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Directors' Report

The directors present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2011

Principal activities

The principal activity of the Company is that of an investment holding company

On 23 November 2010, the Company's parent undertaking changed from Virgin Entertainment Group Limited to Bluebottle USA Mobile Inc, both companies being registered in the British Virgin Islands

On 6 January 2011, the Company's parent undertaking changed from Bluebottle USA Mobile Inc to Virgin Wings Limited, a company registered in England and Wales

On 7 January 2011, the Company's parent undertaking changed from Virgin Wings Limited to Classboss Limited, a company registered in England and Wales whose top UK parent undertaking is Virgin Wings Limited

Business review

The Company has considerable financial resources, and as an investment holding company no significant changes are expected in relation to its income streams or cost base that could jeopardise this. As a consequence, the directors believe that the Company is well placed to manage its business risks successfully despite the current uncertain economic outlook.

The directors have a reasonable expectation that the Company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the annual financial statements.

Results and dividends

The profit for the year, after taxation, amounted to £4,538,000 (2010 - £4,899,000)

1. Accounting Policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the Company's financial statements

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards

The Company is exempt from the requirement to prepare group financial statements by virtue of being subject to the small companies regime of the Companies Act 2006. These financial statements present information about the Company as an individual undertaking and not about its group.

Under FRS 1 the Company is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement on the grounds of its size

As the Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Virgin Wings Limited, the Company has taken advantage of the exemption contained in Financial Reporting Standard 8 and has therefore not disclosed transactions or balances with wholly owned subsidiaries which form part of the group

1.2 Investments

Investments in subsidiaries are shown at cost less provision for impairment

1.3 Deferred taxation

Full provision is made for deferred tax assets and liabilities arising from all timing differences between the recognition of gains and losses in the financial statements and recognition in the tax computation

A net deferred tax asset is recognised only if it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are calculated at the tax rates expected to be effective at the time the timing differences are expected to reverse

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted

12. Related party transactions

At 31 March 2011 the Company's ultimate parent undertaking was Virgin Group Holdings Limited, whose principal shareholders are certain trusts, none of which individually has a controlling interest in Virgin Group Holdings Limited. The principal beneficiaries of those trusts are Sir Richard Branson and/or his immediate family. The shareholders of Virgin Group Holdings Limited have interests directly or indirectly in certain other companies which are considered to give rise to related party disclosures under Financial Reporting Standard 8.

On 6 January 2011, Virgin Mobile USA Holdings Limited was sold to another group undertaking and as a result, the Company became a 100% owned subsidiary of Virgin Wings Limited In the current year, the Company has taken advantage of the exemption under Financial Reporting Standard 8 Related Party Disclosures, which enables it to exclude disclosure of transactions with Virgin Wings Limited and its subsidiaries. In the prior year, the Company was not exempt under Financial Reporting Standard 8 Related Party Disclosures

13. Ultimate parent undertaking and controlling party

As at 31 March 2011 the Company is a subsidiary undertaking of Virgin Group Holdings Limited, a company incorporated in the British Virgin Islands

The largest and smallest group in which the Company's results are consolidated are those for Virgin Wings Limited and Virgin Holdings Limited respectively, companies which are registered in England and Wales Copies of the group accounts for Virgin Wings Limited and Virgin Holdings Limited can be obtained from Companies House, Crown Way, Cardiff CF14 3UZ
