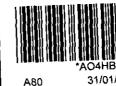

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following are the main accounting policies of the company:

## (a) Accounts Preparation

The Financial Statements have been prepared under the historical cost accounting convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2005). The accounts have been prepared on the going concern basis as the director and company secretary will continue to support the company.

#### (b) Turnover

Turnover represents the net invoiced value of goods and services supplied to third parties, excluding value added tax.

## (c) Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on Fixed Assets on a basis estimated to write off the cost over their expected useful lives in equal annual instalments.

The rates used are as follows:

Plant & Equipment	25 %
Fixtures & Fittings	25 %

### (d) Deferred Taxation

Full provision is made, using the liability method, at current rates for taxation deferred in respect of all material timing differences.
