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REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT

Year Ended 31 March 2000

Principal Activities and Review of the Year

In March 1999 the Catholic Independent Schools' Conference appointed a new, full-time General Secretary, Sr Frances Orchard IBVM, and acquired a permanent office at St Mary's College, Strawberry Hill. A part-time Secretary, Mrs Linda Gillingham was appointed in September 1999. These developments reflected the increased activities of the CISC. Membership numbers have remained constant throughout this period despite movement in both directions. The number of Associate members has increased slightly.

As well as servicing an increased number of enquiries from members, from the press and from the general public, CISC has worked closely with other Catholic and educational bodies to promote Catholic education. The General Secretary embarked on a new policy of school visits and to date fifty-two schools have been visited, some on more than one occasion. The General Secretary frequently sits on selection committees for new heads and deputy heads of CISC schools.

Just under 200 members and guests attended the annual CISC Conference at the London Forum in January 2000. Conference concluded with a special Millennium Mass in Westminster Cathedral at which Bishop Vincent Nicholls was the chief celebrant. The Cathedral was filled to capacity with the parents, staff, pupils and governors of our schools. Training days on topics of specific interest to our members have been planned with the first of these due to take place in June 2000.

CISC restructured its policy on publications for its members. In place of BRIEF, CISC has produced a twice-termly news-sheet for its members entitled CISC NEWS. In addition, a special arrangement has been entered into with NETWORKING-CATHOLIC EDUCATION TODAY whereby all full members of CISC receive two copies five times a year as part of their CISC membership subscription.

The increased activities of CISC over this period have been financed by an increase in members' subscriptions.

Financial Results for the Year

The surplus for the year was £14,398 (1999: £14,002) details of which are shown in the accounts. The financial position of the Conference at 31 March 2000 was satisfactory.

Board of Management

The members of the current Board are detailed on page 1. Since the last annual report Dermot Gogarty, Rev. G F L Chamberlain and Mrs Maureen Ribbins have retired from the Board.

Statement of Board's Responsibilities

We are required under company law to prepare accounts for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Charity and of the surplus or deficit of the Charity for that period.
