- A. The Company's name is R 'n' B ENGINEERING LIMITED
- B. The Company's Registered Office is to be situated in England and Wales.
- C. The Company's objects are:
- 1(a) To carry on all or any of the businesses of suppliers, designers, manufacturers, assemblers, maintainers and dealers in specialists, fixing and integrated tools, equipment and machinery and hiring of same to the construction industry, die castings and engineering machinery, appliances, components, accessories, tools, jigs, dies and fixtures of all kinds, electrical, electronics, motor, aeronautical, hydraulic, marine, computer and civil and general engineers, engineering consultants, production planners, prototype designers, draughtsmen, and technicians, designers, distributors, factors, manufacturers and merchants of, and dealers in mouldings, shapings, weldings, pressings, assemblies, repetition work and machined castings, brassware metal foundries, can makers, converters and moulders, millwrights, metallurgists, boilermakers, smiths and fitters, wire drawers, tube makers, tin-plate workers, sheet metal manufacturers, workers and dealers tanners, galvanisers, platers, painters, sprayers, also to carry out business of metal polishing, plastic workers and moulders.
- 1(b) To provide technical and engineering services for the installation, service and repair of photographic printing and processing machinery, fusing, laminating, glossing and ancillary equipment, to import, buy and distribute photographic equipment; and to carry on business as trade and retail printers, lithographers, engravers, artists, photographic printers, stereotypers, electrotypers, die sinkers, thermographic printers, typesetters, relief stampers, book-binders, photographers, designers and draughtsmen, newspapers, magazine, periodical and journal publishers and proprietors, press agents, newsagents, journalists, literary, dramatic and music critics, book and print sellers, papermakers, plate makers, colour separators, developers, and printers of films, photocopiers, duplicators, advertising agents and contractors, and as printers and publishers generally.
- 1(c) To carry out business of testing engineers in the field of non- destructive testing, destructive testing, inspecting testing servicing, of all equipment that may require such tests i.e cranes, lifting, gear, escalation lifts at all business premises that these items may be installed in factories, aeroplanes, ships, trains, docks, offices etc. To sell or hire equipment of these descriptions. To carry out the work of general engineer, mechanical, electrical, electronic and software.
- 1(d) To carry on all or part of the business or businesses as general engineers and designers in all its branches for any purpose whatsoever, to the fluid, pneumatic, hydraulic, structural, heat treatment, gas oil, chemical, electrical, electronic industries or otherwise; as consultants, engineers, advisers, designers, technical specialists and draughtsmen for all or any of the above and to embrace the specialisation of research, development, exploitation, expedition, inspection and co-ordination in all branches of the aforesaid and the

engineering fabrication and construction industries; as consultant engineers of all kinds to undertake the processing and/or supervision of all types of equipment and component parts of all kinds including all installations, commissioning, maintenance and repairs, and to acquire, buy, sell or licence patents and licences, all as the Company sees fit.

- 1(e) To carry on all or any of the businesses of general, mechanical, electrical and hydraulic engineers, manufacturers, designers, assemblers, importers, exporters, repairers, installers, maintainers, hirers, letters on hire, distributors, and agents for the sale of, and dealers in electrical, mechanical and hydraulic goods, engineering, electrical and hydraulic equipment plant, machinery, components, accessories, electrical appliances and supplies of every description, tools, jigs, dies and fixtures of all kinds, engineering and electrical consultants, production planners, prototype designers, draughtsmen and technicians, cable joiners, heating, lighting, radio and television engineers, designers, distributors, factors, manufacturers and merchants of, and dealers in mouldings, shapings, weldings, pressings, assemblies, repetition work and machined castings, metal foundries, converters and moulders, millwrights, metallurgists, boilermakers, smiths and fitters, wire-drawers, tube makers, tin-plate workers, sheet metal manufacturers, workers and dealers, tinner, galvanisers, platers, annealers, and enamellers, plastic workers and moulders, motor, mechanical, telecommunication, electrical, heating, ventilating, structural and civil engineers, garage and petrol filling station proprietors, haulage and transport contractors, railway, forwarding, passenger and freight agents, insurance and general commission agents and general merchants; to buy, sell, manufacture, repair, alter, manipulate and otherwise deal in vehicles, plant, machinery, fittings, furnishings and implements, tools, materials, products, articles and things capable of being used for the purpose of the foregoing businesses or any of them, or likely to be required by customers of or persons having dealings with the Company.
- 1(f) To carry on all or any part of the business or businesses as engineers, designers and the provision of design services to the construction industry, draughtsmen and technical author in all its branches, acting as specialists, consultants and advisers in all of them with particular emphasis on mechanical, electrical, civil, architectural, piping, landscape, general industrial and domestic projects, contractors, hirers, developers, manufacturers, suppliers, repairers, constructors and transporters to the petro-chemical, chemical, pharmaceutical, agricultural, water treatment, aircraft, entertainment, ship-building, transport, general trading and all fields of light and heavy engineering industries together with special emphasis on design and development drawings including tracing, copying, artwork or otherwise, and to offer a special service thereof and of standard pre-prepared plans and illustrations for industrial, commercial or domestic structures or buildings or any part of them, and as manufacturers and suppliers of individual models for demonstration or display purposes or to illustrate design schemes either for those designed by the Company or by clients or otherwise.
- 1(g) To carry on the business of financial, management, property, marketing consultants, contractors, legal consultants, business developers and advisers and advisers of every and any description; to advise and operate promotional schemes and point-of-sale media schemes of every and any description; to carry on the business of owners, managers, proprietors and operators of marketing, management and promotional scheme agencies, computer bureaux and bureaux of all kinds and to provide advisory and consultancy services of all kinds to customers of or persons having dealings with the Company; to carry on the business of consultants and advisers into all aspects of marketing, point-of-sale media, advertising, cost control, stock control, management, office management, accountancy, book-keeping, taxation, liquidation, transportation, computer systems and otherwise; and to enter into any contracts and other arrangements of all kinds with persons having dealings with the Company on such terms and for such periods of time as the Company may from time to time determine, on a commission or fee basis or otherwise.
- 1(h) To carry on business as mechanical, constructional, agricultural, consulting, heating and general engineers and contractors and as manufacturers, repairers and letters on hire of, and wholesale and retail suppliers and dealers in machinery, agricultural machinery, rolling stock, steel girders, scaffolding, implements, tools, patterns, jigs, plates, accessories, hardware, cooking and heating stoves, boilers, ranges and fire-places, and all heating, cooking, ventilating and refrigerating plant or apparatus and all office machinery, furniture, supplies and apparatus and engineering equipment and supplies of every kind and as tinplate, steel and metal workers, steel makers, iron-foundries, smelters, refiners, welders, electrical, hydraulic, marine, gas, water and ventilation engineers, metallurgists, chemists,

distillers, electricians, tool and pattern makers, stampers, press tool and capstan workers, builders, carriers, machinists, smiths, scrap and waste merchants, fuel merchants, machinery, metal and wooden goods manufacturers, agricultural contractors, industrial consultants, builders' merchants, and as builders, owners and managers of factories, mills, furnaces, quarries, mines, ships, warehouses, docks, stores, wharves, and as manufacturers, workers merchants and dealers of and in cake spelter, pig lead, ingot, iron, steel, zinc, lead, copper, brass, tin, metals, ores, alloys, tinplate, gases, oils, chemicals, manures, lime, cement, rock, clay, concrete, bricks, stone, gravel, coke, minerals, by-products and substances of every description, and as haulage and transport contractors and carriers and to carry on all descriptions of trade or business connected with any of the above mentioned trades, articles or services.

- 1(i) To carry on, in conjunction with each other or as separate and distinct undertakings, all or any of the following businesses; manufacturers, importers, exporters, agents, dealers (both wholesale and retail) in all articles of commercial, manufacturing, personal and household use and consumption and in all kinds of raw materials; warehousemen; storage contractors, shipping and forwarding agents; manufacturers of and dealers in all types of equipment and machinery; dealers in property and estates; property developers and investors, property managers, to offer services of accountant, book-keeper or secretary; estate agents, insurance agents and brokers, financiers, financial agents and to act as nominee, trustee, agent, factor, broker, executor, administrator, receiver for or otherwise on behalf of Companies, Corporations, firms or persons, builders; scaffolders; contractors, sign makers; heating and ventilation engineers and contractors; refrigeration engineers, specialists and contractors; decorators; painters; bricklayers, carpenters; shuttering manufacturers and erectors; joiners, public works contractors; plasterers, plumbers, electricians, shop front fitters; carpet dealers and layers; builders and decorators' merchants; civil mechanical, constructional, agricultural consulting, heating, electrical and general engineers; architects; welders, sheet metal workers; double glazing and window consultants; blacksmiths, motor engineers; garage proprietors; car dealers; car hire service, taxi proprietors and operators; travel agents, tour operators, proprietors of vehicles and vessels of all kinds, transport and haulage contractors; general engineers; tool makers; booking agents for, and managers of, theatres, cinemas and all other kinds of entertainments and sporting events; turf and sporting accountants in all their branches; proprietors of shops, cafes, clubs, hotels and restaurants, catering contractors; dealers in foods and provisions of all kinds; wine and spirit merchants; butchers; grocers; greengrocers; fishmongers and poultry merchants; dealers in health foods; farmers; florists; horticulturists; bakers; confectioners; tobacconists; ironmongers; hardware merchants; dealers in plastics of all kinds, antique dealers; furniture manufacturers and dealers; leather and fancy goods dealers; jewellers, radio television and electrical retailers, dealers and repairers, toys, games and sports equipment dealers; photographers and dealers in all kinds of photographic material and equipment, film producers and distributors; footwear manufacturers, boot and shoe retailers, perfumery and cosmetic dealers, hairdressers; manufacturing and retail chemists; medical supplies; printers publishers, stationers, advertising and publicity agents; public relation specialists, consultants, business transfer agents and employment agents; hire purchase and leasing operators; computer operators, programmers and dealers; video dealers, market research specialists; business advisers, mail order specialists; dyers and cleaners; dry cleaners, proprietors of launderettes, excavation and demolition contractors; locksmiths, security advisers, plant hirers, scrap iron and waste merchants and commodity traders and to carry on all or any of the said businesses, and provide services in connection therewith, either together as one business or as separate and distinct businesses, in any part of the world.
- 1(j) To carry on any other business which, in the opinion of the Company, may be capable of being conveniently or profitably carried on in conjunction with or subsidiary to any other business of the Company and is calculated to enhance the value of the Company's property or further its objects or any of them.

To act as a general **commercial company** and in particular but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing to carry on within and without the United Kingdom all or any of the businesses of exporters, importers, manufacturers, agents, brokers, general merchants and dealers, both wholesale and retail in all articles of commercial, manufacturing, personal and household use and consumption.

- (2) To carry on any other business which may seem capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with any of the businesses aforesaid or otherwise calculated, directly or indirectly, to enhance the value of or render more profitable any of the Company's property or rights.
- (3) To purchase or otherwise acquire, subscribe for or underwrite or guarantee the subscription of, hold and deal in, whether on its own account or for any other person, any shares, debentures, stocks, bonds, script or other securities issued by any company or association or any supreme, municipal, local or other authority, whether in Great Britain or any overseas country or place.
- (4) To purchase, take on lease, hire or otherwise acquire and hold for any estate or interest any lands, buildings, easements, rights, privileges, concessions, patent rights, licences, secret processes, machinery, plant, stock-in-trade, and any real and personal property of any kind which may be necessary for, or may be conveniently used with or may enhance the value of any other property of the Company.
- (5) To build, construct, maintain, alter, enlarge, pull down, and remove, or replace any buildings of any kind whatsoever, and to clear sites for the same, or to join with any person, firm or company in doing any of the things aforesaid, and to work, manage, and control the same or join with others in so doing.
- (6) To purchase or otherwise acquire, take over, and undertake the whole or any part of the business and assets of any person, firm, or company carrying on or proposing to carry on any of the businesses which this Company is authorised to carry on, and as part of the consideration for such acquisition to undertake all or any of the liabilities of such person, firm or company, or to acquire an interest in, amalgamate with, or enter into partnership or into any arrangement for sharing profits, or for co-operation, or for limiting competition, or for mutual assistance with any such person, firm or company, or for subsidising or otherwise assisting any such person, firm, or company and to give or accept, by way of consideration for any of the acts or things aforesaid or property acquired, any Shares, Debentures, Debenture Stock or Securities that may be agreed upon, and to hold and retain, or sell, mortgage, and deal with any Shares, Debenture Stock, or Securities so received.
- (7) To apply for, register, purchase, or by other means acquire and protect, prolong, and renew, whether in the United Kingdom or elsewhere, any patents, patent rights, licences, trade marks, designs, protections, and concessions, and to use and turn to account and to manufacture under or grant licences or privileges in respect of the same, and to expend money in experimenting upon and testing and in improving or seeking to improve any patents, inventions, or rights which the Company may acquire or propose to acquire.
- (8) To improve, manage, cultivate, develop, exchange, let on lease or otherwise, mortgage, charge, sell, dispose of, turn to account, grant rights and privileges in respect of, or otherwise deal with all or any part of the property and rights of the Company.
- (9) To lend and advance money or give credit on such terms as may seem expedient and with or without security to customers and others, to enter into guarantees, contracts of indemnity and suretyships of all kinds, to receive money on deposit or loan upon any terms and to secure or guarantee the payment of any sums of money or the performance of any obligation by any Company, firm or person including any holding company, subsidiary or fellow subsidiary company in any manner.
- (10) To borrow or raise money in such manner as the Company shall think fit, and in particular by the issue of Debentures or Debenture Stock, and to secure the repayment of any money borrowed, raised or owing, by mortgage, charge, or lien upon the whole or any part of the Company's property or assets (whether present or future), including its uncalled Capital, and also by a similar mortgage, charge, or lien to secure and guarantee the performance by the Company or any obligation or liability it may undertake.
- (11) To draw, make, accept, endorse, discount, execute and issue promissory notes, bills of exchange, bills of lading, warrants, debentures, and other negotiable or transferable instruments.
- (12) To invest and deal with the moneys of the Company not immediately required in such shares or upon such securities and in such manner as may from time to time be determined.

- (13) To enter into any arrangements with any Governments or Authorities or any companies, firms or persons that may seem conducive to the attainment of the Company's objects or any of them, and to obtain from any such Government, Authority, company, firm, or person any charters, contracts, decrees, rights, privileges, and concessions, and to carry out, exercise, and comply with any such charters, contracts, decrees, rights, privileges, and concessions.
- (14) To act as agents or brokers and as trustees for any person, firm or company, and to undertake and perform sub-contracts, and also to act in any of the businesses of the Company through or by means of agents, brokers, sub-contractors, or others.
- (15) To subscribe for, purchase, or otherwise acquire and hold Shares or other interests in or Securities of any other company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of this Company or carrying on any business capable of being carried on so as directly or indirectly to benefit this Company.
- (16) To remunerate any person, firm, or company rendering services to this Company, either by cash payment or by the allotment to him or them of Shares or Securities of the Company credited as paid up in full or in part or otherwise as may be thought expedient.
- (17) To support and subscribe to any charitable or public object and to support and subscribe to any institution, society, or club which may be for the benefit of the Company or its Directors or employees, or may be connected with any town or place where the Company carries on business; to give or award pensions, annuities, gratuities, and superannuation or other allowances or benefits or charitable aid and generally to provide advantages, facilities and services for any persons who are or have been Directors of, or who are or have been employed by, or who are serving or have served the Company, or any company which is a subsidiary of the Company or the holding company of the Company or a fellow subsidiary of the Company or the predecessors in business of the Company or of any such subsidiary, holding or fellow subsidiary company and to the wives, widows, children and other relatives and dependants of such persons; to make payments towards insurance; and to set up, establish, support and maintain superannuation and other funds or schemes (whether contributory or non-contributory) for the benefit of any of such persons and of their wives, widows, children and other relatives and dependants; and to set up, establish, support and maintain profit sharing or share purchase schemes for the benefit of any of the employees of the Company or of any such subsidiary, holding or fellow subsidiary company and to lend money to any such employees or to trustees on their behalf to enable any such purchase schemes to be established or maintained.
- (18) To enter into partnership or into any arrangement for sharing profits or to amalgamate with any person, firm or company carrying on or proposing to carry on any business which the Company is authorised to carry on or any business or transaction capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit the Company.
- (19) To promote any other company for the purpose of acquiring the whole or any part of the business or property and undertaking any of the liabilities of this Company, or of undertaking any business or operations which may appear likely to assist or benefit this Company or to enhance the value of any property or business of this Company, and to place or guarantee the placing of, underwrite, subscribe for, or otherwise acquire all or any part of the shares or securities of any such company as aforesaid.
- (20) To sell or otherwise dispose of the whole or any part of the business or property of the Company, either together or in portions for such consideration as the Company may think fit, and in particular for shares, debentures or securities or any company purchasing the same.
- (21) To distribute among the Members of the Company in kind any property of the Company, and in particular any shares, debentures, or securities of other companies belonging to this Company or of which this Company may have the power of disposing.
- (22) To pay all or any expenses incurred in connection with the promotion, formation and incorporation of the Company, or to contract with any person, firm or company to pay the same, and to pay commissions to brokers and others for underwriting, placing, selling, or guaranteeing the subscription of any Shares, Debentures, Debenture Stock, or other Securities of this Company.
- (23) To procure the Company to be registered or recognised in any part of the world.

- (24) To do all such other things as may be deemed incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects or any of them.

It is hereby expressly declared that each Sub-Clause of this Clause shall be construed independently of the other Sub-Clauses hereof, and that none of the objects mentioned in any Sub-Clause shall be deemed to be merely subsidiary to the objects mentioned in any other Sub-Clause.

- D. The liability of the Members is limited.
- E. The Company's Share Capital is £100 divided into 100 Ordinary Shares of £1.00 each. 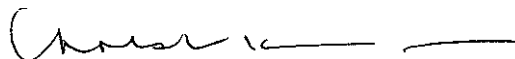

THE COMPANIES ACT 1985

PRIVATE COMPANY LIMITED BY SHARES

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION

OF

R 'n' B ENGINEERING LIMITED

Preliminary

1 The regulations contained or incorporated in Table A in the Schedule to the Companies (Tables A to F) Regulations 1985 (such Table being hereinafter called 'Table A') shall apply to the Company save in so far as they are excluded or varied hereby and such Regulations (save as so excluded or varied) and the Articles hereinafter contained shall be the Regulations of the Company.

Private Company

2 The Company is a private limited company within the meaning of the Companies Act 1985 and accordingly no shares or debentures of the Company shall be offered to the public.

Shares

3 (a) Shares which are comprised in the authorised share capital with which the Company is incorporated shall be under the control of the directors who may (subject to paragraph (d) below) allot, grant options over or otherwise dispose of the same, to such persons, on such terms and in such manner as they think fit.

(b) After the first allotment of shares by the directors any further shares proposed to be issued shall first be offered to the members in proportion as nearly as may be to the number of the existing shares held by them respectively unless the Company shall by Special Resolution otherwise direct. The offer shall be made by notice specifying the number of shares offered, and limiting a period (not being less than 14 days) within which the offer, if not accepted, will be deemed to be declined. After the expiration of that period, those shares so deemed to be declined shall be offered in the proportion aforesaid to the persons who have, within the said period, accepted all the shares offered to them; such further offer shall be made in like terms in the same manner and limited by a like period as the original offer. Any shares not accepted pursuant to such offer or further offer as aforesaid or not capable of being offered as aforesaid except by way of fractions and any shares released from the provisions of this Article by such Special Resolution as aforesaid shall be under the control of the Directors, who may (subject to paragraph (d) below) allot, grant options over or otherwise dispose of the same to such persons, on such terms, and in such manner as they think fit, provided that, in the case of shares not accepted as aforesaid, such shares shall not be disposed of on terms which are more favourable to the subscribers therefor than the terms on which they were offered to the Members.

(c) In accordance with Section 91 of the Companies Act 1985 Sections 89(1) and 90 of the said Act shall not apply to the Company

(d) The Directors are generally and unconditionally authorised for the purposes of Section 80 of the Companies Act 1985 to exercise any power of the Company to allot and grant rights to subscribe for or convert securities into shares of the Company up to the amount of the authorised share capital with which the Company is incorporated at any time or times during the period of five years from the said date of incorporation and the Directors may, after that period, allot any shares or grant any such rights under this authority in pursuance of an offer or agreement so to do made by the Company within that period. The authority hereby given may at any time (subject to the said Section 80) be renewed, revoked or varied by Ordinary Resolution.

4 The lien conferred by Regulation 8 in Table A shall attach also to fully paid up shares. Regulation 8 in Table A shall be modified accordingly.

5 The liability of any member in default in respect of a call shall be increased by the addition at the end of the first sentence of Regulation 18 in Table A of the words 'and all expenses that may have been incurred by the Company by reason of such non-payment.'

Transfer of Shares

6 (a) The Directors may, in their absolute discretion and without assigning any reason therefor, decline to register any transfer which would otherwise be permitted under the succeeding provisions of this Article if it is a transfer:

- (i) of a share on which the Company has a lien;
- (ii) of a share (not being a fully paid share) to a person of whom they shall not approve;
- (iii) of a share (whether or not it is fully paid) made pursuant to paragraph (g) below.

Regulation 24 in Table A shall not apply to the Company.

(b) Any person (hereinafter called 'the proposing transferor') proposing to transfer any shares shall give notice in writing (hereinafter called 'the transfer notice') to the Company that he desires to transfer the same and specifying the price per share which in his opinion constitutes the fair value thereof. The transfer notice shall constitute the Company the agents of the proposing transferor for the sale of all (but not some of) the shares comprised in the transfer notice to any member or members willing to purchase the same (hereinafter called "the purchasing member") at the price specified therein or at the fair value certified in accordance with paragraph (d) below (whichever shall be the lower). A transfer notice shall not be revocable except with the sanction of the directors.

(c) The shares comprised in any transfer notice shall be offered to the members (other than the proposing transferor) as nearly as may be in proportion to the number of shares held by them respectively. Such offer shall be made by notice in writing (hereinafter called 'the offer notice') within seven days after the receipt by the Company of the transfer notice. The offer notice shall state the price per share specified in the transfer notice and shall limit the time in which the offer may be accepted, not being less than 21 days nor more than 42 days after the date of the offer notice, provided that if a certificate of fair value is requested under paragraph (d) below the offer shall remain open for acceptance for a period of 14 days after the date on which notice of the fair value certified in accordance with that paragraph shall have been given by the Company to the members or until the expiry of the period specified in the offer notice whichever is the later. For the purpose of this Article an offer shall be deemed to be accepted on the day on which the acceptance is received by the Company. The offer notice shall further invite each member to state in his reply the number of additional shares (if any) in excess of his proportion which he desires to purchase and if all the members do not accept the offer in respect of their respective proportions in full the shares not so accepted shall be used to satisfy the claims for additional shares as nearly as may be in proportion to the number of shares already held by them respectively, provided that no member shall be obliged to take more shares than he shall have applied for. If any shares shall not be capable without fractions of being offered to the members in proportion to their existing holdings, the same shall be offered to the members, or some of them, in such proportions or in such manner as may be determined by lots drawn in regard thereto, and the lots shall be drawn in such manner as the directors may think fit.

(d) Any member may, not later than eight days after the date of the offer notice, serve on the Company a notice in writing requesting that the auditor for the time being of the Company (or at the discretion of the auditor, a person nominated by the President for the time being of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales) certify in writing the sum which in his opinion represents the fair value of the shares comprised in the transfer notice as at the date of the transfer notice and for the purpose of this Article reference to the auditor shall include any person so nominated. Upon receipt of such notice the Company shall instruct the auditor to certify as aforesaid and the costs of such valuation shall be apportioned among the proposing transferor and the purchasing members or borne by any one or more of them as the auditor in his absolute discretion shall decide. In certifying the fair value as aforesaid the auditor shall be considered to be acting as an expert and not as an arbitrator or arbiter and accordingly any provisions of law or statute relating to arbitration shall not apply. Upon receipt of the certificate of the auditor, the Company shall by notice in writing inform all members of the fair value of each share and of the price per share (being the lower of the price specified in the transfer notice and the fair value of each share) at which the shares comprised in the transfer notice are offered for sale. For the purpose of this Article the fair value of each share comprised in the transfer notice shall be the sum certified as aforesaid divided by the number of shares comprised in the transfer notice.

(e) If purchasing members shall be found for all the shares comprised in the transfer notice within the appropriate period specified in paragraph (c) above, the Company shall not later than seven days after the expiry of such appropriate period give notice in writing (hereinafter called 'the sale notice') to the proposing transferor specifying the purchasing members and the proposing transferor shall be bound upon payment of the price due in respect of all the shares comprised in the transfer notice to transfer the shares to the purchasing members.

(f) If in any case the proposing transferor after having become bound as aforesaid makes default in transferring any shares the Company may receive the purchase money on his behalf, and may authorise some person to execute a transfer of such shares in favour of the purchasing member. The receipt of the Company for the purchase money shall be a good discharge to the purchasing member. The Company shall pay the purchase money into a separate bank account.

(g) If the Company shall not give a sale notice to the proposing transferor within the time specified in paragraph (e) above, he shall, during the period of 30 days next following the expiry of the time so specified, be at liberty subject to paragraph (a) above to transfer all or any of the shares comprised in the transfer notice to any person or persons.

(h) Regulations 29 to 31 of Table A shall apply subject to the following provisions:

(i) Any person becoming entitled to a share in consequence of the death or bankruptcy of a member shall give a transfer notice before he elects in respect of any share to be registered himself or to execute a transfer.

(ii) If a person so becoming entitled shall not have given a transfer notice in respect of any share within six months of the death or bankruptcy, the directors may at any time thereafter upon resolution passed by them give notice requiring such person within 30 days of such notice to give a transfer notice in respect of all the shares to which he has so become entitled and for which he has not previously given a transfer notice and if he does not do so he shall at the end of such 30 days be deemed to have given a transfer notice pursuant to paragraph (b) of this Article relating to those shares in respect of which he has still not done so.

(iii) Where a transfer notice is given or deemed to be given under this paragraph (h) and no price per share is specified therein the transfer notice shall be deemed to specify the sum which shall, on the application of the directors, be certified in writing by the auditors in accordance with paragraph (d) of this Article as the fair value thereof.

(i) The provisions of these Articles 6(b) to (h) shall not apply to the transfer by a subscriber to the Memorandum of Association of any share taken by such subscriber pursuant thereto.

Redemption of Shares

7 Subject to the provisions of the Act shares may be issued which are to be redeemed or are to be liable to be redeemed at the option of the Company or the holder, provided that the terms on which and the manner in which any such redeemable shares shall or may be redeemed shall be specified by Special Resolution before the issue thereof.

Regulation 3 of Table A shall not apply to the Company.

General Meetings and Resolutions

8 Every notice convening a General Meeting shall comply with the provisions of Section 372(3) of the Companies Act 1985 as to giving information to members in regard to their right to appoint proxies; and notices of and other communications relating to any General Meeting which any member is entitled to receive shall be sent to the Directors and to the auditor for the time being of the Company.

9 Regulation 41 in Table A shall be read and construed as if the words 'and if at the adjourned meeting a quorum is not present within half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting, the members present shall be a quorum.' were added at the end.

Appointment of Directors

10 The number of the directors may be determined by Ordinary Resolution of the Company but unless so fixed there shall be no maximum number of Directors and the minimum number of Directors shall be one. In the event of the minimum number of Directors fixed by or pursuant to these Articles or Table A being one, a sole Director shall have authority to exercise all the powers and discretion's by Table A or these Articles expressed to be vested in the Directors generally and the quorum for the transaction of the business of the Directors shall be one. Regulation 64 in Table A shall not apply to the Company.

11 The office of a Director shall be vacated if :-

(a) he ceases to be a Director by virtue of any provision of the Act or he becomes prohibited by law from being a Director; or

(b) he becomes bankrupt; or

(c) he is, or may be, suffering from mental disorder and either:-

(i) he is admitted to hospital in pursuance of an application for admission for treatment under the Mental Health Act 1983 or, in Scotland, an application for admission under the Mental Health (Scotland) Act 1960, or

(ii) an order is made by a court having jurisdiction (whether in the United Kingdom or elsewhere) in matters concerning mental disorder for his detention or for the appointment of a receiver, curator bonis or other person to exercise powers with respect to his property or affairs; or

(d) he resigns his office by notice to the company; or

(e) he shall for more than six consecutive months have been absent without permission of the Directors from meetings of Directors held during that period and the Directors resolve that his office be vacated.

Regulation 81 of Table A shall not apply to the Company.

12 The Directors shall not be required to retire by rotation and accordingly Regulations 73, 74 and 75 in Table A shall not apply to the Company and Regulations 76, 77, 78 and 79 in Table A shall be modified accordingly.

13 Any appointment or removal of an alternate Director may be made by letter, cable, telex, telegram, facsimile or radiogram or in any other manner approved by the Directors. Any cable, telex, telegram, facsimile or radiogram shall be confirmed as soon as possible by letter but is a valid appointment in the meantime. Accordingly Regulation 68 in Table A shall not apply to the Company.

Powers of Directors

14 In addition to and without prejudice to the generality of the powers conferred by Regulation 70 of Table A the Directors may mortgage or charge all the undertaking and property of the Company including the uncalled capital or any part thereof, and to issue debentures, debenture stock and other securities whether outright or as security for any debt, liability or obligation of the Company or of any third party.

15 (a) The Directors may exercise the powers of the Company conferred by its Memorandum of Association and shall be entitled to retain any benefits received by them or any of them by reason of the exercise of any such powers.

(b) Accordingly, Regulation 87 in Table A shall not apply to the Company.

16 A Director may vote as a Director in regard to any contract or arrangement in which he is interested or upon any matter arising thereout, and if he shall so vote his vote shall be counted and he shall be reckoned in estimating a quorum when any such contract or arrangement is under consideration; and Regulations 94 to 97 in Table A shall be modified accordingly.

17 Any Director or member of a committee of the Directors may participate in a meeting of the Directors or such committee by means of conference telephone or similar communications equipment whereby all persons meeting in this manner shall be deemed to constitute presence in person at such meeting.

Single Member Company

18 If at any time, and for as long as, the Company has a single member all provisions of these Articles shall (in the absence of any expressed provision to the contrary) apply with such modification as may be necessary in relation to a company with a single member.

The Seal

19 The seal, if any, shall only be used with the authority of the Directors or of a committee of Directors. The Directors may determine who shall sign any instrument to which the seal is affixed and unless otherwise so

determined it shall be signed by a Director and by the Secretary or second Director. The obligation under Regulation 6 of Table A relating to the sealing of share certificates shall apply only if the Company has a seal.

Regulation 101 of Table A shall not apply to the Company.

Indemnity

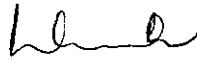
20 (a) Every Director or other officer of the Company shall be indemnified out of the assets of the Company against all losses or liabilities which he may sustain or incur in or about the execution of the duties of his office or otherwise in relation thereto, including any liability incurred by him in defending any proceedings, whether civil or criminal, in which judgement is given in his favour or in which he is acquitted or in connection with any application under Sections 144 or 727 of the Companies Act 1985, in which relief is granted to him by the court, and no Director or other officer shall be liable for any loss, damage or misfortune which may happen to or be incurred by the Company in the execution of the duties of his office or in relation thereto. But this Article shall only have effect in so far as its provisions are not avoided by Section 310 of the Companies Act 1985.

(b) The Directors shall have power to purchase and maintain an insurance policy for any Director, Officer or Auditor of the Company effecting cover against any such liability as is referred to in Section 310(1) of the said Act from and after bringing into force of Section 137 of the Companies Act 1989.

(c) Accordingly Regulation 118 in Table A shall not apply to the Company.
