#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

UKCOD is incorporated as a company limited by guarantee, and is registered in the UK as a charity (registered charity no 1076346) UKCOD is governed by a board of volunteer trustees

UKCOD operates a number of civic and democratic websites under a single project, mySociety UKCOD has a wholly owned commercial subsidiary, mySociety Ltd mySociety Ltd is governed by board of directors, comprising a combination of trustees from UKCOD, executive directors and independent non-executive directors. Trustees and non-executive directors are not remunerated by either company. These arrangements were unchanged from 2007/8

In terms of staff, UKCOD continued to function with three mostly full time contracted developers and a systems administrator (though one was on sick leave and compassionate leave for most of 2008/09) Also the US funded PledgeBank outreach officer contracted in 07/08 was not retained, once the philanthropic funding used to hire them expired

#### YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2009

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

The objectives of UKCOD are to conduct and promote research into the use and effects of information and communication technologies in the context of the operation of any body or bodies which has or have an electorate, and to disseminate the useful results of such research for the benefit of the public

Relatedly, the objectives of the mySociety project are to undertake active research, through building and reviewing the success of websites, to explore what is effective at providing simple, tangible benefits in the civic and community aspects of people's lives, it also aims to teach the public and voluntary sectors, through demonstration, how to use the internet most efficiently to improve their lives

UKCOD continued to further its charitable objects through various projects

- Continuing to operate, maintain and grow the use of our core sites WriteToThem.com, HearFromYourMP.com, TheyWorkForYou.com, FixMyStreet.com, WhatDoTheyKnow.com and PledgeBank.com
- The holding of a second 'unconference' in Berlin to facilitate the international spread of UKCOD's ideas and projects, and to build a network of similar organisations internationally
- Growing revenues from its subsidiary, mySociety Ltd

#### ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

In the calendar year of 2009 (figures are only collected on this basis and not to the year end of the accounts), UKCOD saw traffic to its core sites of

TheyWorkForYou - 2 87m unique visitors FixMyStreet - 761k unique visitors HearFromYourMP - 104k unique visitors PledgeBank - 331k unique visitors WhatDoTheyKnow - 965k unique visitors WriteToThem - 714k unique users

Due to a change in monitoring software used, it is not possible to do a comparison with the 07/08 figures

#### FINANCIAL REVIEW

UKCOD continued to be largely dependent on revenues from consultancy done by its subsidiary, mySociety Ltd However, over 07/08/09 it is possible to detect a trend of UKCOD continuing to move away from funding by government, towards other sources

#### PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

UKCOD expects 2009/10 to be a period of consolidation, increasing the quality and traffic to our sites, especially the new and rapidly growing site WhatDoTheyKnow com. It is not expected that any major new services will be launched this year, but it is expected that overall traffic to our sites will reach new record levels by 2010.

#### RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE TRUSTEES

The trustees (who are also the directors of UK Citizens Online Democracy for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the Trustees Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice)

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2009 set out on pages 6 to 10

The charity's trustees (who are also the directors of UK Citizens Online Democracy for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the accounts.
