The trustees present their report together with the financial statements for the period 1st April 2010 to 31st March 2011

The legal and administrative information set out on page1 forms part of this report. The financial statements comply with current statutory requirements, the Memorandum and Articles of Association and the Statements of recommended Practice - Accounting and Reporting by Charities

Principal activity

The principal activities of the charity during the year continued to be the education, training, development and performance of Dance and the Arts

Structure, governance and management

Organisational structure

Black Bird / Red Rose Productions is managed by a board of trustees. The Board meet on a regular basis. The creation of the work is overseen by the Artistic Director, Mark Bruce. New and existing work is produced in collaboration with a regular group of performers and other skilled personnel. Day to day management is delegated to a freelance manager.

Related charities

Black Bird / Red Rose Productions has links with several other organisations on an occasional basis, for specific projects and workshops

Major risks

The Trustees have conducted a risk analysis to identify the major risks to which the company is exposed. Systems have been put in place to mitigate these risks whereby the risks are reviewd at the Trustees meetings.

Objectives and activities for the public benefit

Aims and objectives

The Trustees confirm that they have complied with the duty in section 4 of the Charities Act 2006 and referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives and in planning future activities

The Objectives of the charity are to advance the education of the public at large in the appreciation of the arts and, in particular, dance and the performing arts

The aims of the organisation are to present and promote original artistic productions, to tour and hold workshops with educational organisations and groups

Principal strategies and activities

The main objectives for the organisation for the year were to develop and tour new work

Achievements and performance

This year included the creation, premiere and touring of new work *Love and War Love and War* toured to 10 venues, with 20 performances. In addition, the company led educational workshops in most cities on the tour

The Company was supported by Arts Council England South West, Take Art, the Merlin Theatre, Bristol City Council and Dance South West, in addition to the D'oyle Carte Trust and Garrick Chantable Trust

Financial review

The finances reflect the company working on a project by project basis. Annual expenditure on artistic production increased from 80% of total expenditure in 2009-10 to 90% of total expenditure in the year 2010-11.

In the same period, funding from Arts Council England accounted for 79% of total income, compared with 81% in the previous year

The company had a net increase in the year of £11905 of unrestricted funds

Reserves policy

The Trustees agreed that the existing reserves policy of holding general reserves of between 20% and 25% of annual support costs be maintained. In the year ended 31st March 2011 this equates to between £2286 and £2857. General reserves at 31st March 2011 were £17254.

Future plans and activities

The next year will include research and development of a new work, *Made in Heaven*, and the development of other projects and opportunities

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements are prepared under historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards, the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006, and follow the recommendations laid down in the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" (issued in March 2005)

The company is dependent on the continued support of grant aiding bodies. The Trustees believe that the company will continue to receive this support and accordingly consider that it is appropriate to prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis.

12 Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy

- Incoming resources from generated funds

Grants/sponsorship/donations are recognised in incoming resources in the year in which they are receivable, except as follows

- when donors specify that grants/donations given to the charity must be used in future accounting periods, the income is deferred until those periods
- when donors impose conditions which have to be fulfilled before the charity becomes entitled to use such income, the income is deferred and not included in incoming resources until the pre-conditions for use are met

- Incoming resources from charitable activities

Venue income - income from box office, performance fees and sundry other performance related income is included in incoming resources in the period in which the relevant show takes place

Project specific funding - when donors specify that grants/donations are for particular restricted purposes, which do not amount to pre-conditions regarding entitlement, this income is included in incoming resources of restricted funds when receivable

1.3 Resources expended

All expenditure is included on an accruals basis, inclusive of any VAT which cannot be recovered, and is recognised when there is a legal or constructive obligation to incur the costs

- Production/project costs

Costs incurred in the production and running of productions toured in the year

- Support costs

The administrative and overhead costs associated with running the office from which the company operates. These have all been allocated to the charitable activities cost heading as the proportion spent on governance costs are considered immaterial.

- Governance costs

Costs associated with the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity

1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Individual fixed assets costing £1,000 (except for items that combine to make a larger piece of equipment, or asset, for example computer equipment, for these the amount will be £500 or more) are capitalised at cost

Depreciation of fixed assets is calculated to write off their cost or valuation less any residual value over their estimated useful lives as follows
