DIRECTORS' REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2014

The directors present their report and financial statements of the company and the group for the year ended 30 June 2014.

Principal activities and review of the business

The principal activity of the group continued to be that of the sale, warehousing and distribution of packaging materials and that of a football club.

Our main activity is the supply of added value high technology packaging materials to the Food Industry.

We operate in a niche market providing quality convenience foods packaging and microwavable retort pouches for rice, sauces and pasta products with long shelf life.

Our main end customers are the Supermarket Groups and we supply to Food Producers who in turn supply to Supermarkets with our business therefore heavily focussed on high service levels of quality and fast availability of complex products.

As forecast within our review last year competitive pressures remained intense and we made substantial capital investment in Buildings together with Computer Software to address these challenges. We continue to develop quality, innovation and service levels in support of the business with our new storage facilities having doubled in capacity thereby further improving service levels to customers.

We continue to progress the diversification of new products and customer opportunities which will assist operational performance throughout the coming year. However the difficult market conditions are expected to continue in the medium term and the priority is to sustain and expand the business from current levels of turnover and profitability.

The results for the year and the financial position at the year end were considered satisfactory by the directors.

Results and dividends

The consolidated profit and loss account for the year is set out on page 5.

The Directors propose payment of a £200,000 Dividend for the Year.

NOTES TO THE CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2014

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention modified to include the revaluation of freehold land and buildings.

1.2 Compliance with accounting standards

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice), which have been applied consistently (except as otherwise stated).

1.3 Basis of consolidation

The consolidated profit and loss account and balance sheet include the financial statements of the company and its subsidiary undertakings made up to 30 June 2014. The results of subsidiaries sold or acquired are included in the profit and loss account up to, or from the date control passes. Intra-group sales and profits are eliminated fully on consolidation.

1.4 Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable for goods and services net of VAT and trade discounts.

1.5 Goodwill

Acquired goodwill is written off in equal annual instalments over its estimated useful economic life.

1.6 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets other than freehold land are stated at cost or valuation less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost or valuation less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Land and buildings Freehold over 50 years
Land and buildings Leasehold over term of lease
Plant and machinery 15% straight line
Fixtures, fittings & equipment 15% straight line
Motor vehicles 25% straight line

Investment properties are included in the balance sheet at their open market value. Depreciation is provided only on those investment properties which are leasehold and where the unexpired lease term is less than 20 years.

Although this accounting policy is in accordance with the applicable accounting standard, SSAP 19, Accounting for investment properties, it is a departure from the general requirement of the Companies Act 2006 for all tangible assets to be depreciated. In the opinion of the directors compliance with the standard is necessary for the financial statements to give a true and fair view. Depreciation or amortisation is only one of many factors reflected in the annual valuation and the amount of this which might otherwise have been charged cannot be separately identified or quantified.

NOTES TO THE CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (CONTINUED) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2014

1 Accounting policies

(continued)

1.7 Leasing and hire purchase commitments

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts and finance leases are capitalised as tangible assets and depreciated over the shorter of the lease term and their useful lives. Obligations under such agreements are included in creditors net of the finance charge allocated to future periods. The finance element of the rental payment is charged to the profit and loss account so as to produce a constant periodic rate of charge on the net obligation outstanding in each period.

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged against income on a straight line basis over the lease term.

1.8 Investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at cost less provision for diminution in value.

1.9 Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

1.10 Pensions

The Group operates a defined contribution scheme for the benefit of its employees. Contributions payable are charged to the profit and loss account in the year they are payable. No contributions were payable on behalf of the Directors.

1.11 Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is provided in full in respect of taxation deferred by timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes. The deferred tax balance has not been discounted.

1.12 Foreign currency translation

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction. All differences are taken to profit and loss account.

2 Turnover

The total turnover of the group for the year has been derived from its principal activity wholly undertaken in the United Kingdom.
