Trustees' report for the year ended 31 March 2004

Charitable objects

The charity's object and its principal activity is to advance the education of the public through conservation of the Aberystwyth Cliff Railway for the public benefit and through the encouragement of voluntary work in support of the Aberystwyth Cliff Railway.

The site is leased from Ceredigion County Council for 99 years from July 1998 at a peppercorn rent. The lease consists of the top and bottom station with a track on which a funicular railway runs, and the land at the summit on which a Camera Obscura and café is built. The café and Camera Obscura is rented to Plas Lluest Working Together, a no profit/gain community business which involves and trains people with learning disabilities.

Organisational structure

The company is managed by the Management Committee who are elected by the members at the Annual General Meeting of the Company. The Management Committee may at any time co-opt up to three persons to the Management Committee. Members of the Management Committee are also appointed as Directors of the Company. The Management Committee meet regularly to manage its affairs. The charity employs a manager to operate the Cliff Railway, who until March 2005 is also a trustee.

Review of activities and achievements

The company has continued to improve the site by refurbishing exhibition areas and general maintenance. The visitors' centre and disability access is underway thanks to a successful ERDF bid. We hope to see its completion during 2005.

Reserves

The charity's policy is to hold at least 3 months' running costs in reserve. This policy will not be achieved until the deficit on the general fund has been cleared.

Deficiency of funds

The general fund has a deficit of £18,760 at 31 March 2004 funded by current and long-term liabilities. This deficit is expected to clear over the course of the coming two years.

Governance and internal control

The trustees have identified major risks to which the charity is exposed. These risks have been reviewed and systems established to mitigate their possible effect on the charity.

Future developments

After the visitors' centre is completed we hope to be able to increase the visitors to the site by using the centre for functions. The old café will be given a facelift and used as an exhibition/education centre. Further developments will include reinstating the Victorian gardens, bandstand and pathways.

Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2004

1. Accounting policies

1.1. Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective June 2002) and follow the recommendations in 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice' issued in October 2000.

1.2. Incoming resources

Voluntary income is received by way of donations and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included.

Grants, including grants for the purchase of fixed assets, are recognised in full in the Statement of Financial Activities in the year in which they are receivable.

Income from investments is included in the year in which it is receivable.

1.3. Resources expended

Resources expended are recognised in the year in which they are incurred.

Fundraising costs are those incurred in seeking voluntary contributions and do not include the costs of disseminating information in support of the charitable activities.

Support costs are those costs incurred directly in support of expenditure on the objects of the charity.

Management and administration costs include all expenditure not directly related to the charitable activities or to costs of generating funds.

1.4. Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:
