INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT TO PENTHAM POWERSPRING LIMITED PURSUANT TO SECTION 247B OF THE COMPANIES ACT 1985

We have examined the abbreviated accounts consisting of the Balance Sheet and related notes 1 to 4, together with the financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 July 2002 prepared under section 226 of the Companies Act 1985.

Notes to the Abbreviated Accounts For the Year Ended 31 July 2002

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards.

(a) Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention. The company is exempt by virtue of Section 248 of the Companies Act 1985 from the requirement to prepare group accounts. These financial statements present information about the company as an individual undertaking and not about its group.

(b) Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis.

(c) Turnover

Turnover represents amounts invoiced, excluding value added tax, in respect of the sale of goods and services to customers.

(d) Goodwill

Goodwill represents the excess of cost of acquisitions over the fair value of disposable net assets acquired. Goodwill is written off in equal annual instalments over its estimated useful economic life.

(e) Patents

Patents are valued at cost less accumulated amortisation. Amortisation is calculated to write off the cost in equal annual instalments over their estimated useful lives, which is expected to be ten years.

(f) Research and development

Research expenditure is written off to the profit and loss account in the year in which it is incurred. Development expenditure is written off in the same way unless the directors are satisfied as to the technical, commercial and financial viability of individual projects and then amortised over the period during which the company is expected to benefit.

(g) Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life.

(h) Leasing

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged on a straight line basis over the term of the lease.

Notes to the Abbreviated Accounts For the Year Ended 31 July 2002

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

(i) Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(j) Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is provided in respect of the tax effect of all timing differences at the rates of tax expected to apply when the timing differences reverse. A deferred tax asset is only provided where there is reasonable expectation funds will be recovered. Timing differences arise from the inclusion of items of income and expenditure in taxation computations in periods different from those in which they are included in financial statements. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted.

The above policy has been changed from the company's previous accounting policy for deferred taxation as a result of the implementation of the new Financial Reporting Standard 19. The required prior year adjustment has not been made by the company as in the opinion of the directors its effect would be immaterial to the financial statements.

(k) Foreign currency translation

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction. All differences are taken to the profit and loss account.
