The profit before tax is £7,672,347 (2009 £5,556,256) The Board is satisfied with the growth shown during the year Sales grew by 51% and gross profit by 41% There were 94 stores at the end of the year (2009 64) The Board is confident in the future growth of the company and continues to roll out new stores during 2010 We have considered the facilities available to the group and are confident we have sufficient headroom going forward

Notes

(forming part of the financial statements)

1 Accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards and under the historical cost accounting rules

The company is a wholly owned subsidiary of the Mountain Warehouse Group Limited, the company has taken advantage of the exemption contained in FRS 8 and has therefore not disclosed transactions or balances with wholly owned subsidiaries which form part of the Group

Under FRS 1 the company is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement on the grounds that a parent undertaking includes the company in its own published consolidated financial statements

The Board has prepared a working capital forecast based upon assumptions as to future trading. Based upon these projections the facility available and its cash balances, the Board has concluded that the Company has adequate working capital and that therefore it is appropriate to use the going concern basis of preparation for these financial statements.

Goodwill

Purchased goodwill (representing the excess of the fair value of the consideration given over the fair value of the separable net assets acquired) arising on consolidation is capitalised. Purchased goodwill is amortised to nil by equal instalments over its estimated useful life.

Fixed assets and depreciation

Depreciation is provided to write-off the cost less the estimated residual value of tangible fixed assets by equal instalments over their estimated useful economic lives as follows

Fixtures and fittings

5 years

Foreign currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded using a standard rate of exchange which is reviewed and updated regularly. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated using the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date and the gains or losses on translation are included in the profit and loss account.

Leases

Where the group enters into a lease which entails taking substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership of an asset, the lease is treated as a 'finance lease'. The asset is recorded in the balance sheet as a tangible fixed asset and is depreciated by the methods stated above. Future instalments under such leases, net of finance charges, are included with creditors. Rentals payable are apportioned between the finance element, which is charged to the profit and loss account, and the capital element which reduces the outstanding obligation for future instalments.

All other leases are accounted for as 'operating leases' and the rental charges are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the life of the lease

Any incentives received to sign lease agreements have been spread over the duration of the term of the lease in accordance with UITF Abstract 28

1 Accounting policies (continued)

Stocks

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value

Taxation

The charge for taxation is based on the result for the period and takes into account taxation deferred because of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes

Deferred tax is recognised, without discounting, in respect of all timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation arisen but not reversed by the balance sheet date, except as otherwise required by FRS19

Turnover

Turnover represents the amounts (excluding value added tax) derived from the provision of goods and services to customers during the period
