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REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT

Year Ended 31 March 2001

Principal Activities and Review of the Year

Membership of the CISC has dropped slightly throughout this period due to the amalgamation or closure of member schools.

CISC has continued to service enquiries from members of the general public, from the press, as well as from members. A particular area of enquiries has been from schools and/or religious congregations wishing to change the structure of the management/ownership of their schools in preparation for greater lay involvement. The General Secretary has also worked closely with other Catholic and educational bodies to promote Catholic education including a short trip to Australia to present a paper at a Catholic educational conference.

200 members and guests attended the annual CISC Conference in Stratford-upon-Avon in January 2001, and for the first time a training day for members was held at Church House, Westminster in June 2000.

A twice-termly edition of CISC News is produced in house for all members, who also receive two copies of Networking – Catholic Education Today as part of their membership subscription.

The increased activities of CISC over this period have been financed by an increase in members' subscription.

Risk Assessment

The trustees of CISC carried out a Risk Assessment exercise taking the form of a SWOT analysis in March 2001. Two areas of risk were identified.

Since CISC exists to support the needs of its 140 members, the majority of whom are heads of independent Catholic schools, any reduction in membership directly affects the financial base of CISC which is dependent on membership subscriptions for two-thirds of its income.

Reduction of membership can occur because:

- i Catholic independent schools opt out of membership (one only in 2000/1 and expected to be temporary)
- ii Member schools amalgamate with other schools or close (two in 2000/1)
- iii Member schools are no longer recognised as Catholic by the local bishop and are therefore ineligible for continued membership of CISC (none in 2000/1)

The reduction in the number of Catholic independent schools in the period 2000/1 has been lower than in previous years.

there is increasing difficulty in recruiting and retaining Catholics of the calibre required for the leadership of our schools. As the future of our member schools depends on increasing the supply of suitable candidates steps are being taken to address this issue through appropriate training programmes.

Financial Results for the Year

The surplus for the year was £5,120 (2000: £14,398) details of which are shown in the accounts. The financial position of the Conference at 31 March 2001 was satisfactory.
