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REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS AND TRUSTEES

The directors, who are also the trustees, present their report and the unaudited financial statements of the company for the year ended 30 September 2003.

Legal status

SATRO North London is a charitable company limited by guarantee without share capital. At 30 September 2003 there were four members. In the event of the company being wound up during the period of membership or within one year after, each member undertakes to contribute such amount as may be required not exceeding £1.

Directors' and Trustees' responsibilities

Law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires directors and trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the charity's financial activities during the year and of its financial position at the end of the year. In preparing financial statements which give a true and fair view, the trustees should follow best practice and:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company
 will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy the financial position of the charity and which enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with applicable law. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Principal activities and charitable status.

On 23 December 1998 the company was entered in the Central Register of Charities, following application by the directors.

The charity's objects are:

"To advance public education within science, technology and the environment for young people of statutory school age in the North London Boroughs and surrounding areas".

Review of developments and activities

NATIONAL & REGIONAL FRAMEWORK:

SETPOINTs have been established for each of the new Local Learning and Skills Council areas. Each SETPOINT is an approved member of the National SETNET network which is supported by the DTI and Science and Engineering organisations. Within London there are five SETPOINTs; SATRO North London acts as the appointed SETPOINT for London East.

SCHOOL SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY PROGRAMMES:

During 2001 targets were set for the number of Secondary and Primary children participating in the outreach and inhouse programmes during the academic year 2002 - 2003. This included improving the take up by Secondary schools. This shift in priority was driven by the introduction of vocational GCSEs and increased emphasis on work related learning by the DTI and the Local Learning and Skills Council. Good overall results have been maintained with over 17,000 children involved with SETPOINT London East out reach activities. The particularly noteworthy result is the success of the Key Stage 4 numbers for activities in support of the vocational GCSEs

The take up of the Soanes Centre in-house programme by local schools has grown steadily over the last 4 years and has now reached a steady level of around 5,500 children, mostly children of primary school age.

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STAFF:

There have been no changes in staff during the year. The newly appointed manager for the in-house programme has settled in quickly and runs a very effective programme of Soanes Centre activities.

The contractor who was recruited to work on behalf of four of the London SETPOINTs for delivery of the new Science and Engineering Ambassadors scheme continues to work in a very efficient manner whilst also meeting the needs of each SETPOINT.

In collaboration with the National office, SETNET, discussions are in hand regarding the appointment of a coordinator for the London region. This person would be a member of the SETNET staff and funded by the national office.

FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE:

Performance against budget

Performance against budget for most of the categories was good, the only exception being the higher than expected expenditure on grants for local Education Business Partnerships (EBPs). The EBPs work to an April to March financial year, not an academic financial year, this together with delays in invoicing produced a much higher than expected expenditure. Given that the Reserves Policy adopted during the year required the cessation of further grants or subcontracts this was unfortunate. For 2003 -2004 the backlog of grants and subcontracts have been cleared and this issue should not recur.

OUTLOOK:

Funding:

Funding from SETNET/DTI is assured for another 2 years for delivery of a programme of outreach activities. A small grant was obtained from the New Opportunities Fund (SEED) programme for the production of leaflets, but further funding must be found if the Soanes Centre in-house programme is to continue at its present level.

The Reserves Policy adopted during the year will help towards ensuring continued operation for at least 12 months. Establishing alternative funding sources for the in house programme will continue to be a priority for 2003 –2004.

ORGANISATION:

We are registered as SATRO North London with Companies House and the Charities Commission but during 2003 - 2004 we plan to register a name change to SETPOINT London East in line the National SETNET policy.

During the year Mrs Holloway stepped down as director, this avoided any potential conflict of interest as Mr Holloway continued to act as secretary and CEO. A new trustee and treasurer was also appointed from the Financial Services Agency. However the need to increase the number of trustees and the breadth of representation continues.

Risk Review

The trustees have conducted their own review of the major risks to which the charity is exposed and systems have been established to mitigate those risks.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the special provisions of Part VII of the companies Act 1985 relating to small companies and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" published in October 2000.

NOTES

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a Basis of preparation of financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and are in accordance with applicable accounting standards and the Charities Accounting Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP).

The effect of events relating to the year ended on the balance sheet date which occurred before the date of approval of the financial statements by the Board of Directors and Trustees, have been included in the statements to the extent required to show a true and fair view of the state of affairs at the balance sheet date and of the results for the year ended on that date.

b Depreciation

Depreciation has been computed to write off the cost of tangible fixed assets over their expected useful lives using the following annual rates:

Plant and machinery

- 25% of written down value

Office and Computer Equipment

- 25% of written down value

Grants, donations and other income

Grant, donations and other income is credited to the profit and loss account for the accounting period to which it relates, or in which the donor intends it to be utilised. Income received in advance of the accounting period to which it relates is carried forward as a creditor of the company until it is due to be credited to profit and loss.

Income subject to a specific explicit condition imposed by the donor is treated as restricted income within the terms of the SORP. All other income is treated as unrestricted although the trustees reserve the right to earmark donations for specific areas of activity.
