The directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 1999.

ACTIVITIES

The object of the company is to carry on business as a general commercial company and to promote the advancement of education for the public benefit.

The principal activity of the company will be the operation of The Lowry (formerly described as the Lowry Centre).

REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENTS

The Lowry is still in the course of construction in accordance with a programme which is planned for completion in the year 2000 to enable The Lowry to open on 28 April 2000. Activities have therefore related, primarily, to ensuring that the operational requirements of The Lowry building have been properly satisfied during the design and construction phase. Publication costs in respect of L.S.Lowry have been incurred during the year, otherwise there were no trading activities.

YEAR 2000 COMPLIANCE

A review has been undertaken by the Directors of the potential risks and uncertainties surrounding the Year 2000 issue. At this stage, it is believed there are no significant factors which will affect the activities of the business, however monitoring of the situation continues to be undertaken. Any costs arising from the need to ensure compliance of this cannot be accurately quantified but are not expected to be significant.
