Directors' report for the period ended 31 December 2012

The directors present their report and the audited financial statements for Xchanging UK Limited, for the period ended 31 December 2012

Principal activities

The company acts as a management company for its ultimate parent undertaking, Xchanging plc and its subsidiaries ('the Xchanging plc group') The services provided comprise implementation, software development, financing support, general management and support functions. In return for the provision of these services the company receives royalties and performance fees, interest, as well as recharging the costs of directly attributable time and resources.

Review of business and future developments

The company results are set out in the profit and loss account on page 8

The company has changed its accounting reference date from 31 August to 31 December as part of various restructuring arrangements being undertaken by the Xchanging plc group

The company continued to act as a management company for the Xchanging plc group Both the level of business of the company and the period end position are in line with expectations

During the period the company has incurred the following exceptional items,

- £18,288,000 charge relating to impairment of an intercompany loan
- £616,000 relating to impairment of a fixed asset investment
- £2,377,000 charge in respect of provisions for the workers compensation liabilities of Cambridge Integrated Services Group Inc for claims that were open prior to the sale of the business assets in 2011. The provisions recognised are to cover periodic payments under the scheme and a letter of credit issued to the carrying agent.
- £494,000 charge relating to restructuring activities
- £236,000 charge for the renegotiation of the group's external financing facilities

In the 8 months to 31 August 2011, the company recorded exceptional operating costs of £2,925,000 relating to restructuring activities, exceptional finance costs of £1,770,000 relating to refinancing of the group's debt facility, and an exceptional impairment of a fixed asset investment of £3,559,000

Key performance indicators

The directors of Xchanging UK Limited manage the operations of the entity on a cost centre basis. For this reason, the company's directors believe that analysis using key performance indicators for the company is not necessary or appropriate for an understanding of the development, performance or position of the business of Xchanging UK Limited.

Directors' report for the period ended 31 December 2012 (continued)

Financial risk management

The financial risk management objectives and policies of the company are the same as for the Xchanging plc group. The company complies with the Xchanging plc group financial risk management policies as the directors consider these to be appropriate. These are set out below.

The group is exposed to a variety of financial risks which are reviewed on a regular basis in order to limit the adverse effects on the financial performance of the group

(i) Foreign exchange risk

As part of the Xchanging plc group there are overseas operations in Continental Europe, Australia, India and the United States of America. The group also holds equity investments in Europe. The group is exposed to foreign exchange rate risks primarily with respect to the Euro, Australian dollar, United States Dollar and Indian Rupee.

(ii) Interest rate cash flow risk

The group has interest bearing liabilities. The group has a policy of maintaining debt at a floating rate which gives rise to risk of future interest cash flows. The directors will revisit the appropriateness of this policy should the group's operations change in size or nature.

(III) Credit risk

The group has a concentration of credit risk with respect to trade receivables due to the nature and structure of the enterprise partnerships, however many of the Xchanging plc group entities are now 100% owned hence minimising the credit risk Credit risk assessments are performed as the Xchanging plc group signs new enterprise partnership and new customer contracts

(iv) Price risk

The group has equity securities price risk as it holds listed equity investments. This risk is reviewed on a regular basis to assess the appropriateness of the investments and to limit the adverse effects on the financial performance of the group.

(v) Liquidity risk

The group actively maintains a mixture of long-term and short-term debt finance that is designed to ensure the Xchanging plc group has sufficient available funds for operations and planned expansions

The principal risks facing Xchanging UK Limited are foreign exchange risk, credit risk and price risk but this is limited as reflected by the above comments

Results and dividends

The group's loss for the period was £19,403,000 (2011 loss £8,190,000) No dividends have been paid or proposed

Going concern

Not withstanding the group's net current liability position at the period end, given the importance of Xchanging UK Limited to the Xchanging plc group, the directors have prepared the financial statements on a going concern basis as they have obtained confirmation of the support of the ultimate parent company, Xchanging plc

Research and development

The company incurs development costs in the design and implementation of processes and systems that substantially improve those already installed across the Xchanging plc group. The improvement of processes and systems covers two phases re-alignment and streamlining. Re-alignment activities include business process mapping, staff restructuring and process reorganization. Streamlining activities include management structuring, IT and site consolidation and supplier rationalization.

Employment policies

The group is committed to employment policies, which follow best practice, based on equal opportunities for all employees, irrespective of sex, race, colour, disability, marital status, age or religion. The group is also committed to providing employees with information on matters of concern to them on a regular basis, so that the views of employees can be taken into account when making decisions that are likely to affect their interests.

Employees are kept well informed of performance and objectives of the group through regular email communications and periodic briefings by senior management

Disabled persons

It is the policy of the group to offer appropriate training and career development to disabled persons as far as possible that are identical to other employees, in line with best practice. In the event of a member of staff becoming disabled every effort is made by the group to continue employment and arrange appropriate retraining and offer opportunities for promotion.

Creditor payment policy

The company aims to pay suppliers in accordance with the suppliers' contract terms. The company had an average of 39 days purchases outstanding in trade creditors as at 31 December 2012 (8 months to 31 August 2011, 28 days).

Notes to the financial statements for the period ended 31 December 2012

1 Principal accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and applicable Accounting Standards in the United Kingdom. A summary of the more important accounting policies, which, unless otherwise stated, have been applied consistently with the prior year, is set out below.

Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention

Going concern

The directors believe that preparing the financial statements on the going concern basis is appropriate based on projections for the foreseeable future. Xchanging plc will continue to provide support while the company has a net current liability position.

Cash flow statement and non-consolidation of subsidiary undertakings

The company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Xchanging plc and is included in the consolidated financial statements of Xchanging plc, which are publicly available. Consequently, the company has taken advantage of the exemption from preparing a cash flow statement under the terms of Financial Reporting Standard 1 (revised 1996) and has also taken advantage of the exemption from preparing consolidated financial statements under the terms of s400 of the Companies Act 2006.

Revenue

Revenue, which is stated exclusive of value added tax, is recognised only when it is probable that the economic benefits associated with a transaction will flow to the company. Revenue represents royalties and performance fees from the Xchanging plc group, in the United Kingdom and Europe Royalty income is calculated on a turnover based formula and has been accounted for on an accruals basis over the period in which the royalties fall due

Exceptional Items

Exceptional items are events or transactions that fall outside the ordinary activities of the Company, and which by virtue of their size or incidence, have been separately disclosed in order to improve a reader's understanding of the financial statements. These include impairment losses and other one-off events or transactions.

Pre-contract costs

Pre-contract costs comprise legal and other professional expenses and other directly attributable staff costs incurred in order to obtain a relevant contract

Costs that are directly attributable to a contract are capitalised when it is virtually certain that the contract will be awarded and the contract will result in future net cash inflows with a present value no less than all amounts recognised as an asset. These pre-contract costs are included within debtors and are amortised over the life of the contract, starting from the date when the contract commences.

1 Principal accounting policies (continued)

Development costs

Development costs are stated at cost less a provision for amortisation and any provision for impairment

Costs incurred during the development period of new contracts, where there is a clearly defined project which includes an appreciable element of innovation including the costs of process and system designs that substantially improve those processes and systems already installed in the enterprise partnerships and where the related expenditure is clearly identifiable and is expected to be exceeded by future economic benefits, are treated as development costs. These costs are capitalised and amortised over the life of the contract. Costs that are capitalised comprise directly attributable incremental costs incurred during implementation, including wages and salaries of staff employed solely for the purpose of implementing new contracts, and third party costs.

Development costs do not include restructuring costs, (including redundancy, early termination penalties and such like) or allocation of central overheads, which are all expensed to the profit and loss account as they are incurred

Impairment reviews are performed annually to ensure the present value of estimated future revenue streams from the associated contracts exceeds the capitalised costs

Finance costs

Finance costs are charged to the income statement using the effective interest rate method

Intangible fixed assets

Intangible assets, including acquired software licenses, are recorded at cost. Intangible assets are amortised on a straight-line basis over the useful life of the assets, which normally does not exceed five years. Impairment reviews are performed annually

Tangible fixed assets

The cost of tangible fixed assets is their purchase cost, together with any incidental costs of acquisition

Software development costs are capitalised where they meet the requirement for recognition under Financial Reporting Standard 10 Where the criteria for capitalisation are not met, software development expenditure is expensed as incurred

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of tangible fixed assets, less their estimated residual values, on a straight-line basis over the expected useful economic lives of the assets concerned. The principal annual rates used for this purpose are

Computer equipment	33%
Fixtures & fittings	25%
Software development	20%
Leasehold improvements	20%

Fixed asset investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at cost less any provision for impairment. Impairment reviews are conducted at the end of the first full year following acquisition and thereafter where indicators of impairment are present.

1 Principal accounting policies (continued)

Borrowings

An exchange or modification of a debt instrument should be accounted for as an extinguishment where there are "substantially different terms" attached to the debt instrument. Management assess whether the terms of the new or modified instrument are substantially different by considering both quantitative and qualitative factors. In accounting for an extinguishment, the new or modified debt instrument is initially recorded at net proceeds, being the fair value of the debt the company has been released from. Any gain or loss, being the difference between the net proceeds and the previous carrying amount, arising on extinguishment is recognised as an exceptional finance cost in the profit and loss account in the period in which the extinguishment arises. The gain or loss on extinguishment would also include any costs and fees payable to third parties in relation to the exchange or modification.

Foreign currencies

Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities are translated at the rates of exchange ruling on the balance sheet date and any differences arising are taken to the profit and loss account.

Operating leases

Rental costs under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight-line basis over the lease term

Pensions

The costs of providing defined contribution pensions and related benefits are charged to the profit and loss account as incurred

Share based incentives

In accordance with FRS 20, the fair value of equity-settled shared-based payments to employees is determined at the date of the grant and is expensed on a straight line basis over the vesting period based on the group's estimate of shares or options that will eventually vest. In the case of options granted, fair value is measured by a Black-Scholes pricing model. Further information on the Group's share schemes are disclosed in the Xchanging plc Annual Report (available from http://www.xchanging.com).

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more, or a right to pay less, tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date. However, deferred tax assets are regarded as recoverable and therefore recognised, only when, on the basis of all available evidence, the directors consider that it is more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax is measured on a non-discounted basis at the rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date

1 Principal accounting policies (continued)

Related party transactions

The company has taken advantage of the exemption available in Financial Reporting Standard 8 not to disclose transactions with entities that are wholly owned subsidiaries of the Xchanging plc group. All other related party transactions are disclosed in note 23. Xchanging UK Limited is itself a wholly owned subsidiary of the Xchanging plc group.

Factors that may affect future tax charges

The Finance Act 2012, which was substantially enacted on 5 July 2012, includes legislation reducing the main rate of corporation tax from 25% to 24% from 1 April 2012 and to 23% from 1 April 2013. The change from 25% to 23% has been reflected in the closing deferred tax balances included in these financial statements.

Proposed further reductions of the main rate of corporation tax to 21% by 1 April 2014 and to 20% by 1 April 2015 are expected to be enacted separately. This change had not been substantially enacted at the balance sheet date and therefore is not included in these financial statements.
