STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

UK Citizens Online Democracy ("UKCOD") is incorporated as a company limited by guarantee, and is registered in the UK as a charity (registered charity no. 1076346). UKCOD is governed by a board of volunteer trustees.

UKCOD operates a number of civic and democratic websites under a single project, MySociety. UKCOD has a wholly owned commercial subsidiary, MySociety Limited. MySociety Limited is governed by a board of directors, comprising a combination of trustees from UKCOD, executive directors and independent non-executive directors. Trustees and non-executive directors are not remunerated by either company. These structures were unchanged from 2007/8.

In terms of staff, UKCOD contracted a new full time developer in 2007/8, and also took on a US based Pledgebank outreach officer on a 12 month contract funded by an American

philanthropic organisation. UKCOD continued to employ or contract with two other developers, one systems administrator and its own Director.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The objectives of UKCOD are to conduct and promote research into the use and effects of information and communication technologies in the context of the operation of any body or bodies which has or have an electorate and to disseminate the useful results of such research for the benefit of the public.

Relatedly, the objectives of the MySociety project are to build websites which give people simple, tangible benefits in the civic and community aspects of their lives; it also aims to teach the public and voluntary sectors, through demonstration, how to use the internet most efficiently to improve lives.

UKCOD continued to further its charitable objects through various projects:

Continuing to operate, maintain and grow the use of our core sites - WriteToThem.com, HearFromYourMP.com, TheyWorkForYou.com and PledgeBank.com, growing the recently launched NeighbourhoodFixIt (later FixMyStreet.com)

Using a donation from the Omidyar Network to raise usage of PledgeBank.com in the USA, and continuing to work with volunteers to make more international versions of PledgeBank

The launch of a website to explain the activities of UKCOD itself - www.ukcod.org.uk

The holding of a first 'unconference' in Berlin to facilitate the international spread of UKCOD's ideas and projects

The construction and launch of a new Freedom of Information Request filing and archiving website called WhatDoTheyKnow.com, growing revenues from its subsidiary MySociety Limited.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

In the calendar years of 2007 and 2008 UKCOD saw traffic to its core sites of:

TheyWorkForYou - 1,815,671 unique visitors in 2007 rose to 1,957,919 in 2008 - an increase of 7.8%

WriteToThem - 488,928 unique visitors in 2007 rose to 517,418 in 2008 - an increase of 5.8%

HearFromYourMP - 86,170 unique visitors in 2007 fell to 83,319 in 2008 - a decrease of 3.4%

PledgeBank - 871,614 unique visitors in 2007 rose to 713,308 in 2008 - a decrease of 22.2%

FINANCIAL REVIEW

UKCOD's financial progress continues to be steady, without rapid changes from the previous year. This was despite the substantial change in funding mechanisms, becoming less dependent on grant funding and gathering more revenue from contracting projects, such as the No10 petitions website.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

In 2008/9 UKCOD intends to focus efforts on growing revenues through its subsidiary MySociety Limited. Its goals for the use of those subsidiaries are to see substantial growth in its newest FixMyStreet.com and WhatDoTheyKnow.com. UKCOD also hopes to expand its research goals by commencing a multi-year evaluation of the usage, performance and impacts of UKCOD websites, learning which should be shared in 2010.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE TRUSTEES

The trustees (who are also the directors of UK Citizens Online Democracy for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the Trustees Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP;
- · make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

REPORTING ACCOUNTANTS

Messrs Complete Tax Solutions will continue in office as reporting accountants for the ensuing year.
