Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

The charity provided a safe and quiet environment in Gainsborough for aged people and those suffering forms of handicap.

The charity also maintained a sufficient level of reserves to meet future expenditure.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

Gainsborough House (which was built in 1905) is owned by West Lindsey District Council. Gainsborough & District Welfare Community Association Ltd has enjoyed, since 1967, a 'peppercorn' rent on a full repairing lease, that is, the Directors of the Charity (Gainsborough House) are responsible for the internal and external maintenance of the property to the highest standards possible.

An adequate balance is to be maintained to cover unbudgeted capital expenditure. This is deemed necessary in view of the Charity's full repairing liability under the lease of the premises at Parnell Street, Gainsborough and the age of the property.

The Directors have the powers to designate funding under the following:

Articles of the Association article 4 (h)

Memorandum of the Association article 8 (i)

A figure of £50,000 is considered prudent at the present time.

If the designated reserve fund falls short of maintenance costs for capital projects, the Directors shall explore other funding streams to fulfil their obligations under the lease.

To be monitored every six months.

To be reviewed at the Annual General Meeting.

The actual amount held at 31 December 2014 was £66,280.

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2014, which are set out on pages 5 to 8.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) Accounting Convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and follow the recommendation in Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice issued in October 2005.

b) Voluntary income

Voluntary income is received by way of donations and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable.

c) Grants

Grants are recognised in full in the Statement of Financial Activities in the year in which they are receivable.

d) Investment Income

Income arising from bank deposits is accounted for on a receipts basis and disclosed in the Statement of Financial Activities gross.

e) Intangible Income

The premises from which the company operates are owned by West Lindsey District Council. Had the charity rented these premises on a commercial basis, a rent of £20,000 per annum would have been payable. This amount has been included as donations under incoming resources.

f) Resources Expended

Resources expended are recognised in the period in which they are incurred. Resources expended include attributable VAT which cannot be recovered.

h) Funds

Unrestricted funds represent the free funds of the charity which are not designated for any particular purpose. At 31 December 2014 all funds are unrestricted.
