# TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 30 NOVEMBER 2000

The trustees present their report and accounts for the period ended 30 November 2000.

#### Objects of the charity

The Trust is a company limited by guarantee. The directors have obtained registered charity status. The objects of the Trust are to pursue any charitable purpose for the benefit of people who live and work in Caterham Barracks and Caterham and its environs, and in particular to provide recreation and leisure facilities in the interest of social welfare, the advancement of education, and the preservation and enhancement of the environment.

In carrying out its objects, the Trust seeks to ensure equality of opportunities for all sections of the community, in its own affairs and in society generally.

The affairs and the objects of the Trust are managed by the Board of Trustees. The Board is made up as follows:

Not more than 3 User Members

Not more than 1 Youth Member

Not more than 1 Village Resident Member

Not more than 1 Village Business Member

Not more than 1 Caterham Member

Not more than 1 nominated by Tandridge District Council

Not more than 4 individuals

and the Board members are set out below.

The Board may delegate any of its powers to Sub-committees and the Board has appointed a Chief Executive, R Moran, to manage the day to day affairs of the Trust.

The income and property of the Trust can only be applied to the promotion of its objects set out above, and no grants are permitted to be paid out to members, except for reasonable services rendered.

#### **Review of activities**

The Trust was set up on 29 November 1999, in accordance with the agreement dated 22 November 1999 between Tandridge District Council and Linden Homes South East Limited. Also in accordance with that agreement Phase One and part of Phase Two were completed by Linden Homes. During the accounting period the Trustees' activities are in line with that agreement and expectations.

# TRUSTEES' REPORT (CONTINUED) FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 30 NOVEMBER 2000

None of the trustees has any beneficial interest in the company. All of the trustees are members of the company and guarantee to contribute £1 in the event of a winding up.

#### Review of financial position

As shown in the financial statements, the Trust received £104399 in respect of unretircted funds and £16650 in respect of restricted funds.

£50,000 of this sum was on account of the Enterprise Centre and £31250 in respect of the Permanent Endowment. £23,149 was in respect of rent received for the NAAFI, the Arts and Recreation Centre and the Gym.

The £16650 received for the restricted fund was in respect of Open Market Houses completed and is for the management of the Community Trust facilities and not capital expenditure.

#### Asset cover for funds

Note 6 sets out an analysis of the assets attributable to the various funds and a description of the trusts. These assets are sufficient to meet the charity's obligations on a fund by fund basis.

#### **Auditors**

In accordance with section 385 of the Companies Act 1985, a resolution proposing that Roger Lugg & Co be reappointed as auditors of the company will be put to the Annual General Meeting.

#### STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES

#### Basis of opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the accounts. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the trustees in the preparation of the accounts, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the charitable company's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance as to whether the accounts are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the accounts.

#### Opinion

In our opinion the accounts give a true and fair view of the charitable company's state of affairs as at 30 November 2000 and of its incoming resources and application of resources, including its income and expenditure, in the period then ended and have been properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985.
