#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

#### Governing document

The Ethelburga Early Years Centre is a company limited by guarantee. The charity's governing document is its Memorandum and Articles of Association.

#### Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

Directors and Trustees are elected at our Annual General Meeting by members of the Centre.

#### Organisational structure

Ethelburga Early Years Centre functions as an independent charitable entity, but is also a member of the Wandsworth Primary Play Association. Wandsworth Primary Play Association provides some grant funding, as well as certain administrative services.

### Related parties

Ethelburga Early Years Centre has received a loan from Patmore Children's Centre, a charity in which K Bronock is a trustee, of £1,000.

#### Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

The trustees have reviewed the major risks to which the charity is exposed and have ensured that systems are in place to mitigate those risks. These systems are periodically reviewed to ensure they still meet the needs of the charity.

#### REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2009

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

#### Objectives and aims

The primary aims of the charity, as defined by the Memorandum and Articles of Association are:

To advance the education of all children below the age of eleven years by:

- (1) providing safe and satisfying group play in which parents have the right to take part and
- (2) encouraging other charitable activities through which parents may help the children.

In setting our objectives and planning our activities our Governors have given careful consideration to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit and in particular to its supplementary public benefit guidance on advancing education.

#### Significant activities

Ethelburga Early Years Centre believes our overall objectives were achieved during the year, with parents becoming more involved with the company.

#### Improvements

During the year the old sheds were revamped and the old doors were replaced. In addition a sink was removed to make room for a new changing mat.

#### Maintenance

We had a problem with mice but this seems to be under control at the moment.

#### ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

#### Charitable activities

This year we have carried out fund-raising events, which have included a raffle which raised £150. The introduction of parents contributing each month to fundraising has been difficult with only a small number of parents having contributed.

Further more we were awarded a PVI grant for equipment of £20636 which has been put to use buying new equipment. We have had positive feedback from parents.

The baby unit is full and the main room numbers are increasing at a steady pace with half it's capacity full, however in September babies will be moving over.

#### Internal and external factors

The manager had sick leave for three months due to an operation in the summer 2008 but has made a full recovery.

We have had ongoing agency staff this year and now have a childcare advisor. In June 2009 we will be losing a level three member of staff.

#### FINANCIAL REVIEW

# Reserves policy

The Directors have established a policy whereby the unrestricted funds not committed or invested in tangible fixed assets ('the free reserves') held by the charity should be 6 months of the staff salaries, which equates to approximately £75,000 in general funds. At this level, the Directors feel that they would be able to continue the current activities of the charity in the event of a significant drop in financial income. It would obviously be necessary to consider how the funding would be replaced or activities changed. At present, the free reserves do not reach this target level and the Directors are considering ways in which additional unrestricted funds will be raised.

#### Principal funding sources

The principal funding source of the charity is from parental fees.

#### **FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS**

Last year we wanted to get better security to the building by way of video entry system, however unfortunately we were unable to. In October 2009 we will be applying for the PVI grant again and hope to achieve this goal.

We are in the process of changing our advertising leaflets and attaching our logo to headed paper.

We also have been advertising in the Earlsfield practise booklet that goes to the surgeries and in the yellow pages.

# INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF ETHELBURGA EARLY YEARS CENTRE

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 March 2009 set out on pages five to nine.

#### Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees (who are also the directors for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year (under Section 43(2) of the Charities Act 1993 (the 1993 Act)) and that an independent examination is required.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2009

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standards for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007), the Companies Act 1985 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

#### Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

#### Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery etc

- 33% on cost

#### Tavation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
