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Directors' report for the year ended 31st March 2014

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The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act, submit their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31st March 2014. The trustees have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice ('SORP') 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005 in preparing the annual report and financial statements of the charity.

The charity is a charitable company limited by guarantee, and is governed by its memorandum and articles of association. There are no restrictions on the operations of the charity contained in either the memorandum or the articles of association. The work of the charity is carried out by the Trustees, who meet regularly to consider the running of the charity. Trustees are appointed by invitation of the existing Trustees.

Principal activities

The 2013 summer event was held in south east England, the first day at Knepp Castle looking at their re-wilding project. This is a virtual non-intervention approach to managing the property using traditional breeds of cattle, ponies and deer to manage the vegetation recreating the conditions Europe's Wild Wood experienced. Although this has only been going for a relatively short period of time the habitat developmental structure is very close to what is now believed to be what our Wild Wood looked like. The second day's field trip was to Ashstead Common, a stunning old wood pasture that unfortunately experienced a serious fire about ten years ago. It was very sad to see many ancient trees that were destroyed in the fire but also heartening to see many survivors. Both days were very well attended with much stimulating discussions taking place.

The 2013 autumn event was held at St George's Park (formerly Byrkley Park), the training ground for the English national football team, although sadly the team was not there on the day. The facilities have been built within an ancient landscape containing some excellent ancient and veteran trees. Discussions focused on how best to protect the ancient trees from development and isolation. Again the event was well attended with some challenging questions arising. It allowed the ATF to share its extensive expertise with site managers of this complex site.

The 2014 spring event was held at Maesllych Castle, in Wales, a privately owned property which has been in the family's ownership for centuries. The ATF was allowed access to this normally private estate looking at trees in their extensive garden as well as across the breadth of the estate. Particular issues focused around the agricultural practices that were impacting on many trees showing signs of dieback due to stock damage, intensive grown arable crops grown up to the trees and compaction from heavy farm equipment. Our hosts were advised on how best to manage the land around their internationally important trees.

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In December 2013 the ATF were notified that our Esmee Fairbairn grant application had been successful, a monumental achievement for the ATF. This three year grant was awarded to enable the ATF to employ a Development Officer, which will allow us to achieve even more than has previously been the case. We went through a rigorous recruitment process to ensure we found the ideal candidate. We were fortunate in receiving many strong applications and eventually chose Hannah Solloway, our first regular member of staff. Starting at the end of April 2014, Hannah will be responsible for future fundraising to finance ATF projects and research, carry out the day to day administration of the organisation, manage our website, assist with organising events, and manning stalls at external events and supporting the Chair and Board.

The very successful Leonardo Da Vinci VETree project is now in its final six months of the two year project. Last year the ATF produced the Basic Level training course with our Swedish partners Pro Natura; we then jointly ran the course in Belgium, Sweden and Romania. This year we have recently finished the creation of the Level Two Train the Trainer course and have trialled it in Spain. The final trial course will be in the UK in September 2015.

The Ancient Tree Hunt has now recorded about 138,000 tree records to date. This project continues to be successful and of great value. The data it has collected is now being interrogated to help develop a better understanding of the really significant landscape scale area of internationally important ancient and notable trees.

The Founder President of the Ancient Tree Forum, Ted Green MBE, continues to enlist additional 'Ancient Tree Guardians' in support of core ATF interests, recruiting landowners who care about veteran trees to encourage participation in their conservation. He has fulfilled a key role, travelling throughout the UK and abroad acting as an ambassador for the ATF to inspire and influence owners, managers, academics and state bodies about the value and good stewardship of ancient and veteran trees. Through the medium of the blog 'Ted and Jill's Treemendous Adventures' he is also able to enthuse and inspire an even larger and more diverse audience.

The Ancient Tree Forum website continues to be very effective, although due to internal staff changes within the Woodland Trust, (WT) the website has not been effectively updated. For this reason and also to be slightly more independent of the WT, we have now acquired our own website domain and are in the process of taking over its management. With the dedicated attention of the new Development Officer we will be able to keep a more up to date presence on the website and start populating it with great tree stories and research material.

The last year has been a very important year for the ATF. It has been heavily involved in the VETree European grant scheme together with partners from four other European countries. It was successful in its grant application to a charitable foundation for a significant grant and now has a Development Officer. We launched the long awaited ancient tree management book Ancient and other Veteran Trees; further guidance on management. This is a great success selling almost 700 copies, which has brought in about £17,000 additional funds for the ATF to carry out some of its core work.

Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31st March 2014

1. Accounting policies

1.1. Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities issued in March 2005 and applicable accounting standards.

The company has taken advantage of the exemption in FRS1 from the requirement to produce a cashflow statement because it is a small company.

1.2. Incoming resources

Income is recognised in the period in which the charity is entitled to receipt and the amount can be measured with reasonable certainty. Income is deferred only when the charity has to fulfil conditions before becoming entitled to it or where the donor has specified that the income is to be used in a future period.

1.3. Fund accounting

Funds held by the charity are:

- (i) Unrestricted general funds these are funds which can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.
- (ii) Restricted funds these are funds which can be only used for particular purposes with the objectives of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

1.4. Resources expended

Resources expended are accounted for on an accruals basis and categorised as follows:

- (i) Fundraising expenditure includes costs directly attributable to raising income.
- (ii) Maintenance costs represent costs incurred in the furtherance of the charity
- (iii) Management and administration costs represent the costs attributable to the management of the charity's assets, organisational administration and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

1.5. Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

1.6. Foreign currencies

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange prevailing at the accounting date. Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the date of the transactions. All differences are taken to the Profit and Loss account.
