Review of Business

The results for the period under review and financial position of the company are as shown in the annexed financial statements. Progress is continuing to be made. During the period a higher than normal percentage of income was spent on overheads due to the following reasons:

- The Charity is new and is seeking to build up its support base.
- Higher than anticipated management and administration costs.

In the following period management and administration costs are drastically reduced and greater use made of Volunteers support.

1. Accounting Policies

Accounting convention: The financial statements have been prepared under the historic cost convention.

Financial Reporting Standard Number 1.

Tangible Fixed Assets:

Depreciation is provided at 25% per annum on the reducing balance in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life. Capital purchases over £1,000 for each item are capitalised in the accounts.

For a short period after the charity began its work it was operated from an address in Cambridge by a volunteer. No records are available for expenditure incurred during this period.
