1 PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A summary of the principal accounting policies of the company, all of which have been applied consistently throughout the period, is set out below.

Accounting convention

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

In accordance with the provisions of Financial Reporting Standard (FRS) 1 (Revised), a cash flow statement has not been prepared as the company is a wholly-owned subsidiary of a body incorporated in the European Union. A consolidated cash flow statement will be included in the accounts of CWG.

Investments in subsidiary undertakings

Investments in subsidiary undertakings are stated in the company's balance sheet at cost less any provision for impairment.

2 ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES

None of the directors received any emoluments in respect of their services to the company during the period.

No staff were employed by the company other than the directors.

Auditors' remuneration has been borne by another group undertaking.

3 TAXATION

No charge for taxation has been made since the company recorded neither a profit nor loss for the period. There is no unprovided deferred taxation. The group has substantial tax losses which may impact on any future tax charge of the company.
