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TRUSTEES REPORT

FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 31 MAY 2010

The company was incorporated on 12 June 1998 and took over the activities of the "Mental Health Trust", a restricted fund previously dealt with in the financial statements of Charnwood Community Council on 1 October 1998. The following restricted funds previously dealt with in the Charnwood Community Council financial statements were transferred to the company on 1 April 1999 -

Mental Health Befriending Scheme Mental Health Forum Welcome House Charnwood Computer Project

As previously reported, the Trust ceased receiving funding and providing services on 31st December 2008 Since this date, the Board has met on several occasions and held a final Annual General Meeting in December 2009 in order to facilitate the dissolution of the charity and the winding-up of the company

All surplus funds have been disbursed, and 'claw-back' funding has been repaid to Leicestershire County Council

An application to wind-up the company has been made to Companies House Once the company has been taken off their Register, we will then make application to the Charity Commission to remove the Trust from the Register of Charities

All officers, auditors and Directors remain as previously, and are in close contact to ensure that the proper procedures are carried out

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the charity's governing document, applicable law and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005

Structure, governance and management

Charnwood Voluntary Sector Mental Health Trust is a company limited by guarantee and not having any share capital. Its governing document is its Memorandum and Articles of Association

The trust has reviewed all the risks pertaining to its work and has put in place policies and procedures to mitigate them

Objectives and activities

The charity's objects were the promotion, preservation, and safeguarding of mental health and the relief of persons resident in the Borough of Charnwood suffering or having suffered from, or caring for someone suffering from, mental disorder or any other form of mental or emotional distress by

- 1) Advancing public education in matters relating to mental health
- II) Undertaking or assisting in the undertaking of research into any aspects concerning mental health and publishing the useful results of such research
- III) Developing a strategy to provide a broad spectrum of care services, outreach support, employment training opportunities, housing, associated amenities and day activities for the beneficiaries who were experiencing or have experienced profound or long-term mental health problems or dementia, and where appropriate and possible, providing such services
- IV) Promoting good practice in the provision of care services by both statutory and independent agencies throughout Charnwood
- v) Enabling beneficiaries to increase control over their own lives through direct involvement and participation in the management of services including those run by the Charity
- vi.) Promoting and organising co-operation with all agencies in planning, developing, and implementing Mental Health strategy

Disclosure of information to auditors

1 Accounting policies

1 1 Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention

On 31 December 2008 the Charity ceased to operate. All employees were transferred to Age Concern along with the fixtures & fittings. The balances on the restricted funds were either repaid to the donors or transferred to Age Concern.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005 and the Companies Act 2006

1.2 Incoming resources

Grants receivable are credited to the SOFA in the year to which they relate with any unexpended balances being shown in liabilities (amounts falling due within one year)

13 Resources expended

Expenditure is allocated on the SOFA between restricted funds and unrestricted funds, and is further analysed between direct charitable expenditure and governance costs

1 4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows.

1 5 Accumulated funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes

Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the trustees for particular purposes. The purposes and uses of the designated funds are set out in the notes to the accounts

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions by donors as to how they may be used. The purposes and uses of the restricted funds are set out in the notes to the accounts.

1 6 Contribution to pension funds

The pension costs charged in the accounts represent the contributions payable by the trust during the period in accordance with SSAP 24

1.7 Value Added Tax

The Charity is not required to register for VAT. All income and expenses include VAT where applicable
