The directors present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2022 .

Statement of Directors' Responsibilities

The directors are responsible for preparing the Directors' Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the directors have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). Under company law the directors must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the surplus or deficit of the company for that period. In preparing the financial statements the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgments and accounting estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

FPC is a private not-for-profit company limited by guarantee, registered in England and Wales under registration number 03610301 and is governed by its Articles.

FPC is the professional home for graduates of WPF Therapy. Run by our members, we represent the interests of our members. For graduates and trainees, we help foster their sense of belonging and their professional development.

Principal Activity

The principal activities of the company in the year under review were to promote education and undertake training for those involved in psychotherapy and counselling, and to support the education of the general public as to the use and value of counselling and psychotherapy within the community.

Not-for-Profit Status

Clause 5 of the Articles requires that the income and property of the company shall be applied solely towards the promotion of the objects of the Company as set forth in the Articles, and that none of the income or property of the Company may be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of a dividend bonus or otherwise by way of profit to any member of the Company and that no director may be employed by, or receive any remuneration from, or receive any other financial benefit, from the Company, unless the payment is permitted by Articles 13 to 17.

Review of Business

Total expenditure increased slightly from £108,663 in 2020/21 to £117,793 in 2021/22. Total income increased from £136,116 in 2020/21 to £141,870 in 2021/22. The resulting surplus of £24,077 takes reserves above the maximum level set by the Board.

A further 11 lapsed professional members re-joined during the year (73 have now re-joined over the last three years), taking professional membership to 480, an increase of 2%. Total membership (including retired and trainee members) increased from 588 in 2020/21 to 614 in 2021/22.

An average of 577 members subscribed to BJP during 2021/22. The cost of an individual subscription to BJP is £70 per year. The total value of this benefit is £40,390.

451 members subscribed to PEP-Web in 2021/22. The annual cost of an individual subscription to PEP-Web is \$145, approximately £121. The total value of this benefit is £54,571.

128 members have an IJP subscription. The full annual cost of an individual subscription to IJP for 2022 is £200. The discounted price is £75 so the discount is worth £125. The total value of this benefit is £16,000.

187 CPD events were held during 2021/22 delivering 2,719 hours of CPD (up from 169 events delivering 2,575 hours in 2020/21). At an average value of £10 per CPD hour this generates a value of £27,190.

UKCP charges their Direct Members £250 for their 5-yearly reaccreditation to the UKCP Register. We provide this service to our UKCP registrants at no additional cost. 35 members completed their reaccreditation in 2021/22. The total value of this benefit is £8,750.

UKCP gives their individual members who register through an organisation an annual discount of £30 (compared to the fee for Direct Membership). During 2021/22, 280 FPC members were registered with UKCP generating a value of £8,400.

The total of all tangible benefits for the 2021/22 membership year is £155,301. Total fees paid by members were £141,858.

In 2021/22 we have achieved a cost/benefit ratio of 109% (2020/21: 98%), exceeding our target by 9%.

The work of FPC would not be possible without the significant voluntary commitment of many members participating in committees and organising events. At the 2022 AGM, 3 members were awarded Fellowship of FPC in recognition of their contribution to FPC.

The Board met 4 times during the year. The Ethics Committee continued to meet regularly through the year. The Trainee Liaison Committee continued their good work in supporting trainees as they approach graduation.

Future Developments

Professional Membership fees for 2022/23 have been held at the same level as in 2021/22. Membership fees in some other categories have been reduced. For the 2022/23 membership year, all tangible benefits will continue. The continuing expansion of our CPD events programme is expected to generate a total of at least 3,000 CPD hours. Further opportunities to expand the range of benefits will be explored. The Board will continue to focus on enhancing the value of member benefits with a target of continuing to achieve a cost/benefit ratio of at least 100% in 2022/23.

The Board are conducting a major Strategic Review in 2022. The first for 10 years. The findings from the review will inform the development of the organisation for the coming years.

Reserves

The Directors believe that the company should hold freely available financial reserves (the "Emergency Operating Reserve" - EOR) because it has no endowment funding and is entirely dependent for income upon membership fees, which is inevitably subject to fluctuation, and it requires protection against, and the ability to continue operating despite, catastrophic or lesser, but damaging, events. The Directors believe that the minimum level of the EOR should be the equivalent of three months' operating costs, and that the maximum level of the EOR should be the equivalent of six months' operating costs, calculated and reviewed annually. At 30 June 2022 the level of all reserves stood at £74,826 (30 June 2021: £50,749), which is above the required EOR range for the current year. The Directors have set a budget for 2021/22 that will maintain the EOR within the agreed levels and will continue to do so over the coming years. The Directors believe that the EOR should be maintained at the desired level consistent with the company's overall financial position and its need to maintain and develop its activities.

Future Developments - continued

Surplus Reserves, in addition to the EOR, are held in designated funds for future investment to develop new and enhanced services. There is currently £12,326 held in designated funds.

Internal Financial Control

The company has in place systems of internal control. They are designed to provide reasonable, but not absolute, assurance against material misstatement or loss. They include:

- A rolling plan and an annual budget and operational plan approved by the Directors;
- A number of matters are specifically reserved for the Directors' approval;
- There is a clear organisational structure with appropriate lines of reporting;
- Regular consideration by the Directors of financial results, variance from budgets, non-financial performance indicators and benchmarking reviews;
- The development of policy documents covering major strategic and operational activities reviewed with appropriate regularity and consultation; and
- The delegation by the Directors to the Company Secretary of the identification and management of risks.

Risk Management

The Directors conduct an annual review of the risks to which the company is exposed and systems are established to monitor and mitigate those risks.

At the 2022 review the Directors identified 28 low risks, no medium risks and no high risks. For all risks, control procedures are in place.

Structure of governance

Up to eight Directors are elected by the members at the Annual General Meeting, and up to four Directors are appointed by the Board, for periods of three years. Vacancies for Elected Directors may be filled by co-option by the Board for the period until the next Annual General Meeting. The Board appoints the Chair, Vice-Chair and any other Officers.

1. Accounting Policies

1.1. Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the FRS 102 Section 1A Small Entities - The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland and the Companies Act 2006.

1.2. Turnover

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, net of discounts and value added taxes. Turnover includes revenue earned from the sale of goods and from the rendering of services. Turnover is reduced for estimated customer returns, rebates and other similar allowances.

Rendering of services

Turnover from the rendering of services is recognised by reference to the stage of completion of the contract. The stage of completion of a contract is measured by comparing the costs incurred for work performed to date to the total estimated contract costs. Turnover is only recognised to the extent of recoverable expenses when the outcome of a contract cannot be estimated reliably.

1.3. Tangible Fixed Assets and Depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. The company only capitalises fixed assets with a cost of more than £1,000. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of the fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases:

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1.4. Taxation

Income tax expense represents the sum of the tax currently payable and deferred tax.

The tax currently payable is based on taxable surplus for the year. Taxable surplus differs from surplus as reported in the statement of comprehensive income because of items of income or expense that are taxable or deductible in other years and items that are never taxable or deductible. The company's liability for current tax is calculated using tax rates that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period.

Deferred tax is recognised on timing differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities in the financial statements and the corresponding tax bases used in the computation of taxable surplus. Deferred tax liabilities are generally recognised for all taxable timing differences. Deferred tax assets are generally recognised for all deductible temporary differences to the extent that it is probable that taxable surplus will be available against which those deductible timing differences can be utilised. The carrying amount of deferred tax assets is reviewed at the end of each reporting period and reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that sufficient taxable surplus will be available to allow all or part of the asset to be recovered.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the period in which the liability is settled or the asset realised, based on tax rates (and tax laws) that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period. Deferred tax liabilities are presented within provisions for liabilities and deferred tax assets within debtors. The measurement of deferred tax liabilities and assets reflect the tax consequences that would follow from the manner in which the Company expects, at the end of the reporting period, to recover or settle the carrying amount of its assets and liabilities.

Current or deferred tax for the year is recognised in surplus or deficit, except when they related to items that are recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity, in which case, the current and deferred tax is also recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity respectively.
