Resolution to amend the Memorandum of Association of Bedfordshire Rural Communities Charity, concerning the Area of Benefit

AGM 15th October 2015

Introduction

Earlier this year, BRCC's Board of Directors carried out a review of BRCC's governing documents, and wishes to propose a change to its Memorandum of Association, concerning the Area of Benefit.

BRCC increasingly finds itself needing to operate outside of Bedfordshire as part of activities carried out for the benefit of the community in Bedfordshire, including:

- Environmental, heritage and/or rural economic development activities delivered on a landscape or water catchment scale, which extend into neighbouring counties
- Transport activities covering other nearby areas, such as the Marston Vale Community Rail Partnership
- Greater collaborative working at a regional and national level within the ACRE Network, which may involve BRCC obtaining grants or delivering activities on behalf of other Rural Community Councils

Proposal

The proposal is to introduce the word 'primarily' in front of 'in the historic county of Bedfordshire' in Article 3 1 (the first of the Charity's Objects) as follows:

To promote any charitable purposes for the benefit of the community **primarily** in the historic County of Bedfordshire ("the area of benefit"), and in particular, the advancement of education, the protection of health and the relief of poverty, distress and sickness.

1. Chairman's welcome and introductions

Judy Robinson welcomed those present to BRCC's eighteenth Annual General Meeting.

2. Apologies for absence

3. Minutes of the seventeenth Annual General Meeting held on 11th November 2014 at the Old School, Cardington

The minutes of the previous Annual General Meeting were proposed by Brian Prickett, seconded by Ian Kelly, and approved by a show of hands. They were therefore signed as a true record by the Chairman.

4. Matters arising from the minutes

There were no matters arising.

5. Chief Executive's review of 2014/5

Jon Boswell gave a review of 2014/5, which had been his first year as Chief Executive. Highlights of the year included:

- The success of the Stage 1 bid to the Heritage Lottery Fund Landscape Partnerships programme for the Secrets of the Sands programme, for which £1.66m had been earmarked
- The launch of the Biggleswade Green Wheel, following the award of a CPRE Mark for the Jubilee Wood
- Three separate runner up awards (CPRE Bedfordshire, national Community Rail awards and national Railway Heritage awards) for the Ridgmont Station Heritage Centre
- Securing funding from the Centre for Social Action Innovation Fund for a national Good Neighbours Network
- The launch of our Wheels in Motion community transport service in the rural parts of Bedford Borough
- The end of the Volunteering into Employment programme, succeeded by the Progress to Education, Training & Employment programme
- Securing LEADER funding for two Local Action Groups, including a new one. Beds & Hunts Claylands

Jon drew the meeting's attention to the new BRCC Yearbook 2015 publication, which showcased a number of areas of BRCC's work, including Village Agents; Neighbourhood Planning and rural housing; transport projects including Wheels2Work; and voluntary sector support services.

He also looked ahead to the future. BRCC's mission (to help people and communities to do more for themselves) had never been more important. Clearly, funding was going to be much more competitive, and BRCC would continue to change and adapt as it always had previously. Whatever happened, BRCC would remain a local organisation, and there would continue to be a need for organisations such as BRCC. He stressed that BRCC wanted to be at the heart of the change that needed to happen in Bedfordshire.

6. Presentation and adoption of the report of the trustees and the audited accounts for 2014/5

Paula Grayson, Board member, presented the report of the trustees and the audited accounts, copies of which had been available to download from the website.

Financially, 2014/5 had been a successful year for BRCC. It had raised income of £1,372,305, and spent £1,294,438. This had resulted in an increase in its General Fund (i.e. free reserves) to £183,340.

The accounts were proposed for adoption by Nigel Sparrow, seconded by Brian Prickett, and approved by a show of hands.

7. Resolution to amend the Memorandum of Association of Bedfordshire Rural Communities Charity, concerning the area of benefit

Due notice had been given of a written resolution as follows.

The area of benefit in the Charity's objects (3.1) to change from 'in the historic county of Bedfordshire' to 'primarily in the historic county of Bedfordshire'.

This was being proposed so that BRCC is able to carry out some activities outside of Bedfordshire where these form part of activities carried out for the benefit of the community in Bedfordshire. This had resulted from a review of BRCC's governing documents carried out by the Board of Directors earlier in the year.

The object would now read: To promote any charitable purposes for the benefit of the community primarily in the historic County of Bedfordshire ("the area of benefit"), and in particular, the advancement of education, the protection of health and the relief of poverty, distress and sickness.

Prior consent had been gained for this change from the Charity Commission, as required by law.

The resolution was put to the vote. 11 people present were BRCC members, or authorised representatives of BRCC member organisations, and thereby eligible to vote. Out of those.

11 in favour 0 against 0 abstentions

The resolution was duly carried.

8. Appointment of Board members

Each year, a third of Board members had to retire by rotation, and could seek reappointment. Retiring this year were Judy Robinson, David Bartram, David Adams, Ian Kelly and John May.

The following Board members had nominated themselves for election:

Cllr John Wheeler (as appointed representative of Bedford Borough Council)

Clir Tim Hill (as appointed representative of Bedford Borough Council)

These nominations were seconded by Nigel Sparrow and Ian Kelly respectively

David Adams, Ian Kelly and John May were seeking reappointment as Board members.

All appointments were confirmed by a show of hands in favour.

9. Appointment of auditors

Streets Chartered Accountants were proposed for appointment as the auditors for BRCC in 2015/6 by Paula Grayson, seconded by Nigel Sparrow, and approved by a show of hands.

10. Concluding remarks

Judy Robinson gave her thanks to BRCC staff and the Board.

The meeting closed at around 5.00pm.
