Notes to the financial statements

Draig Technology Ltd (the "Company") is a private company limited by shares registered, incorporated and domiciled in England and Wales. The registered office and principal place of business is: Brisance House, Euxton Lane, Euxton, Chorley, Lancashire, PR7 6AQ.

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1. Accounting policies

These financial statements were prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 *The Financial Reporting Standard* applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland including the adoption of the amendments issued in December 2017 ("FRS 102") and in accordance with Companies Act 2006 as applicable to companies subject to the small companies regime and under the historical cost convention. The accounting policies have been applied consistently. The presentation currency of these financial statements is sterling. All amounts in the financial statements have been rounded to the nearest £1.

The accounting policies set out below have, unless otherwise stated, been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements.

Going Concern

The directors believe that the use of the going concern basis of accounting is appropriate. The directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foresecable future. Thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

Basic financial instruments

Trade and other debtors / creditors

Trade and other debtors are recognised initially at transaction price less attributable transaction costs. Trade and other creditors are recognised initially at transaction price plus attributable transaction costs. Subsequent to initial recognition they are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method. less any impairment losses in the case of trade debtors. If the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, for example if payment is deferred beyond normal business terms, then it is measured at the present value of future payments discounted at a market rate of instrument for a similar debt instrument.

2. Employees

The average monthly number of employees employed by the company during the year was nil (2019; nil)

3. Directors' remuneration

The Directors remuneration in relation to their services to the Utiligroup Group as a whole were borne by ESG Global (Energy) Limited (formerly Utilisoft Limited), a fellow group undertaking and no other recharge was made. The directors of the company are also directors of the holding company and fellow subsidiaries. The directors do not believe that it is practicable to apportion this amount between their services as directors of the company and their services as directors of the holding and fellow subsidiary companies.
