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REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT

31 March 1999

The Board submits their report and accounts for the year to 31 March 1999.

Principal Activities and Review of the Year

The principal activity of the charity is to promote education in schools, which teach the Catholic Faith principally by providing the Headteachers or Principals of these schools with the opportunity to meet to discuss, analyse and consider common concerns and to disseminate the outcome of such meetings.

The company was incorporated on 23 July 1997 and registered with the Charity Commission on 29 July 1997. It is the Board's wish to continue the work in Catholic Schools successfully carried out since 1990 by the Catholic Independent Schools Conference – 1990's Group.

The annual conference, attended by a record number of delegates and guests, was held at Bristol in January 1999.

Financial Results for the Year

The surplus for the year was £14,002 (1998: £5,928) details of which are shown in the accounts.

The surplus for the year was achieved as a result of the increase in sponsorship income. This was £15,833 in the year as compared with £7,750 in the previous period. The Conference in Bristol was the first to be held in a hotel rather than at a members school. Charges for attendance were therefore at hotel market rates and the excellent numbers attending produced an overall surplus for the Conference of £4,071.

Francis Floyd retired as Secretary and Sister Frances Orchard IBVM was appointed the full-time General Secretary in March 1999.

Board of Management

Statement of Board's Responsibilities

We are required under company law to prepare accounts for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Charity and of the surplus or deficit of the Charity for that period.
