Directors' report

The Directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2012

Principal activity and review of the business

The Company's principal activity is to act as a finance company in the Melrose Industries PLC Group During the year, the Company's activities have been wound down and it's net assets have been transferred to its parent companies as a dividend. It is expected that the Company will be liquidated in the near future

The retained loss for the year ended 31 December 2012 was £1,444,000 (year ended 31 December 2011 loss of £4,388,000)

The Directors paid a dividend for the year of £189,265,000 (year ended 31 December 2011 £nil)

The Company considers its key performance indicators to be in line with those of Melrose Industries PLC as disclosed in the Directors' Report of the 2012 Annual Report

During the year, the activities of the Company have been wound down. The Company's subsidiary, FKI Heracles Limited paid a dividend of £178,927,000 which has been recorded as investment income within the Profit and Loss account. The Company's investment in FKI Heracles was consequently written down to nil resulting in an impairment expense of £180,445,000.

Going concern

The Directors expect that the Company will be liquidated in the near future. These financial statements have therefore been prepared on a basis other than that of a going concern. No material adjustments arose as a result of ceasing to apply the going concern basis.

Financial risk management and policies

The Company's activities expose it to a number of financial risks including credit risk and liquidity risk

Credit risk

The Company's principal financial assets are other receivables (including receivables from other Group undertakings)

The Company's credit risk is primarily attributable to its receivables from other Group undertakings. The amounts presented in the Balance Sheet are net of allowances for doubtful receivables. An allowance for impairment is made where there is an identified loss event which, based on previous experience, is evidence of a reduction in the recoverability of the cash flows

Liquidity risk

In order to maintain liquidity to ensure that sufficient funds are available for ongoing operations and future developments, the Company ensures regular communication with other Group companies

1 Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. They have all been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding year.

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, in accordance with applicable United Kingdom law and accounting standards

The company has taken advantage of the exemption from preparing group financial statements afforded by section 400 of the Companies Act 2006 because it is a wholly owned subsidiary undertaking of Melrose Industries PLC, which prepares consolidated financial statements which are publicly available

Going concern

The Directors expect that the Company will be liquidated in the near future. These financial statements have therefore been prepared on a basis other than that of a going concern. No material adjustments arose as a result of ceasing to apply the going concern basis.

Statement of Cash Flow

Under the provisions of FRS 1 "Cash Flow Statements" (Revised 1996), the Company has not prepared a statement of cash flows because its ultimate parent undertaking, Melrose Industries PLC, has prepared consolidated financial statements which include the financial statements of the Company and which contain a Statement of Cash Flows

Investments

The Company's investment in shares in Group companies are stated at cost less provision for impairment in value. Income received from investments is credited to the Profit and Loss Account on a receivables basis.

Taxation

Current tax, including UK corporation tax and foreign tax, is provided at amounts expected to be paid or recovered using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the Balance Sheet date

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the Balance Sheet date where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred at the Balance Sheet date. Timing differences are differences between the Company's taxable profits and its results as stated in the financial statements that arise from the inclusion of gains and losses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in the financial statements.

A net deferred tax asset is regarded as recoverable and therefore recognised only when, on the basis of all available evidence, it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax is not recognised when fixed assets are revalued unless by the Balance Sheet date there is a binding agreement to sell the revalued asset and the gain or loss expected to arise on sale has been recognised in the financial statements. Neither is deferred tax recognised when fixed assets are sold and it is more likely than not that the taxable gain will be rolled over, being charged to tax only if and when the replacement assets are sold.

Deferred tax is measured at the average rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the Balance Sheet date Deferred tax is measured on a non-discounted basis

On 27 November 2012 a group restructure resulted in Melrose Industries Plc, a company incorporated in Great Britain and registered in England and Wales becoming the new top company for the Melrose Group of companies Since this date the Directors regard Melrose industries Plc as the ultimate parent undertaking and controlling party Prior to 27 November 2012 Melrose Plc was the ultimate controlling party. The immediate parent companies are FKI Limited, which is registered in Great Britain and Whipp & Bourne Limited, which is registered in Great Britain.
