STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE and MANAGEMENT

West Lancashire Community Hospice Association is a Company limited by guarantee, constituted under The Companies Acts 1985 and 1989, and is a registered Charity

Training of any new Trustees will be in accordance with Charity Commission recommendations contained in publications CC3 and CC3a

The Board of Trustees normally meets three monthly and at the meetings the Trustees make decisions regarding the running and future of the Charity Decisions made are minuted and minutes circulated to the Trustees including those in absentia Day to day running of the Charity is delegated to the Chairman and Treasurer

The Company wholly owns WLC Hospice (Services) Ltd, which Company runs two Charity Shops, a third, in Ormskirk, having closed in May 2006. All profits from the company are paid to the Association

The Trustees have considered the risks associated with the running of the Charity and have taken steps to minimise these risks through the provision of insurances relevant to the activities of the Charity The following lists the types of insurance currently in force.

Commercial Insurances
Public Liability

Employers Liability Trustees Indemnity

Banking and custody controls are in line with the recommendations of Charities Commission publication CC8 Appropriate dual control and dual signing controls are in place. The accounting software is protected by a password known only to the Treasurer and bookkeeper and back up accounting, software packages etc are kept off site

Day to day maintenance of the accounts is carried out on the Charity's computer at the home of the bookkeeper, back up copies being maintained on the Treasurer's home computer. In this way the Treasurer is able to oversee the administration of the accounting procedures.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The mission of the West Lancashire Community Hospice Association (WLCHA) is "To develop and provide or fund facilities in West Lancashire which will provide comprehensive palliative day care for those who develop cancer or other advanced illness, and which will serve the needs of the West Lancashire area and the wider community in the neighbouring district", a summary of the objectives set out in the Memorandum of Association

A Charity was established in June 1993 by a group of professionals from business, health, council, voluntary and other backgrounds to raise funds to provide a dedicated day centre to fulfil the mission statement of the Charity. This was superseded by the present Charity, with Limited Liability Company status in 1999.

The Trustees have previously pursued several possible sites for a day centre, but for a variety of reasons, these have not previously come to fruition, to the great disappointment of all concerned.

ACHIEVEMENTS and PERFORMANCE

Fund Raising

The Charity benefits from donations, profits on the shops and interest on deposits

Skelmersdale's Sandy Lane and Digmoor shops, under the umbrella of WLC Hospice (Services) Ltd, wholly owned by WLCHA, continue to make a steady contribution to funds despite increasing rents paid to the local council. The shops contributed over £11,857 to the Charity funds during the year, Donations were £1,020 and interest received was £8,058. A group of staff and customers from the Digmoor shop carried out a sponsored walk from Digmoor to Queenscourt, raising £800, a tremendous effort on a rainy day. The dedication of the many volunteers who man the shops week in week out is outstanding and we thank them most sincerely for their efforts. Many thanks also to everyone who has contributed to the Charity in any way

Service

We have been providing funding to Queenscourt Hospice for the past four years for part of the cost of day care at Queenscourt for West Lancashire patients, and likewise to the Primary Care Trust for three years towards the costs of a carers service provided by Marie Curie Cancer Care.

The work at Queenscourt and with the carer's service continues (£10,000 and £8,437 respectively)

However, our long term aim of providing a day care centre has proved impossible to bring to fruition. We had agreed with West Lancs PCT that when we had planning permission for a day care centre they would enter in to a formal support agreement. Planning permission was applied for in July 2006 for a development at Alty's Farm, part of Lord Derby's portfolio of land, but delays at County and District Council levels over 3 trees delayed planning submission until February 2007. In spite of a positive recommendation the Planning Committee failed to decide, calling for further changes. This happened again in April in spite of the requested changes being made.

Then in May, the new Central Lancashire PCT, which came into being at the end of 2006, decided that the proposed day care centre was not a project which they could support. Although we had been working towards this with a variety of NHS bodies for many years, the trustees felt there was no alternative but to withdraw from the proposal. Our thanks go to those who helped in what became a futile exercise.

In the meantime, to some extent linked to the Lord Darzi report, things have moved on, and "Hospice at Home" is now the preferred method of supporting those with advanced progressive and terminal disease who wish to spend their final days at home rather than in a hospital or hospice Queenscourt Hospice has been developing such a service over the past two years and WLCHA has been closely involved in this. The service, which covers West Lancashire and Sefton, was launched in February 2009 and WLCHA is funding the whole of the cost of the West Lancashire part of the service £25,000 in set up costs was paid to Queenscourt in 2008 and the total expenditure for 2009 was £143,593. The purchase of syringe drivers costing £4,050 for use in nursing homes and managed by Queenscourt has been funded by the Association

The service has three facets, Home Support, Crisis Intervention and Accompanied Transfer Home The Trustees are delighted to be able to support this venture and are excited that after all the set backs, they are finally able to provide funding for what is proving to be a very worthwhile service

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The Charity is in a strong financial position, with reserves of £1,190,636. The main funds in hand are with CafBank, part of the Charities Aid Foundation. Due to the recession and problems in the banking industry, the rate of interest paid has been decimated. No investments which would be at any risk have been considered. NO FUNDS ARE HELD AS CUSTODIAN TRUSTEE ON BEHALF OF OTHERS.

FIXED ASSETS

The Fixed Assets of the Charity, and any major changes therein during the year, are recorded in the notes to the accounts
