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Directors' report

The directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the 52 week period ended 16 September 2006

Principal activities

During the period the principal activity was the holding of shares in subsidiary companies. The principal activity of the subsidiaries was the manufacture and sale of food products

Business review and future developments

During the period the main activity of the company remained unchanged and the directors anticipate that any future developments would be related to this activity

The acquisition of Illovo Sugar Limited, the African cane sugar producer, was completed on 4 September 2006. The company acquired 51% of Illovo's shares for £286m, satisfied in cash

Trading results, share issue, dividends and transfer to reserves

Loss before tax for the current financial year was £1,714,000 (2005 £12,005,000), which includes dividend income from overseas subsidiaries of £20,372,000 (2005 £4,183,000) No ordinary dividend was declared in the year (2005 Nil) £2,248,000 was transferred to reserves (2005 £318,000)

Disclosure of information to auditors

(forming part of the financial statements)

1 Accounting reference date

The accounting reference date of the company is the Saturday nearest to 15 September. Accordingly, these financial statements have been prepared for the 52 week period ended 16 September 2006.

2 Accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the financial statements, except as noted below

In these financial statements the following new standards have been adopted for the first time

- FRS 21 'Events after the balance sheet date',
- the presentation requirements of FRS 25 'Financial instruments' presentation and disclosure', and
- FRS 28 'Corresponding amounts'

The adoption of FRS 21 'Events after the balance sheet date' has had no material effect on the financial statements

The impact of FRS 25 'Financial instruments' presentation and disclosure' is disclosed in the financial instruments policy set out below FRS 25 permits the corresponding amounts not to be restated and the company has adopted this approach

The accounting policies under these new standards are set out below together with an indication of the effects of their adoption FRS 28 'Corresponding amounts' has had no material effect as it imposes the same requirements for comparatives as hitherto required by the Companies Act 1985

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, as modified by the revaluation of certain assets, and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards (UK GAAP) and the Companies Act 1985

Under Financial Reporting Standard I (revised) the company is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement because it is a wholly-owned subsidiary undertaking. A group cash flow statement is included in the financial statements of ABF Investments plc.

The company is controlled by Associated British Foods plc and is exempt from the requirement to disclose transactions with it and other group companies under Financial Reporting Standard 8 as it is a wholly owned subsidiary undertaking included in consolidated financial statements which are publicly available

The company is exempt by virtue of s228 of the Companies Act 1985 from the requirement to prepare group accounts

Financial instruments

Under FRS 25, preference shares issued are classified as financial liabilities. Where preference shares are issued in foreign currency, the shares are revalued to local currency at each reporting date.

Under paragraph 28 of SSAP 20, the company has utilised a financial liability with a fellow subsidiary undertaking as a net investment hedge of an investment in a second subsidiary undertaking. Both the investment and the liability are revalued at each reporting date. This reduces the company's foreign exchange exposure

Income from fixed asset investments

Dividend income is recognised on a receipts basis

Investments in subsidiary undertakings

Investments in subsidiary undertakings are reported at cost less any provision for impairment, except for those investments hedged in accordance with paragraph 28 of SSAP 20. These investments are converted to foreign currency at inception of the hedge and then revalued at each reporting date.

Income tax

Income tax on the profit or loss for the period comprises current and deferred tax where appropriate

Current tax is the tax expected to be payable on the taxable income for the year, using tax rates enacted or substantially enacted at the balance sheet date, together with any adjustment to tax payable in respect of previous years

Provision for deferred tax is made on all timing differences that have originated, but not reversed at the balance sheet date

Share capital

Fully paid ordinary share capital is stated at its nominal value

3 Directors' emoluments and auditors' remuneration

The directors received no emoluments in respect of their services to the company in the current or the previous period

The auditors' remuneration was borne by the holding company in both the current and previous period
