#### THE DIRECTORS' REPORT

#### YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2011

The directors present their report and the financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 December 2011

#### Principal activities and business review

The principal activity of the company during the year was that of a holding company for the Gladstone Limited group of companies which provide computer software and consultancy services in connection with the supply of membership facilities management systems

#### **Business review**

The principle risk for the company is the valuation of its investments in trading subsidiaries, the largest of which is by far Gladstone MRM Ltd The investments also include Gladstone Education Ltd and Valuenetics A/S

Turnover for the year 2011 was £2 26 million which compares with £2 37 million for the 16 month period ended 31 December 2010 The company made an operating profit for the year ended 31 December 2011 of £1,408,002 versus a profit for the 16 month period ended 31 December 2010 of £455,416 which was after £1,030,855 of defence costs against the CSI bid and redundancy of former directors

#### Results and dividends

The profit for the year amounted to £1,290,589 Particulars of dividends paid are detailed in note 10 to the financial statements

#### Financial risk management objectives and policies

The management of the company conducted internal reviews and identified the risks and uncertainties faced by the business on an ongoing basis. The company has developed appropriate contingency plans and put in place clear operational and strategic actions to mitigate such risks.

#### 1. Accounting policies

#### **Basis of accounting**

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, modified to include the revaluation of certain fixed assets, and in accordance with applicable accounting standards

#### Basis of preparation

The directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the annual financial statements.

#### Cash flow statement

The directors have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (Revised 1996) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the company is wholly owned and its parent publishes a consolidated cash flow statement

#### Related parties transactions

As the company is wholly owned subsidiary of Constellation Software Inc, the company has taken advantage of the exemption contained in FRS8 and has therefore not disclosed transactions or balances with wholly owned subsidiaries which form part of the group

#### **Turnover**

The turnover shown in the profit and loss account represents amounts receivable during the year, exclusive of Value Added Tax

#### Research and development expenditure

Expenditure on research and development is written off to the profit and loss account in the period in which it is incurred

#### 1. Accounting policies (continued)

#### Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Cost represents purchase price together with any incidental costs of acquisition.

The freehold property is carried at its revalued amount. The property is revalued once every three years, the last time being as at 31 August 2009. An impairment review is carried out each year to ensure the value being carried forward is appropriate. Depreciation is charged on the revalued amount so as to write off the asset over its expected useful life, being 50 years. An equal amount to the excess of the annual depreciation charge over the historic cost depreciation charge is transferred annually from the revaluation reserve to the profit and loss reserve account.

#### Impairment of value

The company undertakes a review for impairment of a fixed asset if events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount of the fixed asset may not be recoverable. To the extent that the carrying amount exceeds the recoverable amount, that is the higher of net realisable value and value in use, the fixed asset is written down to its recoverable amount. The value in use is determined from estimated discounted future net cash flows

#### **Investments**

Fixed asset investments are stated at cost less any provision for impairment

#### Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, net of anticipated disposal proceeds, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows

Freehold properties
Office equipment and computers

2% straight line basis 4 years straight line basis

An amount equal to the excess of the annual depreciation charge on revalued assets over the notional historical cost depreciation charge on those assets is transferred annually from the revaluation reserve to the profit and loss reserve

#### **Pension costs**

Payments to employees' personal pension schemes are charged to the profit and loss account as they become payable

#### **Deferred taxation**

Deferred tax is provided in full in respect of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes. The deferred tax balance has not been discounted

No provision is made for deferred tax on gains recognised on revaluing the Company's property to its market value unless the Company has a binding contract, at the balance sheet date, to sell the revalued assets

#### 1. Accounting policies (continued)

#### Foreign currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded using the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated using the contracted rate or the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date and the gains or losses on translation are included in the profit and loss account.

#### Share based payments

Following the acquisition of the Company by Constellation Software Inc during the prior period, all share option schemes were closed and there were no outstanding share options as at the Balance Sheet date

#### **Group accounts**

The company is exempt by virtue of \$401 of the Companies Act 2006 from the requirement to prepare group financial statements. These financial statements present information about the Company as an individual undertaking and not about its group.

#### 2. Administrative expenses

Administrative expenses include non-recurring legal consultancy costs of £nil (2010 £496,359) that were incurred during the period following the announcement by Constellation Software Inc, of a cash offer for the share of the Company, and director termination payments of £nil (2010 £538,163) which were incurred following the acquisition of the Company by Constellation Software Inc

To determine the recoverable amount of the investments, the management calculated value in use by using a pre-tax discount rate of 12% in a net present value calculation compromising 10 years of cash flows and a terminal value based on year ten cash flows. The cash flows were determined using the forecasts that are integral to business planning, and are updated by management and presented to the Board of Directors each quarter. These cash flows include the impacts of the investees product development and release programme and the associated impacts on the profitability of the investee. The cash flows assume no turnover growth after year five but include the expected improved profitability of an investee arising solely from agreed changes to intercompany royalties in that period
