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Directors' Report

The directors present their report, together with the financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2013

Principal activities

The principal activities of the Company are the development of computer software, system installations, software licensing and ongoing system support for the gaming industry

Business review

Performance and development during the year including key performance indicators

The directors monitor performance through the production of a detailed business plan and by comparing actual results against this plan

On a regular basis, key performance indicators are reviewed to ensure that they are within acceptable parameters. These include

- gross profit percentage return on sales
- operating profit return on sales
- level of spend on administrative costs

Results and dividends

The profit for the year of £460,000 (2012 £901,000) is after the deduction of finance costs in respect of non equity shares of £28,000 (2012 £28,000) and has been transferred from reserves. The directors do not propose the payment of a dividend



Notes to the financial statements

1 Statement of accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material to the financial statements

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards, under the historical cost convention within the requirements of the Companies Act 2006. The particular accounting policies adopted are described below and have been applied consistently in the current period.

Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis. The Company is reliant on its ultimate parent undertaking for its continued support. The ultimate parent Company has indicated its continued support for the foreseeable future.

Statement of cash flows

Under Financial Reporting Standard ('FRS') 1 the Company is exempt from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement on the grounds of its size.

Related party transactions

As the Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Bally Technologies Incorporated, the Company has taken advantage of the exemption available under FRS 8 Related Party Transactions, and has therefore not disclosed transactions or balances with other wholly owned subsidiaries which form part of the group.

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Depreciation is provided to write-off the cost less estimated residual value of tangible fixed assets by equal instalments over their estimated useful economic lives, as follows:

Plant and leasehold improvements	-	25%
Gaming Machines	-	33%
Fixtures and fittings	-	25%

Turnover

Turnover represents the amounts (excluding VAT) derived from the provision of goods and services during the year.

Taxation

The charge for taxation is based on the profit for the year and takes into account taxation deferred because of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes.

Deferred tax is recognised, without discounting, in respect of all timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes which have arisen but not reversed by the balance sheet date, except as otherwise required by FRS 19.

Cash

Cash comprises cash in hand and deposits repayable on demand, less overdrafts payable on demand.

Notes (continued)

1 Statement of accounting policies (continued)

Foreign currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded using the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated using the contracted rate or the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date and the gains or losses on translation are included in the profit and loss account.

Pension costs

The Company makes employer contributions to a defined contribution pension scheme. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the Company in an independently administered fund. The amount charged against profits represents the contributions payable to the scheme in respect of the accounting year.

Classification of financial instruments issued by the Company

Following the adoption of FRS 25, financial instruments issued by the Company are treated as equity (i.e. forming part of shareholders' funds) only to the extent that they meet the following two conditions:

- they include no contractual obligations upon the Company to deliver cash or other financial assets or to exchange financial assets or financial liabilities with another party under conditions that are potentially unfavourable to the Company, and
- where the instrument will or may be settled in the Company's own equity instruments, it is either a non-derivative that includes no obligation to deliver a variable number of the Company's own equity instruments or is a derivative that will be settled by the Company's exchanging a fixed amount of cash or other financial assets for a fixed number of its own equity instruments.

To the extent that this definition is not met, the proceeds of issue are classified as a financial liability. Where the instrument so classified takes the legal form of the Company's own shares, the amounts presented in these financial statements for called up share capital and share premium account exclude amounts in relation to those shares.

Finance payments associated with financial liabilities are dealt with as part of interest payable and similar charges. Finance payments associated with financial instruments that are classified as part of shareholders' funds, are dealt with as appropriations in the reconciliation of movements in shareholders' funds.

Reductions in the UK corporation tax rate from 26% to 24% (effective from 1 April 2012) and to 23% (effective 1 April 2013) were substantively enacted on 26 March 2012 and 3 July 2012 respectively. Further reductions to 21% (effective from 1 April 2014) and 20% (effective from 1 April 2015) were substantively enacted on 2 July 2013. This will reduce the Company's future current tax charge accordingly and reduce the deferred tax asset at 30 June 2013 (which has been calculated based on the rate of 23% substantively enacted at the balance sheet date) by £5,000.
