IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Hubert Guy Holdings Ltd be wound up by this court under the provisions of the Insolvency Act 1986.
- 2. Mr. Woodhead shall pay the costs of the Petitioner of the petition incurred after 16th February 2000 on an indemnity basis such costs to be subject to detailed assessment, if not agreed, provided that his liability incurred while he was an assisted party shall not exceed the amount which, pursuant to section 17 of the Legal Aid Act 1988, it may be reasonable for him to pay and that determination of such amount be postponed.
- 3. The costs of the Petitioner of the petition incurred up to an including the 16th February 2000 be paid out of the assets of the Company and that the costs incurred after the 16th February 2000 be paid out of the assets of the Company to the extent that they are not recovered from Mr. Woodhead pursuant to 2. above.
