#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

#### **Governing Document**

The rules and regulations by which the charitable company is governed are contained in the memorandum and Articles of Association

#### **Appointment of Trustees**

Trustees are appointed by the members at the Annual General Meeting and are chosen from individuals and organisations sympathetic to the aims and objectives of the charity. One new Board member was elected at VAC's Annual General Meeting in October 2007, one existing member was reelected and one existing member was re-co-opted, bringing the total of Board members to eleven, following the resignation of one other. VAC's full Board met four times in 2007-2008, the Finance Sub-Committee met three times, the HR Sub-Committee met three times and the Equal Opportunities Working Group met four times.

#### Trustee, Induction, Training and Development

At the away day for VAC staff and trustees in July 2007, the focus was on VAC's presentation and marketing and how both the staff and trustees could work together to promote the organisation in as positive a light as possible to as wide an audience as possible. This has resulted in a marketing action plan. A programme of presentations that allow team members to report directly to the Board on their activities has continued to take place. An away day for VAC staff and trustees is planned for July 2008. The Chair of VAC's Board was supported financially to attend a Wales Council for Voluntary Action (WCVA) Third Sector Conference in March 2008, and to attend a WCVA/CVC joint conference in October 2007.

The newly elected trustees were given an induction, and the VAC induction pack, including a Trustee Contract, Trustee Code of Conduct and Trustee Declaration, were used

#### Year Ended 31 March 2008

#### Organisation

The Charity is managed by the Board of Trustees, which meets on a regular basis and employs a team of staff to manage the organisation on a day-to-day basis

The organisation comprises three service delivery teams, Development, Partnerships and Communications, to reflect its core activities, plus a small Finance Team. The managers of the service delivery teams meet regularly as a VAC Service Areas Team in order to plan and coordinate service delivery. The overall management of the organisation is undertaken by a Senior Management Team comprising the Director, the Finance Manager - Assistant Director and the HR and Communications Manager - Assistant Director. All members of the Senior Management Team attend VAC's Board meetings. All of the Teams meet regularly and there are also bi-monthly staff meetings where all VAC staff has the opportunity to meet.

#### **Related Parties**

There were no related party transactions during this or the previous financial year

#### **RISK MANAGEMENT**

The Board of Trustees continues to review the major risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure that systems are established to mitigate those risks. The major risk that has been identified is the loss of funding, in particular core funding. This risk has been linked to the reserves policy to ensure that the Charity has sufficient reserves to continue its activities whilst new sources of funding are found.

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

The object for which the Charity was established is the promotion of any charitable purpose for the benefit of communities in the City and County of Cardiff, in particular the advancement of education, the furtherance of health and the relief of poverty, distress and sickness

#### **Principal Activity**

The principal activity of the company during the year was the provision of advice and support to voluntary organisations in the Cardiff area

#### Services

Capacity Building and Support - services include practical ones such as photocopying and meeting room use and developmental ones such as support with governing documents, planning and fundraising Highlights included helping to establish 14 new community groups and 45 new community projects, assisting 41 organisations and groups with funding applications amounting to £749,679, running our own Better Buildings for Communities grants scheme, introducing Impact Plus, a new, small capital grants scheme, offering a wide range of practical services to members, VAC's popular training programme being accessed by almost 400 people, and VAC being involved in the engagement of recently identified communities in the Welsh Assembly Government sponsored Communities First regeneration initiative

Representation and Joint Working - VAC represented the voluntary sector on 36 strategic partnerships in this period, supported 31 voluntary sector representatives on strategic partnerships and found 17 new members and representatives for strategic partnership working. It also ran four networks in this period, which contain a total of 529 members and organised 22 network and two other events that were attended by 821 and 170 people respectively. The tri-partite Compact with Cardiff Council and the local NHS held an exciting Voluntary Sector Showcasing and Annual Compact meeting in July 2007 that was attended by around 250 people. Compact Task and Finish groups have produced a Model Volunteering Policy and Commissioning Framework for Cardiff.

#### Year Ended 31 March 2008

Information and advice - VAC continued to offer an enquiry service for the sector (442 funding enquiries and 536 general enquiries), to produce its newsletters, Voluntary Action Matters (4 issues) Cashpoint (4 issues) and the new Partnerships Picture (4 issues) and to run information seminars and stalls VAC now carries the new set of information sheets for the WCVA/ CVC Infrastructure in Wales on its website, and they have been accessed frequently. The website itself was accessed almost 8,000 times.

#### **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

#### Results

The total income for the year was £1,076,406 (2007 £725,995) Direct charitable expenditure amounted to £1,153,950 (2007 £691,960) and administration costs totalled £8,205 (2007 £11,086) This resulted in net outgoing resources of £85,749 (2007 incoming resources of £22,949)

#### **Grant Making**

During this year VAC managed the ERDF scheme, Better Building for Communities (BB4C), which continued to provide grants to voluntary groups for capital expenditure throughout the year VAC also ran Impact Plus, which provided small capital grants to local voluntary groups and organisations, as well as the Welsh Assembly Government initiative Grass Roots pilot scheme, which provided small grants to new or small voluntary and community organisations

#### **INVESTMENT POLICY**

The memorandum and articles of association govern the trustees' investment powers. The trustees continue to monitor its policy of keeping any surplus as liquid funds in interest bearing accounts that can be accessed readily.

#### **RESERVES POLICY**

The Board of Trustees has established a policy whereby the unrestricted funds not committed or invested in tangible fixed assets (free reserves) held by the Charity should be six months of the resources expended upon core activities. At this level, the Board of Trustees feels that it would be able to continue the current activities of the Charity in the event of a significant drop in funding. The current level of free reserves is £211,015 and the level identified to enable the organisation to continue for six months is £213,867. The Board of Trustees, primarily through its Finance Sub-Committee, continues to monitor the level and seek ways in which additional unrestricted funds can be increased.

#### **PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS**

In 2008-2009, VAC plans to

- · establish a Policy and Strategy sub-committee of VAC's Board,
- organise an Annual Compact Meeting which will produce a Compact Action Plan for 2008-2010, and
- contribute to the development of Communities First in Cardiff with a project team comprising a Coordinator, three locality Development Officers, two Black and Minority Ethnic Development Officers and two Administrative Officers

#### **RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE TRUSTEES**

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the trustees have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). The financial statements are required by law to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the surplus or deficit of the charity for that period.

In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to

select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently,

make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent,

prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and which enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with Companies Act 1985. The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

In so far as the trustees are aware

there is no relevant audit information of which the charity's auditors are unaware, and

the trustees have taken all steps that they ought to have taken to make themselves aware of any relevant audit information and to establish that the auditors are aware of that information

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### Year Ended 31 March 2008

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **Basis of accounting**

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, modified to include the revaluation of certain fixed assets, and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005) and the Companies Act 1985

#### Cash flow statement

The trustees have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (revised) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the charity is small

#### Incoming resources

- (i) donations are included in the accounts when they are received
- (ii) grants for immediate expenditure are accounted for when they become receivable Grants received for specific purposes are treated as restricted funds. Grants restricted to future accounting periods are deferred and recognised in those periods.
- (III) investment income comprises bank deposit interest and dividends and interest arising from discretionary investment activities

#### **Fund accounting**

The Charity's funds are split between restricted and unrestricted. The restricted funds are analysed in note 16

#### Resources expended

- (i) costs are allocated between direct charitable expenditure and other expenditure according to the nature of the cost. Where items relate to more than one category they are apportioned between the categories according to the nature of the cost.
- (ii) governance costs include expenditure in respect of audit and accountancy, legal and professional and the costs of generating funds and costs in furtherance of the charity's objects and includes that proportion of head office costs that relate to these activities
- (iii) liabilities are recognised as resources expended as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to the expenditure as described in FRS 5 and 12

#### **Fixed assets**

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost

#### Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows

The company makes payments to defined contribution schemes for the benefit of certain employees The assets of such schemes are held separately from those of the company in independently administered funds. The pension cost charge represents contributions payable by the company to the scheme during the year

The EQUAL ESF was a consortium project - Valuing Learning - Strengthening Communities - funded under the European Equal funding stream to demonstrate and strengthen " a voluntary sector approach" to engaging and progressing people who are the hardest to reach in education and training, and ended in December 2007

The Cardiff Council New/Innovative Project supports the development of VAC's Partnership Team and its contribution to partnership working in both the statutory and voluntary sectors, thus improving the support and services to members in relation to partnership working

The ERDF BB4C - Better Buildings For Communities - supports and distributes capital funds for the improvement of community buildings in Cardiff's Objective 2 areas

The CYPP (Children & Young People's Partnership) grant supports the development of networks and activities to support children and young people

The WCVA CVC Supplementary grant supported community development networking events

The CFAP (Community Facilities & Activities Programme) Impact Plus fund is a Welsh Assembly Government funded small grants scheme to provide small community and voluntary organisation with one-off grants of up to £5,000 towards activities and equipment

The Grass Roots Fund is a Welsh Assembly Government capital and revenue pilot grant scheme to support new or small community and voluntary organisations

Communities First is a Welsh Assembly Government sponsored regeneration initiative to identify and work with Lower Super Output Areas in Cardiff
