1. Accounting Policies

a) Basis of financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis, under the historical cost convention, the accounting policies set out below and in accordance with the Companies Act 1985 and applicable accounting standards. The financial year represents the 52 weeks ended Saturday 27 March 2004 (prior year the 52 weeks ended Saturday 29 March 2003).

b) Other operating income

Other operating income consists of rental income receivable under an assigned head lease.

c) Cash flow and related party disclosures

The Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of the ultimate holding company J Sainsbury plc and is included in the consolidated financial statements of J Sainsbury plc, which are publicly available. Consequently, advantage has been taken of the exemption from preparing a cash flow statement under the terms of FRS 1 (revised 1996). Also the exemption under the terms of FRS 8, has been taken from disclosing related party transactions (but not balances) with entities that are part of the J Sainsbury plc Group or investees in the J Sainsbury plc Group.

2. Profit on ordinary activities before interest

Any expenses incurred, including auditors' remuneration, have been borne by the ultimate parent undertaking, J Sainsbury plc or other Group undertakings.

3. Employees and Directors' remuneration

The average monthly number of persons (including executive Directors) employed by the Company during the financial year was Nil (2003: Nil).

All of the Directors are also employees of the parent company J Sainsbury plc, and in some cases are Directors of other group undertakings. The Directors do not receive any remuneration from the Company (2003: Nil).
