also continued to support voluntary and community groups through the small grants round

Schemes

a number of projects are run via the charity throughout the county, with beneficiaries such as young people, victims of racially motivated crime and more elderly members of the community Road safety issues are also dealt with by several of the schemes

Fundraising

the charity raises additional funds by benefiting from the Chief Constable's Summer and Christmas concerts, staff fundraising and donations

Grant Making Policy

The Community Trust awards grants to voluntary and community groups, small charities and not-for-profit groups. The Community Trust will not support national charities or general appeals, work outside West Yorkshire, pure academic research, educational bursaries, travel projects, individuals or work that forms part of a statutory requirement.

ACHEIVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

During the year, the Community Trust awarded grants totalling £50,000 (2011 £50,033) in the main grant round "Activities which discourage Anti-Social Behaviour in 11-25 year olds throughout West Yorkshire" (see note 4) £10,756 was awarded in the Small Grant Round (see note 4)

All of the projects supported were endorsed by officers from local Neighbourhood Policing Teams (NPTs) which enabled Trustees to maximise public benefit through the Grant allocations. All of the projects had direct links to discouraging anti-social behaviour, with some also helping to educate on drug, alcohol or road safety issues.

Trustees are keen to ensure that all applicants work with their Neighbourhood Policing Teams (NPTs) as due to the limited amount of funding it is not possible to support every applicant in each of the Grant Round(s). By encouraging the development of these relationships and working closely together positive outcomes can be achieved for the benefit of the community.

The grant rounds were primarily funded by donations totalling £60,000 (2011 £50,000) from the West Yorkshire Police Property Act Fund and Proceeds of Crime Act funding

The Trust has administered 11 projects in the current year, with income of £3,885 and expenditure of £17,343 (see note 9). The total funds carried forward at 31 March 2012 relating to the projects were £61,708 (2011 £76,655).

Financial Review

The statement of financial activities is set out on page ten. The Trust recorded a net deficit of £22,551 in the year ended 31 March 2012 (2011) net deficit of £39,693). Unrestricted funds showed a net deficit of £7,604 (2011) £7,711). Restricted funds showed a deficit of £14,947 (2011) £31,982) following expenditure in the year of donations and income received in current and previous years.

The Trustees are satisfied that the charity's assets are available and adequate to fulfil its obligations

Restricted Funds

At the balance sheet date the Community Trust had funds of £161,409 (2011 £183,960) Of this amount £61,708 (2011 £76,655) relates to restricted funds which can only be used for the specific purposes listed in note 9

Investment Powers

The Memorandum and Articles of Association permit wide powers of investment

Reserves Policy

Unrestricted reserves are available for distribution via "grant rounds", which are made at the discretion of the Trustees, to successful grant applicants

The Trustees will not let unrestricted reserves fall below a level which equates to approximately twelve months unrestricted expenditure

Plans for Future Periods

The Community Trust will continue to support voluntary and community groups throughout West Yorkshire through its main grant round and named schemes. The Community Trust is working in partnership with the High Sheriff of West Yorkshire and Crimebeat, the Charity of the Shrievalty Association, to support a project aimed at engaging young people throughout the summer holidays — the project is called the 'i' Initiative

We will continue to develop partnerships with other funders to match fund or support projects which otherwise may not be funded due to limited funds being available for each grant round

Auditors

RSM Tenon Audit Limited, were appointed as auditors of the charitable company during the period

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF WEST YORKSHIRE POLICE COMMUNITY TRUST

We have audited the financial statements of West Yorkshire Police Community Trust, a company limited by guarantee, for the year ended 31 March 2012 which comprises the Statement of Financial Activities, the Charitable Company Balance Sheet and related notes, set out on pages 10 to 19 The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice)

We have been appointed auditor under the Companies Act 2006 and section 144 of the Charities Act 2011 and report in accordance with those Acts. Our responsibility is to audit and express an opinion on the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and International Standards on Auditing (UK and Ireland). Those standards require us to comply with the Auditing Practices Board's Ethical Standards for Auditors.

Scope of the audit of the financial statements

An audit involves obtaining evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements sufficient to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or error. NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the year ended 31 March 2012

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standards for Smaller Entities and follow the recommendations in "Accounting and Reporting by Charities Statement of Recommended Practice" issued in March 2005

Company Status

The Trust is a company limited by guarantee. The guarantors are the Trustees named on page one. The liability in respect of the guarantee, as set out in the Memorandum, is limited to £1 per member of the company. The Trust has availed itself of Paragraph 3 465 (6) of Schedule 4 of the Companies Act 2006 and adapted the Companies Act format to reflect the special nature of the companies activities.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention. By nature of its principal activities, the Trust is a non-profit making organisation and because of this a profit and loss account is not included within these financial statements, being replaced with a Statement of Financial Activities. No summary Income and Expenditure Account has been included as all other information which is required to be disclosed by Financial Reporting Standard No 3 has been included on the face of the Statement of Financial Activities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the conditions for receipt have been met and there is reasonable assurance of receipt. Where a claim for repayment of income tax has or will be made, such income is grossed up for the tax recoverable. The following accounting policies are applied to income.

Donations and Fund Raising Income

Donations and all other receipts from fundraising are reported gross and the related fundraising costs are reported in the cost of generating funds

Gifts in Kind

Assets and other gifts in kind given for use by the charity are recognised as incoming resources at their estimated market value when receivable

Fund Accounting

General funds are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the Trust

Restricted funds are funds subject to restriction conditions imposed by founders or by the purpose of the appeal. The purpose and use of the restricted funds is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

All income and expenditure is shown in the Statement of Financial Activities

Resources expended

Charitable activities include all expenditure directly related to the objects of the charity

Grants payable and project costs are accounted for when the Trustees have accepted a legal or moral obligation to make the grant

Other Expenditure on Charitable Activities

Other expenditure of charitable activities includes staff salaries and salaries supported by gifts in kind

Governance costs

Governance costs comprise those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include the audit fee payable

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Recognition of liabilities

Liabilities are recognised when an obligation arises to transfer economic benefits as a result of past event

Cash Flow Statement

The Trust has taken advantage of the exemptions from the requirements of Financial Reporting Standard No 1 not to include a cash flow statement as part of its financial statements, on the grounds that it meets the criteria as a small company as defined by the Companies Act 2006

Taxation

The trust is a registered charity and as such is a charity within the meaning of Schedule 6 of the Finance Act 2010. Accordingly the Trust is potentially entitled to tax exemption under Part 11 of the Corporation Tax Act 2010 or section 256 of the Taxation of Chargeable Gains Act 1992 in respect of income and gains arising to it and consequently there is nil taxation charge included in the 2012 financial statements (2011 nil)
