REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2015

The directors present their report with the financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 March 2015.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY AND BUSINESS REVIEW

The principal activity of the company in the year under review continues to be that of the stewardship of a closed landfill site and associated opportunities for income generation.

The company recognised a loss of £115,481 (2014 - £151,275) during the year due to the costs of site monitoring exceeding the level of gas royalties received and the stewardship fee provided to the company from Rhondda Cynon Taf County Borough Council (as previously agreed between the parties).

The company has agreed an increased level of stewardship fee with Rhondda Cynon Taf County Borough Council from 1st April 2015 which will mitigate losses going forward. Opportunities for future income generating activities will continue to be explored.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2015

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis, under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

Going concern

The company recognised a loss of £115,481 (2014 – £151,275 loss) during the year following a reduction in annual stewardship fee from its ultimate parent undertaking, Rhondda Cynon Taf County Borough Council (RCTCBC) of £200,000. As the Nant-y-Gwyddon landfill site is now closed, the company meets its ongoing obligations from existing resources and the reduced stewardship fee.

The company has agreed an increased level of stewardship fee with Rhondda Cynon Taf County Borough Council from 1st April 2015 which will mitigate losses going forward. Opportunities for future income generating activities will continue to be explored.

The directors have assessed the company's current and forecast financial position in light of the factors noted above and has concluded that the company has sufficient resources to meet its financial obligations as they fall due for at least 12 months from the date of signing these financial statements. Consequently, the directors have prepared the financial statements on a going concern basis.

Turnover and revenue recognition

Turnover represents net invoiced sales of services for a stewardship fee, excluding value added tax. Revenue is recognised evenly over the period to which it relates.

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost, net of depreciation and any provision for impairment. Depreciation is provided at the following annual rate in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery

Straight line over 10 years

Taxation

Current tax, including UK corporation tax and foreign tax, is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date. Timing differences are differences between the Group's taxable profits and its results as stated in the financial statements that arise from the inclusion of gains and losses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in the financial statements.

A net deferred tax asset is regarded as recoverable and therefore recognised only to the extent that, on the basis of all available evidence, it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.
