The trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 31st August 2011

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with its Governing document, the Companies Act 2006 and the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005

Structure, governance and management

The company is limited by guarantee and has no share capital.

None of the trustees has any beneficial interest in the company All of the trustees are members of the company and guarantee to contribute £10 in the event of a winding up

The current trustees were recruited personally to provide specific skills to the Board Although there is no specific recruitment policy, the charity would advertise for specific trustees if it felt this appropriate

The charity has a simple organisational structure – the Treasurer (Professor Colin Green) has been appointed as CEO with responsibilities for the operational management of the charity and is supported by the Administrator

Transactions with related parties are disclosed in the notes to the accounts

The directors regularly review all financial and operational risks which may have an impact on the charity Procedures are adopted to mitigate perceived risks and these are subject to regular review to ensure that there are adequate safeguards in place

Objectives and activities

The Company is a charity registered with The Charity Commission The initial objective of The International Medical Education Trust is the promotion of a network of partnerships among individuals, groups and institutions in developed and developing countries for cooperation in agreed programmes of medical education, service and research

We have referred to the guidance in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when setting our programmes aims and objectives for the improvement of medical education and healthcare delivery for the public benefit. The trustees always ensure that its programmes are in line with the charity's aims and objectives and our intention is to improve the standard of medical education and healthcare delivery in the areas in which we work.

The charity has expanded its work in Palestine and in Malawi and maintained its programme in Senegal at about the same level. In brief, in Palestine it is focused on continuous professional development (CPD) of all professionals working in the Health Sector, in Malawi and in Uganda it is mainly (Medic-to-Medic) focused on undergraduate education and training, and in Senegal the Sponsor a Mum scheme is actively developing maternity facilities and supporting mother and child health

TRUSTEES REPORT (CONTINUED)

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST AUGUST 2011

Achievements and Performance (2010-2011)

The year has seen a marked improvement in our financial fortunes in spite of a hostile environment starting with an excellent and successful Annual Dinner in January at the House of Lords. This was just as well since the demands on our services in Palestine mushroomed as the Palestinian Health Education Centre (PHSEC) has become known as the premier provider of CPD and continuous education and training for nurses, dentists, doctors and allied professionals in the West Bank and Gaza The Centre now employs 2 nurses, 2 dentists, 2 doctors as well as part time IT, administrative and business staff. These are busy running workshops in specialized disciplines on a monthly basis, often with invited speakers from overseas, as well as increasing both the quality and the quantity of valuable educational material freely available on the website Equipment for an embryonic telemedicine network has now been purchased and will be installed early in 2012 in Gaza and the West Bank. We are also establishing an electronic library in the Centre which will provide free access to thousands of international journals to all Palestinian health professionals signed up to our programmes. We are currently supporting a PhD student (Pathology) in Cairo, another in paediatric nursing in Nottingham, 13 MSc students in University of London (Management of Burns) and have a young doctor starting training in Jordan (a 4 year course) in Child Psychiatry The previously reported programme to upgrade the Burns Service in the OPT in partnership with MAP and the Ministry of Health continues apace, indeed the MoH recently asked IMET2000 to take the lead in setting up new Burns Units in Hebron and in Ramallah This would be a huge commitment both in time and money Work in the Ukraine has also continued successfully under the aegis of the UNESCO Chair in Cryobiology held by Professor Barry Fuller Of particular note is successful support for a prestigious grant in Kharkiv and the award of his Doctorate in UCL to Dr Andriy Yabluchanski in December, 2011 again helped and supervised by Barry Fuller The Medic-to-Medic programme in Malawi is proving a great success and students supported by the programme are now graduating as fully trained doctors, a tribute to the hard work of Kate Mandeville, Nam Thaker, Zıllah Cargill, Nick Mandeville and Paul Purcell in the UK team, as well of course of all involved in Malawi Although still focussed on the College of Medicine in Blantyre, a partnership has been established with the College of Health Sciences in Lilongwe and additional students are being supported here. The programme is also expanding into Uganda in both Makerere and Gulu Universities, and we are building links in South Africa for a possible further expansion in the near future. We are pleased to report that support has been expanded to include trainee Pharmacists, Physiotherapists and Clinical Officers

Financial Review

We are greatly indebted to our many sponsors who have made all of this possible. These include Medical Aid for Palestinians (MAP), the Asfan Foundation, the Esmee Fairbairn Trust, INTERPAL, the Bseisu Foundation, the Sir Halley Stewart Trust and numerous medium sized and smaller donations made possible for example by the sponsored cycle ride of Mark Thomas, the Annual Dinner in January, 2011 organized so brilliantly by Harriet Paul, and the Medic-to-Medic regular donors and fundraising university branches at Cambridge, Imperial College London and the University of East Anglia

Organisation

As agreed at the previous AGM, the Council of Patrons has been enlarged and we welcome Messrs Mark Thomas, Jeremy Hardy and Terry Venables We also welcome Professor Mahmoud Mowais to the Board of Trustees and are delighted to have him with us to represent Palestinian interests. We also welcome Ms Harriet Paul as Fundraising and Events Co-ordinator, Dr Ali Ghanem as Director of Health Sciences Education Development and Ms Nam Thaker as Business Manager. For the time being, Colin Green is working as CEO and Treasurer

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST AUGUST 2011

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation

These financial statement have been prepared in accordance with the special provisions relating to small companies and with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008)

After making enquiries, the directors have a reasonable expectation that the company have adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Accordingly, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the annual report and accounts

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005 and the Companies Act 2006

1.2 Incoming resources

Income from legacies and donations is accounted for on a received basis and grossed up for any tax recoverable. Grants are treated on a receivable basis in accordance with the Charities SORP

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions by donors as to how they may be used. The purposes and uses of the restricted funds are set out in the notes to the accounts

1.3 Resources expended

All expenditure has been accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to that category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings, such as support costs, they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Governance costs includes all items related to the statutory obligations and strategic management of the charity

The Chanty makes grants to a variety of applicants in line with their policy stated in the Trustees report and on the fulfilment of specific conditions. These grants paid are included in the accounts on an accruals basis

1.4 Foreign currency translation

Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. All differences are included in net outgoing resources
