#### Object

The Object of Age Concern shall be to promote the welfare of the aged in any manner which now is or hereafter may be deemed by law to be charitable within the town of Tiverton and neighbouring parishes.

The Organisation is controlled by trustees (the executive committee) who meet approximately every six weeks. The day to day running of the organisation is in the care of the Chief Officer who is responsible to the trustees. This post is a full-time paid position.

#### **Finances**

The Chief Officer is responsible for the day to day financial organisation of the Trust's funds, reporting to both the Treasurer and the Finance Sub-committee who meet quarterly. The Finance Sub-committee then reports to the Trustees at the next executive meeting. Minutes of the Finance Sub-committee are tabled at this meeting. The Charity banks with the Portman Building Society, Bampton Street, Tiverton, Devon.

#### **Financial Review**

There has been a surplus of income over expenditure of £5,534 as shown on the Statement of Financial Activities.

At the year end, the charity's financial position is satisfactory, with net current assets of £12,928, this being sufficient to meet the charity's obligations.

#### Voluntary Help

The organisation relies on voluntary help for carrying out most of its services. Without this help Age Concern would be unable to provide most of the services which it does at present.

# INDEPENDENT EXAMINERS REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF AGE CONCERN TIVERTON & DISTRICT

We report on the accounts of the trust for the year ended 31 March 2000 which are set out on pages 6 to 12.

## Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

## 1 Accounting Policies

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice - Accounting by Charities. The particular accounting policies are described below.

## i) Historical Costs

Theses accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention.

## ii) Tangible Fixed Assets

The charge for depreciation is calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets by equal annual installments over their expected useful lives. For leasehold property, this is the length of the lease. For furniture and equipment this is estimated to be 3 to 5 years.

#### iii) Grants receivable

Grants receivable are credited to income for the period for which they were given.

#### iv) Donations and Legacies

Donations are credited to income when received.
